## **GOVERNOR'S RACE GETTING CLEARER**

In less than a year, West Virginians will vote in the primary election for gubernatorial candidates. The picture is getting a little clearer, especially on the Republican ticket. Senate President Bill Cole, R-Mercer, appears to be the sole Republican candidate after possible challengers David McKinley and Patrick Morrissey decided to run for reelection to their respective offices, Congress and Attorney General. "I will be a candidate for governor of the great state of West Virginia," President Cole announced during a speech at his car dealership in Bluefield. Appointed to the House of Delegates for one year, Sen. Cole was first elected to the Senate in 2012 and became the chamber's leader after Republicans took control of both houses in 2014. He touted himself as having the right balance of business and legislative experience to take on the new role.

On the Democratic side, there was speculation Sen. Joe Manchin, D-WV, would seek to return to the Governor's Mansion where he served before replacing the late Sen. Robert C. Byrd in the U.S. Senate. Sen. Manchin announced on national television that he would continue his work in Washington and not run for a third term as governor. Coal company and Greenbrier Resort owner Jim Justice followed by announcing his bid to become West Virginia's next governor. He will face opposition in the Democratic primary. Senate Minority Leader Jeff Kessler, D-Ohio, announced he will be a candidate and is touting his 18 years of experience in the West Virginia Legislature. They may have additional challengers, including U.S. Prosecuting Attorney Booth Goodwin who has yet to indicate his plans.

The primary election is set for May 10, 2016.

## **CAWV JOINT ARCHITECTS COMMITTEE DISCUSSES SEVERAL INDUSTRY ISSUES**

The CAWV Joint Architects Committee met on June 24 at the CAWV Headquarters. Committee members discussed the School Building Authority of West Virginia (SBA) recently proposed changes to their policy and procedures manual that are now posted for a 30 day public comment period. Committee members noted several areas of concern with the new changes that would have a negative effect on the industry. The CAWV Building Division has been tasked with receiving comments from members, discussing them during the Building Division meeting at the CAWV Annual Meeting and submitting the comments to the SBA.

Committee members also received an update on Prevailing Wage Legislation and on the recent ruling by the Legislative Auditor's office that deals with the change order approval and payment processing. Starting July 1 all construction change orders must be approved before any work is done. If a contractor does any work without the approved change order the run a very high risk of not being paid for that work. The CAWV is working with West Virginia Purchasing Division, the Legislative Auditor's office and Jason Pizatella, Cabinet Secretary of the Department of Administration, to find a solution to the issue, both short term and long term. Look for updates in the future issues of the CAWV Building Bulletin.

West Virginia Division of Highways Maintenance Division Director Kyle Stollings attended the meeting to discuss details of the nine WVDOH maintenance headquarters building projects that are being developed as Public-Private Partnership (P3) projects. Currently the WVDOH is in the process of hiring a Quality Assurance Manager for the projects and expects the projects to go to bid late this summer. Although the WVDOH is still in the early stages of planning these projects and many details need to be worked out, Mr. Stollings noted that the nine projects will be bid as one package and the winning bidder will be required to finance the projects for 20 years as well as provide a warranty and maintenance for the full 20 year term. The project will consist of office buildings, shop buildings and salt and storage sheds and will be located in several counties throughout the state. The planned construction time line will be approximately two years once the project is bid. The CAWV will continue to track the process of these projects and update members in the CAWV Building Bulletin.

## Lightning Awareness Week Policy for Outdoor Work Sites

While June 21<sup>st</sup> is the official start of Summer, June 22 is the official start of Lightning Awareness Week. According to the National Weather Service, there were 26 fatalities in 2014 resulting from lightning strikes in 14 states. Workers account for about one-third of the total number of people struck by lightning; roofers, construction workers, road crews, pipe fitters and farm workers are especially at high risk. Lightning typically strikes tall objects, including people standing on open ground or a roof. Work sites should have a plan in place to keep workers safe in case of a lightning storm.

