WEST VIRGINIA LEADERS VOW TO FIGHT EPA RULES

West Virginia's political leaders mostly joined forces Monday to voice strong opposition to the Obama administration's plan to curb global warming, vowing to fight the proposal in the court of public opinion and the court of law. Gov. Earl Ray Tomblin hosted a news conference at the state Capitol to bring together business and labor leaders and Democratic and Republican elected officials to blast what they called another step in the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency's effort to destroy the state's coal industry. Gov. Tomblin acknowledged that state Department of Environmental Protection officials are still reviewing the 645-page rule. But, the governor said, state officials don't care one bit for what they see so far. "These proposals appear to realize some of our worst fears," the Governor Tomblin told a room full of reporters and coal supporters. "The only way to comply with these rules would be to use less West Virginia coal."

Gov. Tomblin was joined at his news conference by Rep. Nick J. Rahall, D-W.Va., Rep. Shelley Moore Capito, R-W.Va., Attorney General Patrick Morrisey and officials from the United Mine Workers union, the West Virginia Coal Association and American Electric Power's Appalachian Power subsidiary. Rep. Rahall called the EPA proposal a "job killer" from an agency that is "run amok." Rep. Capito accused the EPA of trying to impose through rule "an energy tax that the president couldn't get through Congress." Morrisey promised to review "every line of every paragraph of every page" of the rule, looking for ways to defeat the EPA proposal in court. The only major state elected official who offered anything other than strong opposition to the EPA was retiring Sen. Jay Rockefeller. The West Virginia Democrat did not attend the governor's news conference but later issued a prepared statement offering support for the EPA proposal. "I understand the fears that these rules will eliminate jobs, hurt our communities, and drive up costs for working families," Sen. Rockefeller said. "However, rather than let fear alone drive our response, we should make this an opportunity to build a stronger future for ourselves."

TRANSPORTATION SECRETARY LATEST ADDITION TO DYNAMIC ANNUAL MEETING PROGRAM

The CAWV Program Committee is continuing to add to an already impressive program planned for this year's Annual Meeting, which will be held July 10-13 at The Greenbrier. Paul A. Mattox, Jr., PE, Secretary of the WV Department of Transportation and Commissioner of the WV Division of Highways, will speak at the Highway Division meeting following the Saturday morning General Business Session. The secretary will share with members the status of the DOH's construction and maintenance programs. He will also discuss a proposal for a Public Private Partnership (P3) project. Secretary Mattox joins as presenters Jeff McIntyre, president of WV American Water Company, and Tim Ball, general manager of the Morgantown Utility Board, who will be part of a panel discussion on a vision for the future of water in West Virginia. "This year's program promises to be very informative," said CAWV Program Committee Chairman Scott Pierson. "We want members to have a clear understanding of the future of the state's highway program and to help chart the future for water in West Virginia."

AGC'S NEW HEALTH INSURANCE – YOUR INPUT NEEDED

AGC of America is now in the final phase of its negotiations over the pricing and scope of the health and other insurance plans that its new and entirely private health insurance exchange will feature. Several of the nation's largest health insurance carriers are vying for the opportunity to anchor the exchange, and as it completes its negotiations with these carriers, AGC of America wants to ensure that the selected carrier has the best options the AGC membership.

AGC's new health insurance program is officially called The AGC Alternative. It will be a private insurance exchange that has all of the functionality of a typical online "e-store" – and much more. AGC of America and Willis are finalizing the health, dental, vision and other insurance benefits that it will feature. During the enrollment process, Willis will help each interested company review its benefits strategy and configure the exchange to implement its particular plan. TIME IS RUNNING OUT TO REGISTER FOR THE CAWV & BRICKSTREET OSHA 10 HOUR COURSE

