CAWV TO RELEASE ECONOMIC IMPACT STUDY ON JOB CREATION TUESDAY

An increase in highway funding would add millions to West Virginia's economy, create thousands of jobs and enable the state to achieve economic growth, according to a study commissioned by the CAWV and APA of WV that will be released at a press conference Tuesday. The study, conducted by Alison Premo Black, senior vice president and chief economist for the American Road and Transportation Builders Association, shows an immediate boost to economic recovery by investing in West Virginia's transportation infrastructure.

CAWV members are invited to attend the press conference. It will be held Tuesday, February 17, at 1:00 p.m. in the CAWV conference room. Members should be here by 12:30 p.m. Dr. Black will be presenting the report. We would like to have a good turnout of members since the press will be attending. A copy of the report will be released to the press that morning.

2015 MIDYEAR MEETING GREAT SUCCESS

The CAWV Midyear Meeting, held January 30 through February 4 at the Fiesta Americana Resort in Cabo San Lucas, Mexico, was highly successful based on members' response. Informative business sessions and networking opportunities highlighted this year's meeting which attracted nearly 200 members. The meeting began with a Board of Directors meeting followed by Building, Highway and Utilities Division meetings. Much of the discussion centered on legislation that affects all contractors, including repeal of the state's prevailing wage law, highway funding, and possible funding cuts for infrastructure projects. The General Business Sessions were at capacity as members learned about CAWV's partnership program with BrickStreet Insurance and how they can reverse the trends on increasing workers' compensation costs, actions of the West Virginia Legislature, a report on the release of a study showing the economic benefits of increasing highways spending, bringing Cabo San Lucas back to life after the devastating Category 3 hurricane, Odile, and the CAWV's affinity programs that save members money. The Tuesday General Business Session also featured a round table discussion that gave members the opportunity to bring up issues they deemed important for the CAWV or fellow members to know. The Prayer Breakfast featured a message from Kevin Kemerer, Precision Pump and Valve Service, Inc., who spoke on his mission trips to Haiti.

"The business sessions were superb," stated CAWV President Dan Flesher. "We were in Cabo and it was remarkable to see how the area has rebuilt since Hurricane Odile hit in September," the president stated. "Except for seeing a new construction project or a renovation of a building, you would never know a Category 3 hurricane devastated the area. They have done a remarkable job in their cleanup efforts."

The meeting contained a number of social networking opportunities including the opening night reception and dinner at the Fiesta Americana. Members enjoyed a number of activities including golf on the Ocean Course, which has been ranked #9 on *Golf Digest Magazine's* list of

“Top 50 Golf Hotels in the World.” Zip lining and rappelling in the Wild Canyon, deep sea fishing, shopping in the upscale Marina District of Cabo San Lucas, dune buggy and ATV rides through the Baja Peninsula, and the many Mexican restaurants in both Cabo San Lucas and San Jose, were enjoyed by members.

“I thank all the members who made this meeting a success,” said President Flesher. “We’ve gotten numerous requests to look at Cabo for a future meeting site. ISSUES HEATING UP AT LEGISLATIVE MIDPOINT

Yesterday marked the halfway point in the 2015 legislative session. It was a very contentious day in the Senate as senators voted on S.B. 361, repealing the state’s prevailing wage statute. The vote was postponed until Thursday evening after a few senators claimed the compromise version of the bill that was presented was done behind closed doors and without the press being present. Supporters of the bill countered that this bill has gotten more press, more attention, more discussion than any bill introduced so far. The bill passed 23-11 with all Republicans and five Democrats voting for the bill. It now goes to the House where many delegates have stated they would rather vote for full repeal of prevailing wage verses rather than the compromise reached in S.B. 361. The bill has a single reference to the House Government Organization Committee. A synopsis of the Senate-passed version will appear in Monday’s CAWV Legislative Bulletin.

Introduced this week is S.B. 478, a bill by Senator Bob Plymale, D-Wayne, that will create millions in extra revenue for the State Road Fund. The bill includes many of the recommendations of the Governor’s Blue Ribbon Commission on Highways, including raising DMV fees, increasing the diesel fuel tax, increasing the privilege tax one percent and creation of a State Infrastructure Bank. The bill is referred to the Transportation and Infrastructure Committee then Finance.

