LEGISLATURE MEETS IN SPECIAL SESSION FOR BUDGET AND OTHER ITEMS

Gov. Earl Ray Tomblin issued a proclamation this week to further extend the extended session of the legislature until Friday in order to allow a House and Senate conference committee to complete work on the new state budget. House of Delegates Speaker Tim Miley said he expects a vote on the new budget Friday along with a special session, which would allow lawmakers to take votes on several bills that failed to pass on the last night of the regular session last Saturday. A tentative agreement has been reached on the bill known informally as the “haircut” bill, legislation to reduce state Lottery subsidies to the racing industry. Strong opposition from jockeys and industry lobbyists contributed to the bill’s failure in the final minutes of the session. This is also the bill ([H.B. 4333](#)) that originally reduced funding for the WV Infrastructure Fund \$20 million a year for three years. Under the agreement, the thoroughbred and greyhound racing subsidies would be reduced 10 percent and the WV Infrastructure Fund reduction will be one year only, not three. The CAWV agreed to support a one-time reduction to the fund as a way to help the projected budget deficit and to maintain the state’s bond rating that could be reduced if Lottery proceeds continue to decline. Budget conferees got some unwanted news as the Governor’s Office notified the Legislature that available revenue for the 2014-15 budget would be \$36.4 million lower than expected. Speaker Miley said the goal is to have House-Senate conferees to complete work on the budget by Friday, then go immediately into special session. Items on the governor’s call are expected to be pay raises for county elected officials, legislation to allow landfills to accept core drillings from horizontal well projects to exceed permitted tonnage limits, as well as two supplemental appropriations bills.

The second session of the 81th Legislature of West Virginia concluded at midnight on Saturday, March 10. A number of bills followed by the Contractors Association of West Virginia were deliberated in the final hours of the 60-day session while others completed action earlier in the week. A number of bills that were still in play up to the last minute did not pass when House and Senate conferees could not reach agreement or when time finally ran out. There were 104 House bills passed and 94 Senate bills. A bill that generated a lot of concern among CAWV contractor, subcontractor and supplier members was [H.B. 4168](#), the West Virginia Buy American Act. The bill passed the House of Delegates by a 90-7 vote and was referred to the Senate Government Organization Committee. The bill would have required each construction contract made by a public agency to contain a provision that the iron, steel, manufactured goods, coal and timber used or supplied as construction materials shall be manufactured or produced in the United States. The bill was patterned after the Buy American Provision that was included with American Recovery and Reinvestment Act (ARRA) projects. This was the third year the bill was debated.

NATIONAL CONSTRUCTION ASSOCIATION PLANNING TO LAUNCH PRIVATE EXCHANGE TO HELP FIRMS DELIVER BETTER HEALTH BENEFITS TO THEIR EMPLOYEES

The Associated General Contractors of America is planning to launch a new private insurance exchange in cooperation with Willis North America, association officials announced during the AGC Convention last week in Las Vegas. The new exchange, which will be called “The AGC Alternative,” is anticipated to be live this summer and will allow the association’s member firms to deliver better health insurance and related benefits to their employees at a lower cost, officials added.

“This new exchange will make it far easier for member firms to provide top quality health insurance and related benefits for their employees,” said Stephen E. Sandherr, the association’s chief executive officer. “Our members will now be able to secure the kind of convenient and discounted benefits that a growing number of large employers already enjoy.” Sandherr noted that the new private exchange should reduce costs and the administrative burden of providing insurance benefits for the 95 percent of member firms that report they already provide health insurance to their employees. And because the exchange will offer a broader range of options than typically available to individual firms, employers and their employees will get more of the benefits that meet their particular needs.

The new exchange will also make it easier for firms to comply with the Affordable Care Act requirements, the association CEO added. And, unlike many public exchanges, the new private exchange will also provide employees with the guidance and support they need to make good decisions, Sandherr added.

Once AGC and Willis complete preparations, including securing a national insurance provider, each member firm will each be able to set up its own private company benefits exchange site for employees, Sandherr added. Participating firms will then provide a stipend to their employees, who will use those funds to shop for health insurance and other benefits offered through the exchange. HOUSE PANEL APPROVES BILL PROHIBITING REVERSE AUCTIONS FOR CONSTRUCTION

On March 5, the U.S. House of Representatives Small Business Committee unanimously approved by voice vote the Common Sense Construction Contracting Act of 2013, H.R. 2751, introduced by Representative Richard Hanna (R-N.Y.). This legislation would essentially prohibit federal agencies from procuring construction services through reverse auctions. This is the first major hurdle the bill had to jump before coming law. However, more hurdles remain ahead in the legislative process. [Please take action](#) and urge your U.S. Senators and Representative to support H.R. 2751.

The bill was introduced shortly after AGC's May 2013 testimony before the House Small Business Committee on the need for this legislation. AGC also testified before a joint House Veterans Affairs and House Small Business Committee hearing on the need to prohibit procurement of construction services through reverse auctions in December 2013. Several agencies, including the Department of Veterans Affairs and Department of the Interior, are using reverse auctions to procure construction services for full-range construction projects, including million dollar building renovations, national park road construction, and material supply and delivery. In addition, the General Services Administration launched its own web-based reverse auction platform—which includes the option of procuring construction services—for federal agency use last year.

