WEST VIRGINIA REGAINS NUMBER ONE STATUS FOR CONSTRUCTION EMPLOYMENT LOSS

Construction firms added jobs in 38 states and the District of Columbia between November 2013 and November 2014 while construction employment increased in 26 states and D.C. between October and November, according to an analysis this week of Labor Department data by the Associated General Contractors of America. Twelve states shed construction jobs during the past twelve months, with West Virginia losing the highest percentage (-11.3%, -3,800 jobs). West Virginia has been hovering between first and third in the nation for the past twelve months for the highest percentage of construction job loss. It regained the top spot for November. In 2013, 33,500 West Virginians were employed in construction compared to 29,700 this year. West Virginia also ranked 51 in the 1-month gain or loss category. The state shed 1,900 jobs, or 6%, between October 2014 and November 2014.

In a related issue, the largest percentage decline of construction employment in 339 metro areas between November 2013 and 2014 was in Steubenville-Weirton, Ohio-WV area (-39 percent,-900 jobs). Construction employment in 224 of the 339 metro areas rose in the same period.

ADDITIONAL LEGISLATIVE CHAIRS ANNOUNCED

House Speaker Tim Armstead and Senate President Bill Cole continue to add names to their leadership team by announcing additional committee chairs. In addition to the major committees reported previously, the Senate Transportation and Infrastructure Chair and Vice Chair will be Sen. Chris Walters, R-Kanawha, and Sen. Kent Leonhardt, R-Monongalia, respectively. Sen. Daniel Hall, R-Wyoming, will be chair of the Senate Labor Committee and former delegate and new Senator Ryan Ferns, R-Ohio, will be vice chair. Sen. Tom Takubo, R-Kanawha, is the new Senate Economic Development Committee chair. Senate Finance Committee chair, Sen. Mike Hall, R-Putnam, will have Sen. Walters as his vice chair. In the House, new Roads and Transportation Committee chairman is Del. Marty Gearheart, R-Mercer. House Industry and Labor Committee chair will Del. Kelli Sobonya, R-Cabell.

GOVERNOR TOMBLIN ANNOUNCES ELIMINATION OF THE BUSINESS FRANCHISE TAX

Gov. Earl Ray Tomblin announced the Business Franchise Tax will be eliminated effective Jan. 1, 2015, the latest step in a series of reductions that have improved West Virginia's business climate and led to new investments across the state. "The Business Franchise Tax, created in 1987, was one of the taxes that made it difficult for West Virginia to compete for new and expanding businesses," Gov. Tomblin said. "Coupled with the reduction in the Corporate Net

Income Tax and the dramatic decrease in workers' compensation rates, these changes have helped our state secure additional investments and will continue to pay dividends now and for years to come."

West Virginia's Corporate Net Income Tax -- now 6.5 percent -- is competitive nationally and lower than those found in multiple surrounding states. In addition, the Tax Foundation rated West Virginia 21st nationally for 2015, a dramatic change from the state's No. 47 ranking in 2004, and higher than any neighboring state. "I appreciate the hard work of then-Gov. Joe Manchin and members of the West Virginia Legislature as we worked together to enact responsible reductions in our state's business taxes," Gov. Tomblin said. "We already have seen many benefits from these changes, and I'm confident our state's economy and business climate will continue to grow far into the future."

CAWV ANNUAL REPORT SENT TO MEMBERS - AVAILABLE AT WWW.CAWV.ORG

The 2014 CAWV Annual Report was mailed to members this week. The report outlines some of the key issues addressed by the association during the past year. The report includes information on the association's legislative issues, committee activities, accomplishments over the past year, and updates on the scholarship and association affinity programs.

Below are the comments of CAWV President Dan Flesher, Trimble Engineers & Constructors, Inc., Morgantown, which are included in the report:

Most CAWV members can attest to the fact that 2014 was full of challenge and change.

The change in the political landscape is unprecedented. For the first time in over 80 years, Republicans control the West Virginia Legislature. It may be the first time ever that this is concurrent with Republican control of the United States Congress. The implications of this with regard to infrastructure funding are unknown but West Virginia's new

legislative leaders have stated that job creation is one of their top priorities in the upcoming legislative session. The CAWV looks forward to working with Senate President Bill Cole, House Speaker Tim Armstead and members of the West Virginia Legislature to show the correlation between infrastructure investment and economic development and jobs

While your association is fiscally in good shape, we know our individual members are having differing experiences. There is market rotation among the various sectors.

Some contractors and suppliers have stayed busy in the Marcellus and Utica shale regions of North Central West Virginia. Thousands of wells have required an access road, site preparation, a pad for the drill and pumping machinery, a pond for the water that was injected, and a pipeline connection or storage tanks for the gas and liquids that are brought to the surface. For members working in the coal or infrastructure areas, times are tough. Building construction is still active in some areas of the state.

Construction employment figures in the Mountain State are a reflection of CAWV members' workload. Construction employment dropped by nearly 8% from October 2013 to October 2014. Since December 2013, West Virginia has ranked, on a monthly basis, first or second in the nation as the state with the steepest year-over-year declines. During that same span, U.S. construction employment increased by 4%, according to labor statistics compiled by the Associated General Contractors of America (AGC).

West Virginia's construction economy has been flat across the board. Our building contractors have been constructing fewer schools and commercial buildings, our utility contractors are looking for water and sewer projects to bid, and our state's highway program continues to remain stagnant and, without additional funding, our roads and bridges will continue to deteriorate while our qualified work force goes on the unemployment line. Declining demand for West Virginia coal and increased regulations has hurt West Virginia's economy and our members who have historically worked in the coal industry.