The CAWV has partnered with BrickStreet Insurance to offer an OSHA 10-Hour Course for association members that participate in the CAWV / BrickStreet Workers Compensation program for \$35.00. The training will be held at the BrickStreet Headquarters located at 400 Quarrier Street in Charleston from 8:00 A.M. to 5:00 P.M. on Wednesday, June 18, and from 8:00 A.M. to 12:00 P.M. on Thursday, June 19. Senate Bill 376 was passed into law during the 2014 legislative session and will go into effect on July 1, 2014. It requires all construction workers on a publicly financed project over \$50,000 to complete the OSHA 10-Hour Course. Because the class is limited to 40 students you must return the **attached registration form** to the CAWV. Also the CAWV will be adding additional OSHA 10-Hour classes so students that get left out of this first class will be notified and placed into the next class. A few of the provisions of the new law are: All construction workers on a publicly-financed project over \$50,000 must complete the OSHA 10-Hour safety course (Course); The course is a one-time requirement, not annual; For the first year (July 1, 2014 to July 1, 2015) construction workers have to be employed at least 90 days at the public improvement site before they need the course. WEBINAR PLANNED FOR NEW ABOVE GROUND STORAGE TANK REQUIREMENTS

The WV Legislature passed S.B. 373 to address the storage tank leak that caused water customers in a nine-county region to go without water for days. The bill containing the Above-ground Storage Tank Act and the Public Water Supply Protection Act was signed into law by Gov. Earl Ray Tomblin on April 1, 2014. The law officially takes effect today, June 6. The bill requires an inventory and registration of aboveground storage tanks be completed by Oct. 1, 2014. The bill also requires development of a variety of aboveground storage tank regulations for consideration in the 2015 legislative session. Tanks falling under the requirements include tanks over 1,320 gallons, are 90 percent above ground, permanently fixed tanks in continuous use, and mobile tanks that are in continuous use for more than 60 days.

BEWARE OF ADVERSE WEATHER

Carrying 100 million volts of electricity, a bolt of lightning is deadly. Lightning strikes without warning.

Many times high winds can kick up from an approaching storm without warning. A tornado could be the next thing seen. Is there a plan? What are employees going to do? Where are they going to go?

According to the National Weather Service, lightning will strike and kill hundreds each year. WHY? Hundreds more are seriously disabled.

Flash floods are another very common storm-related hazard in West Virginia. People all have experiences that can be recalled in our communities and around the state where flash flooding takes people by surprise and takes lives.

Here are some good rules to help reduce the possibility of being a statistic of adverse weather:

- ▶ Plan what employees are to do and where they are to go in the event of bad weather. Hold safety talks with all employees to communicate the plan to them.
- ▶ Look over the project site and check the landscape to see if flash flooding could pose a threat. Are there small creeks, streams, ditch-lines or the like surrounding or cutting through the project? Even a small dry creek bed in the far distance can rise without warning from a rainstorm. Don't get caught with no way out.
- ▶ Take approaching storms seriously. Shelter inside a building or hard topped vehicle if lightning is present. Do not use an open-sided shelter house, car port, porch, tree or stand under an extended roof. Get completely inside. Stay away from outside open spaces. REMEMBER: Lightning is often on the fringe of storms, both coming and going, so waiting to take shelter until the storm is right there may be too late.
- ▶ Stay off the phone until the storm has passed and turn-off all 2-way radios.
- ▶ Most importantly.....be prepared and have a plan before adverse weather hits.

PRESIDENT'S PROPOSED FY15 CLEAN WATER/SAFE DRINKING WATER SRF'S BUDGET

The President's Budget provides \$1,018,000,000 for making capitalization grants for the Clean Water State Revolving Funds under title VI of the Federal Water Pollution Control Act, and \$757,000,000 for making capitalization grants for the Drinking Water State Revolving Funds under section 1452 of the Safe Drinking Water Act, with the proviso that not less than 20 percent of the funds made available for CWSRF grants shall be used for projects to address green infrastructure, water or energy efficiency improvements, or other environmentally innovative activities, and also with the proviso that funds made available for DWSRF grants may, at the discretion of each State, be used for projects to address green infrastructure, water or energy efficiency improvements, or other environmentally innovative activities.