The Three-Point Rule . . . You Don't Have To Fall

Falling while getting into or out of heavy equipment, a truck or tractor cab, hooking up air and electrical lines, or mounting or dismounting trailers is a sure way to get seriously hurt. An insurance industry study showed that falls from vehicles produced injuries that were almost 25% worse than other types of injuries.

Even an ankle sprain can play havoc with your ability to use the clutch. Minor injuries can cost you big in terms of lost income and downtime. The biggest single cause of falls from a vehicle is driver error and failure to follow the THREE-POINT rule.

WHAT CAN YOU DO TO AVOID FALLS?

No matter what type of access system your vehicle has available, use the THREE-POINT system to significantly reduce the chance of a slip or fall. The THREE-POINT system means three of your four limbs are in contact with the vehicle at all times—two hands and one foot, or two feet and one hand.

The THREE-POINT system allows a person to have maximum stability and support, thereby reducing the likelihood of slipping and falling. Be a winner; use the THREE-POINT system.

DO'S:

- Wear shoes with good support -- not sandals, bare feet or high heels.
- Exit and enter facing the cab.
- Slow down and use extra caution in bad weather.
- Get a firm grip on rails or handles with your hands.
- Look for obstacles on the ground below before exiting.

DON'Ts:

- Don't climb down with something in your free hand. Put it on the vehicle floor and reach up for it when you get down on the ground.
- Don't rush to climb out after a long run. Descend slowly, to avoid straining a muscle.
- Don't ever jump out. You may land off balance or on an uneven surface, and fall.
- Don't use tires or wheel hubs as a step surface.
- Don't use the door frame or door edge as a handhold.
- Don't become an injury statistic.

PRESIDENT'S BUDGET AGAIN CUTS WATER INFRASTRUCTURE FUNDING

On March 4, President Obama released a framework for his \$3.9 trillion budget request for fiscal year (FY) 2015, while more detailed budget documents are expected to be released next week. The budget, which is \$56 billion above the \$1.014 trillion limit on discretionary spending established as part of December's bipartisan budget deal, projects a budget deficit of \$564 billion for 2015. House and Senate Republicans have come out against the budget, proposing the breaking of budget caps and payment for the increase in spending by proposing tax policies that have been panned by business groups in the past, including: increasing the burden of the estate tax; retaining high rates on pass-through businesses; and taxing carried interest at ordinary income rates.

Once again, the president called for cuts to the Environmental Protection Agency's (EPA) state revolving loan funds (SRFs) and the Rural Utilities Service's Rural Water and Waste Disposal program. As for the SRF's – the budget provides \$1.018 billion for clean water SRFs – a 30 percent cut from 2014 enacted levels. Drinking water SRF's would receive \$757 million under the budget – a 17 percent cut from 2014 enacted levels. The Department of Agriculture's Rural Water and Waste Disposal Program is funded at \$304 million, a cut of 34 percent from 2014 levels.

In a March 10, 2014 memorandum to the division, Secretary Mattox wrote, "Please extend your full support and cooperation to Mr. Bailey and Mr. Pennington as they assume the duties of these roles." The appointments are effective immediately.

PRESIDENT RELEASES BUDGET REQUEST FOR 2015

On March 4, President Obama released a framework for his \$3.9 trillion budget request for fiscal year (FY) 2015, while more detailed budget documents are expected to be released next week. The budget, which is \$56 billion above the \$1.014 trillion limit on discretionary spending established as part of December's bipartisan budget deal, projects a budget deficit of \$564 billion for 2015. House and Senate Republicans have come out against the budget, proposing the breaking of budget caps and payment for the increase in spending by proposing tax policies that have been panned by business groups in the past, including: increasing the burden of the estate tax; retaining high rates on pass-through businesses; and taxing carried interest at ordinary income rates.

The president laid out his framework for the federal aid highway program by the reauthorization of MAP-21. The \$302 billion four-year proposal would provide an \$87 billion increase over current spending levels in the Highway Trust Fund, expands the TIGER grant programs and authorizes TIFIA at \$1 billion per year over the next four years. The budget does not provide specifics on how to pay for current spending levels, let alone the extra spending proposed in the president's request.

The proposal would fund the Federal Highway Administration at \$199.2 billion over four years – adding a new competitive grant program and new multi-modal freight programs. The Federal Transit Administration (FTA) does very well in the new budget, which is consistent with the administration's support in the past. FTA would receive \$72.3 billion over four years for an average spending increase of 19 percent. Within the FTA, the new starts program would be increased from \$1.94 billion in 2014 to \$2.5 billion in 2015 and the Formula Grants increased by 17 percent annual average increase to \$13.9 billion. Also included in the plan is \$1.25 billion per year for TIGER Grants and \$1.3 billion per year for high speed rail.