- Monitor weather conditions in the early morning hours for reports of impending severe weather in your area. If warranted, continue to monitor weather conditions throughout the day. An inexpensive portable weather radio can provide timely storm data from local weather forecasts.
- All employees should understand what lightning safety plans are in place, which includes what shelters are available to them at that particular work site.(SEE BELOW)
- It's easy to determine when to take shelter. If you hear thunder, the associated lightning is within 8 miles. Suspend activities, allowing sufficient time to get to shelter. A good lightning safety motto is: "If you can see it (lightning), flee it; if you can hear it (thunder), clear it."
- If you feel your hair standing on end, and/or hear "crackling noises," you are in the lightning electrical field. If caught outside during a lightning storm, immediately remove all metal objects (including hats), place your feet together, duck your head, and crouch down low in baseball catcher's stance with hands covering your ears.
- Wait a minimum of 30 minutes from the last observed lightning or thunder before resuming normal work activities. Be extra cautious during this phase, as the storm may not be over.
- If someone has been struck by lightning, get emergency help promptly and apply first aid. It is a myth that lightning victims carry a charge after the strike—they are safe to handle and may need first aid immediately.

### **SAFE:**

- Fully enclosed metal vehicles with windows up
- Fully enclosed buildings with plumbing and/or electrical service
- Low ground, ditches, or clumps of bushes
- Trees of uniform height, such as a forest

### **UNSAFE:**

- Outdoor areas with metal objects such as power poles, fences, high-mast light poles, metal bleachers, electrical equipment, mowing and road machinery
- Solitary trees
- Bodies of water, open fields, high ground and caves

## **URGENT ACTION NEEDED TO PREVENT DOUBLE-DIGIT CUTS IN SRF PROGRAMS**

The House and Senate Appropriations Committees have recently approved the federal Fiscal Year 2016 spending bills for the Interior, Environment and Related Agencies. Contained in this measure is FY 2016 funding for the Environmental Protection Agency and the Clean Water and Drinking Water SRF programs. Both the House and Senate measures cut the existing SRF programs by approximately 23%. Specifically, the House bill provides total SRF funding of \$1.775 billion, \$1.018 billion for the Clean Water SRF and \$757 million for the Drinking Water SRF, which results in a 23% decrease in funding from federal FY 2015 (a 30% CWSRF and 16% DWSRF respectively).

The Senate appropriations measure also cuts the combined funding for EPA's Clean Water and Drinking Water SRFs by 23%, to \$1.8 billion, from current year's spending. The detailed spending amounts for each SRF will be available soon but are expected to be similar to the House proposal.

## **URGENT ACTION IS NEEDED IN ORDER TO AVERT THIS SEVERE CUT**

The Clean Water Construction Coalition will be working with the Senate Democrats to prevent enactment of a federal FY2016 Interior Appropriations bill with these levels. That prevention would force a "Continuing Resolution" that would fund both SRF's at the much higher federal FY2015 levels. Absent a change/increase in the FY2016 proposed funding levels, which seems highly unlikely through the normal process, **CAWV members are asked to contact their Senators and Representatives and advocate for a Continuing Resolution!**

CAWV members should remind their State Congressional Delegations that the Clean Water construction program was once funded at \$4.8 billion in the 1970's. Through the years, the program has already been severely cut back to its current level. West Virginia and the Nation's investment needs in clean water and drinking water infrastructure continue to increase due to the decreased funding levels for these job producing, environmental programs. It is imperative that you urge your representatives and Senators to oppose the House and Senate appropriation bills. We urge all coalition members to act immediately relative to this important call to action!

## **SENATE COMMITTEE UNVEILS SURFACE TRANSPORTATION BILL**

The Senate Environment and Public Works (EPW) Committee approved a six-year, \$277 billion reauthorization of the federal highway program. The “Developing a Reliable and Innovative Vision for the Economy Act,” or DRIVE Act, was authored by Committee Chairman James Inhofe (R-OK), Ranking Member Barbara Boxer (D-CA) and Senators David Vitter (R-LA) and Tom Carper (D-DE). While members of both parties lauded the bill’s policy reforms and investment levels, Democrats were clear they would like to see even higher investment levels.