In the FY 14 Budget, the CWSRF was funded at \$1,448,887,000 and the SDWSRF was at \$906,896,000. In justifying/defending funding levels below FY14, the Budget states that it "proposes a reduction to focus on communities most in need of assistance and continuing to allow financing of approximately \$6 billion annually in wastewater and drinking water infrastructure projects. Nearly \$60 billion has been provided for the programs to date, including over \$21 billion since 2009. Going forward, EPA will continue efforts to target assistance to small and underserved communities that have a limited ability to repay loans, including Tribes."

The bill would authorize spending of \$38.4 billion for FY15, then increase with inflation to \$39.2 billion for FY16, \$40 billion for FY17, \$40.8 billion for FY18, \$41.7 billion for FY19 and \$42.6 billion for FY20. That is approximately status quo funding levels plus inflation. The bill would also authorize \$400 million a year in grants for projects of national and regional significance and \$125 million a year, starting in FY16 subject to appropriation, for awards to states that show special innovation or brought projects in ahead of time and below budget. A new freight program would be authorized at \$400 million as of FY16, growing by \$400 million a year to reach \$2 billion in FY20. The bill would also maintain the low-interest TIFIA infrastructure loans at current levels, while modifying the program to help states with infrastructure banks stretch their federal highway dollars. Funding for tribal transportation would be authorized at current levels.

At the markup session, Chairman Barbara Boxer, D-CA, said: "Today's passage sends a powerful signal to our colleagues and to our nation that we are serious about addressing the looming funding crisis in the Highway Trust Fund. I am proud of this strong, bipartisan bill that helps provide the certainty that all of our states and cities need to move forward with critical infrastructure and transportation projects. Thanks to all of our Members for their work on this job-creating legislation."

Senator Thomas Carper, D-DE, said: "Today the Environment and Public Works Committee took an important step forward on the way to passing a long-term transportation bill. I thank Chairman Boxer and Ranking Member Vitter for leading a thoughtful and bipartisan process as this committee drafted and reported out this critical piece of the legislation. I understand that the other Senate committees with jurisdiction on the transportation package are also working diligently on their respective pieces of the bill. This is particularly important for those of us who also serve on the Senate Finance Committee. We need to work in a similar bipartisan fashion to quickly come to agreement on a fiscally responsible way to fund these crucial investments in our nation's infrastructure."

The legislation will still need to be merged with forthcoming titles from the Banking and Commerce Committees to address transit, rail, motor carrier and safety needs. Finding a way to pay for the bill falls within Senate Finance Committee's jurisdiction. Just to maintain current levels, tax writers would have to come up with about \$18 billion a year to supplement motor fuels taxes and other excise taxes collected for the Highway Trust Fund.

In the House, Bill Shuster, R-PA, chairman of the Transportation and Infrastructure Committee, said he wants a bill with substantive changes to the current program. As for timing, given the

challenge of dealing with the Highway Trust Fund shortfall this summer, he doesn't think a final bill gets done until the lame duck session although he plans to have a bill out in June/July and hopes to move it through the House before the election.

FY15 TRANSPORTATION APPROPRIATIONS BILL IN THE HOUSE

The House Appropriations Committee released a FY15 Transportation-HUD spending bill that would keep highway and aviation spending level, but apply cuts for rail, transit and transportation and community development grant programs. All told, the bill would provide \$52 billion in discretionary spending for infrastructure and housing programs, a \$1.2 billion increase from fiscal 2014 but \$7.8 billion below the President's budget request. Appropriators provided a \$5 million increase for the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration, to \$824 million in FY15, and a \$19.4 million increase for the Pipeline and Hazardous Materials Safety Administration, which would get \$205.2 million under the legislation. But the bill is also likely setting up a fight with the Senate on the Transportation Department's TIGER grants, which would get only \$100 million, a \$500 million cut from FY14 and \$1.15 billion less than Obama requested. Formula highway spending would stay level at \$40.25 billion, contingent on passage of a new authorization bill before the 2012 highway bill expires Sept. 30.