While times are tough, as a member of the CAWV and the construction profession, you are at an advantage. Despite West Virginia's weakening construction economy and shrinking job market, CAWV is 'hard at work' ensuring the future prosperity of our member companies for years to come. Our members repeatedly showed the resilience of the construction industry by turning a difficult situation into an opportunity for growth.

The CAWV regularly communicated with our legislators and policy makers to ensure they understood the dire straits of the construction industry and the positive impact investment in infrastructure could have on the economy. The association was quoted in numerous print and online news stories statewide when a failure by Congress to act on a long-term federal highway bill threatened to shut down federally-funded highway projects, causing contractors to potentially lay off construction workers during the height of the construction season.

The CAWV continues to be a key partner with West Virginians for Better Transportation to focus on a long-term, sustainable revenue source for the state's transportation system. All CAWV members benefit from investment in highways because you can't build a building if there isn't a modern highway or a bridge that can handle truck weights leading to it. You don't need to supply water or sewer to areas that don't have buildings and manufacturing operations.

However, all the time spent planning for future opportunities was not confined solely to legislative activity. CAWV increased its professional development opportunities by offering a series of webinars and interactive sessions on a variety of relevant topics. The CAWV Education Committee used the technology of the association's new conferencing center so members no longer have to miss valuable training due to time and distance. We offered several other tools for coping with the economic downturn, including our many discount programs that helped companies save money wherever possible on costs such as workers' compensation, fleet management and fuel, shipping services, and tools and equipment.

While this year has been challenging and full of change, it could set the stage for future opportunity. As a CAWV member you can rest assured that you have a team that is "hard at work" on your behalf. With the CAWV working at the State Capitol and state agencies, and AGC of America and ARTBA working on Capitol Hill, our members have the tools to get through hard times and to position themselves for future success.

GENERAL SAFETY - SNOW REMOVAL

As the front door opens to go to work, a pile of snow falls back inside. Sound familiar? For many who live in a cold climate, snow removal is a reality. How it is dealt with may be the difference between a serious injury and an inconvenience.

For those who have a snow blower, the job is easier but not without hazard. The first thing to think about is what was left on the driveway before the machine is started. Rocks, toys and other odds and ends are now frozen projectiles capable of breaking windows or easily putting out an eye. Always aim the discharge chute away from property and people. Never allow small children in or around the area to be blown. Occasionally the impellers will pick up something like twine or a plastic bag and jam. Never try to clear a machine while it is running. Take the time to turn it off before you work on it.

Remember when playing in the snow was fun and helping dad shovel the driveway was a blast? For many that is how the job still gets done, and it can be a pain in the back!

Many suppliers now offer an ergonomic snow shovel. They are a good idea and they work. The principle is to offset the handle, so there is no bending involved. Attaching a handle to the shovel where the lower hand grips the shovel will accomplish the same purpose. The idea is to remain as erect as possible.

The same theories used to prevent back injury while shoveling dirt apply to snow. Scoop in a forward motion, move feet as close as possible, lift and toss without twisting. Many people toss snow to one side or another and this twisting motion takes its toll on the back.

Another thing to consider is stretching. Many start the day having to shovel to get to work. Taking the time to stretch those muscles a little bit will help prevent a sore back. The next thing to consider is fatigue. Take a break every so often and relax. This will allow your body time to recuperate from exertion and may prevent a serious injury. Last but not least, consider a back support.

Working in a cold climate has additional hazards that may not be so obvious. Dehydration is a serious consideration. Breathing cold dry air robs moisture from the body every time one takes a breath. If one becomes dehydrated, they are more susceptible to frost bite and hypothermia. Drink plenty of water. Avoid working up a sweat. Damp or moist clothing will increase the body's heat loss rate and again makes people more susceptible to cold weather injury.

CONGRESSIONAL ACTION ON HIGHWAY FUNDING MEASURES NOT POSITIVE

U.S. Transportation Secretary Anthony Foxx continues to promote the need to find a way to fund the nation's highway system but statements by congressional leadership have cast doubt on the prospect for a long-term (six-year) reauthorization whose estimated price tag is estimated at one hundred billion dollars (annual highway and transit expenditures at current levels exceed the annual Trust Fund revenue by roughly \$16 billion/year.) In the December 29 Innovation NewsBriefs, editor Ken Orski writes, "We will see a legislature in which 'bigger' isn't automatically equated with 'better' when it comes to writing and passing bills," wrote House Speaker John Boehner and future Senate Majority Leader Mitch McConnell in a joint post-election opinion piece in the Wall Street Journal. The statement was couched in couched in broad generalities but its message was clear, Orski noted, there will no massive splurge in spending next year, in the Republican-controlled Congress.

President Obama seems to have reached the same conclusion. Responding to a question by FedEx CEO Fred Smith about the prospects for a gas tax increase and a transportation bill at a recent meeting with members of the Business Roundtable, the President said, "Even if we were able to get something done [during the lame duck session], it would not be the kind of 10-year solution that we need...The best they [i.e. Congress] could do would be to stagger through another year."

As for the lack of action on the gas tax, the President observed, "In fairness to members of Congress, votes on gas taxes are really tough. Gas prices are one of those things that really bug people." Instead, Mr. Obama continued, we should be looking for a "dedicated revenue source for infrastructure funding that is not so politically frightening to members of Congress." However, the President did not volunteer what that revenue source might be. Significantly, he did not mention his earlier proposal to pay for a long-term surface transportation bill with "corporate tax reform," a vague notion that had met with widespread congressional skepticism.

Orski concludes, the President's clear-eyed assessment of the congressional mood has dimmed the hopes of infrastructure advocates for a boost in transportation revenue or a multi-year transportation reauthorization even as gas prices have reached a four-year low. Confessed one longtime industry advocate, "I have come to a reluctant conclusion that transportation funding will continue to stagnate if we continue to stick to the funding orthodoxy of the Interstate Highways era."