The measure would ramp up highway investment from \$43.1 billion in FY 2016 to \$48.3 billion in FY 2021—current highway funding is \$40.3 billion. It would provide small funding increases for most existing components of the federal highway program and create two new programs: a \$2.2 billion per year National Freight Program and a \$400 million per year Assistance for Major Projects Program. The DRIVE Act proposes to invest \$20 billion more in highway and highway-related improvements than the six-year reauthorization bill approved by the EPW panel in 2014.

The measure also includes a number of provisions to further streamline the federal environmental review and approval process for highway projects. Click [here](#) to read ARTBA’s analysis of the proposal. The EPW highway proposal is just one piece of the surface transportation reauthorization plan. The Senate Banking Committee must also produce a reauthorization of the public transportation program and the Commerce Committee will need to develop legislation to reauthorize the transportation safety programs. While the transit and safety measures are not expected to be contentious, the Senate reauthorization process will not move forward until the Finance Committee generates new revenue to both: bridge the gap between incoming Highway Trust Fund (HTF) revenues, and the new investment levels that would be set in the reauthorization process.

The EPW Committee’s approval of the DRIVE Act demonstrates once again the broad bipartisan support that exists for federal highway and public transportation investment. The Committee’s action also puts increased pressure on the congressional tax committees to develop a long-term plan to stabilize and grow HTF revenues. All members of Congress need to continue to be pushed to support a permanent trust fund fix that will allow the DRIVE Act and the entire surface transportation reauthorization process to move forward.

## **WVMHS&T PUBLISHES REFERENCE MANUAL FOR QUARRY SAFETY RULES**

The Office of Miners’ Health, Safety and Training has published “Rules Governing the Safety of Those Employed In and Around Quarries in West Virginia, 2015 Reference Manual.” The manual contains a rewrite of the safety rules for operations around surface and underground quarry operations. The rules are the result of a year-long task force of West Virginia Crushed Aggregates Council members and the Office of Miner’s Health, Safety and Training. The rules will provide a clear understanding of the safety requirements of surface and underground quarry operations.

“We appreciate the efforts of Director Eugene White and Administrator Bill Tucker in helping the industry develop safety rules specifically for the quarry industries,” said Doug Canterbury,

chairman of the West Virginia Crushed Aggregates Council. “Before these rules, our members followed coal safety operations that were modified for quarries. Many times these rules were contradictory to quarry operations and MSHA requirements. Now, WVCAC has a clear understanding of what is required, and what safety inspectors will be looking for, from quarry operators,” the chairman said. He also thanked the many WVCAC members who worked tirelessly to develop the rules.

Steve Sherrard, J.F. Allen Company, who coordinated the task force efforts, said the reference manual will be a one-stop shop for safety rules. “We spent hours on the index so our members will be able to see all the rules that apply to a subject. For example, there are over 90 references in the rules to electricity. The manual’s index lists every section that deals with electricity so our members can find every rule affecting their operation. We’ve done the same thing with every other topic.”

Members who attended the June 11 WVCAC meeting in Flatwoods received a bound copy of the new rules. WVCAC members will be receiving a bound copy. ### **VIRGINIA’S RECENT HIGHWAY FUNDING PACKAGE RESULTS IN 21 PERCENT IN TRANSPORTATION IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM**

Virginia overhauled their transportation funding system which scrapped the state’s gas tax, raised the sales tax, created a tax on wholesale gas and diesel fuel and now charges registration for alternative-fuel vehicles. The increase will result in a \$9.9 billion six-year highway construction program, a 21 percent increase over last year’s spending.

The Virginia Commonwealth Transportation Board (CTB) has approved the most recent Six-Year Improvement Program (SYIP) for \$13.3 billion in highway, rail and public transportation projects. The SYIP spans the next six fiscal years (FY) starting July 1 this year. Of the total, \$9.9 billion will go toward highway construction projects, with the remaining \$3.4 billion dedicated to rail and transit work. This year’s program does not include any projects under the recently approved scoring process, which is set to start in July 2016. The FY 2016 annual budget is set at roughly \$5.29 billion, with \$1.96 billion dedicated to highway construction, and \$2.01 billion for highway maintenance and operations.

The total budget is 21 percent more than FY 2015, due to planned bonds, local and regional funding and revenue provided by a higher gas tax that started in January.