The House of Delegates has passed a bill that would restore the original purpose of the deliberate intent exception to the state workers’ compensation system. H.B. 2011 passed by a 59-38 vote on Feb. 10 and was sent to the state Senate. “This bill strikes a good balance between protecting the rights of both employees and employers, while also making sure that our small businesses aren’t driven out of business by the potentially devastating effects of lawsuits,” said Del. Roger Hanshaw (R-Clay), the lead sponsor of the bill. For a complete rundown on this week’s activities, including bills introduced, see the February 16 CAWV Legislative Bulletin.

PROCTER & GAMBLE TO BUILD \$500 MILLION PLANT IN BERKELEY COUNTY

West Virginia is investing around \$8 million in infrastructure upgrades for household products giant Procter & Gamble to build a multi-product manufacturing facility in Berkeley County. The state competed against bigger and wealthier states with a lot more flat land than West Virginia, Commerce Secretary Keith Burdette said. The company looked at more than 40 sites across the region. The \$500 million facility will cover over one million square feet and is expected to open in 2017.

“This is a significant investment by Procter & Gamble and a huge win for West Virginia,” said Gov. Earl Ray Tomblin. The company said the manufacturing facility is expected to create about 1,000 construction jobs and will employ about 700 full-time workers once completed.

BEECH FORK LODGE PROJECT ON HOLD

In April 2012 Gov. Earl Ray Tomblin signed Senate Bill 362, authorizing a \$28 million bond issue to build a lodge at Beech Fork State Park in Wayne County. However, earlier this week, Tomblin's Chief of Staff Charles O. Lorensen wrote a letter to six state legislators who had requested an update on the project, stating the bonds would not be issued now or anytime in the foreseeable future. Lorensen's letter states decreasing state lottery revenues will likely lead to a decrease in coverage ratios for bond issues. It goes on to say the state hasn't seen the revenue it anticipated from lease agreements in the oil and natural gas industry to pay for the project. Lorensen did suggest a public/private partnership might be one avenue to pursue in furthering the project. Perdue said that route was already being explored when the state agreed to issue the bonds.

Chris Stadelman, Tomblin's director of communications, said last week the concerns in 2012 are the same concerns that the state has today, and that issuing the bonds would hurt the state's financial standing.

The project would have consisted of a 75-room lodge with restaurant, indoor swimming pool, meeting facilities and recreation centers at Beech Fork. A feasibility study concluded in 2012 estimated that the lodge would inject almost \$2 million annually into Wayne County's economy and generate 28 jobs. There would be an indirect impact of \$2.6 million more and an additional 34 jobs, according to the study. Currently, the only profitable state park is Chief Logan State Park, which has a lodge that the Beech Fork lodge would be modeled after. Beech Fork is the number one attended park in the state. A project for a lodge at Cacapon Resort State Park is also probably on hold.

The Three-Point Rule . . . You Don't Have To Fall

Falling while getting into or out of heavy equipment, a truck or tractor cab, hooking up air and electrical lines, or mounting or dismounting trailers is a sure way to get seriously hurt. An insurance industry study showed that falls from vehicles produced injuries that were almost 25% worse than other types of injuries.

Even an ankle sprain can play havoc with your ability to use the clutch. Minor injuries can cost you big in terms of lost income and downtime. The biggest single cause of falls from a vehicle is driver error and failure to follow the THREE-POINT rule.

WHAT CAN YOU DO TO AVOID FALLS?

No matter what type of access system your vehicle has available, use the THREE-POINT system to significantly reduce the chance of a slip or fall. The THREE-POINT system means three of your four limbs are in contact with the vehicle at all times—two hands and one foot, or two feet and one hand.

The THREE-POINT system allows a person to have maximum stability and support, thereby reducing the likelihood of slipping and falling. Be a winner; use the THREE-POINT system.

DO'S:

- Wear shoes with good support -- not sandals, bare feet or high heels.
- Exit and enter facing the cab.
- Slow down and use extra caution in bad weather.
- Get a firm grip on rails or handles with your hands.
- Look for obstacles on the ground below before exiting.

DON'Ts:

- Don't climb down with something in your free hand. Put it on the vehicle floor and reach up for it when you get down on the ground.
- Don't rush to climb out after a long run. Descend slowly, to avoid straining a muscle.
- Don't ever jump out. You may land off balance or on an uneven surface, and fall.
- Don't use tires or wheel hubs as a step surface.
- Don't use the door frame or door edge as a handhold.
- Don't become an injury statistic.

OBAMA ADMINISTRATION RELEASES ITS PROPOSED FEDERAL FISCAL YEAR 2016 BUDGET

The Obama Administration released its federal Fiscal Year 2016 Budget request last week. The President's \$4 trillion fiscal plan is an increase of approximately 5 percent over federal Fiscal Year 2015 and plans for a budget deficit of \$474 billion, down from \$538 billion in FY 2015.

The following is an analysis by The Clean Water Construction Coalition regarding specific details with concern to funding national infrastructure programs that are supported by the Coalition for the Clean Water and Safe Drinking Water SRF's.

For federal FY2016, the President's Budget proposes \$2.3 billion for the Clean Water and Safe Drinking Water State Revolving Funds (SRFs), continuing the funding level provided in federal FY2015. However, while almost keeping the same overall level, the Budget reduces the FY2015 Clean Water SRF (\$1.448B) by \$332M to \$1.116B and increases the FY2015 Safe Drinking Water SRF (\$906M) by \$280M to \$1.186B. The Budget also provides \$50M for technical assistance, training, and other efforts to enhance the capacity of communities and states to plan and finance drinking water and wastewater infrastructure improvements.

In addition, it references the Water Infrastructure and Resiliency Finance Center, established last month, as a key component of this effort. The Center is intended to help communities across the country focus on financial planning for future public infrastructure investments, expanding work with states to identify financing opportunities for rural communities, and enhancing partnership and collaboration with the U.S. Department of Agriculture on training, technical assistance, and funding opportunities in rural areas. It is part of the President's Build America Investment Initiative, a government-wide effort to increase infrastructure investment and promote economic growth by creating opportunities for state and local governments and the private sector to collaborate on infrastructure development.

FIRST SEVEN MONTHS OF HIGHWAY REVENUES DROPS; GAS TAX REVENUE CONTINUES DROPPING

Total revenues for the State Road Fund revenues for the first seven months of the fiscal year are over \$11 million behind last year figures and gas tax revenues are running behind even further. Gas tax collections from July to January totaled \$224.7 million, down \$23.9 million from the same time frame the previous year. Registration fees collections are \$51.8 million, \$5.9 million over last year's figure. The Privilege Tax generated \$118.4 million, \$6.7 million above last year. Total dedicated taxes for the first seven months of the fiscal year are \$415.7 million, \$11.36 million behind last year. The \$415.7 million is \$32 million over the Governor's Estimate but a more realistic figure is to compare year-over-year numbers.

OBAMA BUDGET REQUESTS RECORD AMOUNTS FOR TRANSPORTATION

President Obama's FY 2016 budget proposal released last week asks for record amounts of funding for transportation infrastructure and presents the Administration's ideas for a six year reauthorization bill and tax proposals to pay for it. Under the request, the Department of Transportation budget would increase by almost 33 percent in 2016. For the Federal Highway Administration, that would mean a 25 percent increase from \$41 billion to \$51.3 billion. The TIGER grants program would more than double from the FY 15 level of \$500 million to \$1.2

billion in FY 16. Included also is a request to increase the amount of Private Activity Bond funding available for transportation projects from \$15 billion to \$19 billion.

The proposed large increase in transportation funding is part of the Administration's revised version of the Grow America Act, its proposal from last year presenting ideas for addressing MAP-21 reauthorization. That proposal was for four years at \$302.3 billion using unspecified corporate tax reforms as the way to provide the additional revenue needed to support the increased funding levels. This year's budget includes a six-year, \$478.3 billion version of the Grow America Act. As with last year's proposal, this version of the Grow America Act would rename the Highway Trust Fund as the Transportation Trust Fund and would be expanded to include funding for Amtrak, high-speed rail, mass transit new starts, administrative expenses and research, TIGER grants, and the National Highway Transportation Safety Administration's (NHTSA) vehicle safety programs. All would receive significant funding increases. These programs are currently funded out of general fund proceeds.

To pay for the increased funding, the Administration proposes a mandatory repatriation of overseas earnings of US corporations that would be taxed at a 14 percent rate. This is proposed to generate \$239 billion in revenue. This would be a one-time revenue jolt that would need to be replaced with other revenue after the six year period or the transportation programs would revert back to their FY 2015 levels.
