## **CAWV HOLDS VERY SUCCESSFUL MIDYEAR MEETING**

CAWV members attending this year's Midyear Meeting heard from excellent general business session speakers, participated in debates on industry issues in the division meetings, saw up close Florida's vast everglades system during an environmental tour, learned how people can make a difference through service to others, and met and talked at the many social and networking functions. Over 250 members attended this year's meeting held February 2-7 at the JW Marriott in Marco Island, Florida, the site of the 1984 Midyear Meeting.

Anthony Huey, president of Reputation Management Associates of Sarasota, spoke at the Monday Business Session. Huey is a highly-rated international communications consultant who provides pragmatic communications tools. A survey of members of his talk, "How to Communicate Like a Leader," was rated nearly a unanimous "excellent presentation." "This was probably the best presentation I've ever heard at a midyear meeting," said Ross Johnson. "I agree that Anthony is one of the best speakers we've had," said CAWV President Scott Pierson. "I think everyone gained by attending. We all communicate, whether it's with our employees, our customers or subcontractors. Each of us got tips and techniques that we can incorporate in our professional and personal lives," the president said.

Also speaking the business session was Louie Southworth, Jackson Kelly, who provided members with his annual overview of the West Virginia Legislature. "My presentation is much different this year," he told members. "Last year at this time, the state was facing a \$500 million budget deficit and there was no plan to provide highway funding. The budget crisis appears to be lessening and now there is over \$2.8 billion in new highway funding this year." Southworth, who marked his 18<sup>th</sup> year of his legislative prognostication, talked about the number of veteran legislators who will not be seeking reelection to the West Virginia House of Delegates and Senate. He also talked about the U.S. House and Senate races. An update on BrickStreet's merger with Motorists Insurance Group was presented as well as an update on the CAWV/BrickStreet workers' compensation program (see article below).

Pastor John Hanson of International Mission Outreach gave a presentation on "Service Above Self: Inspiring Our Community," at the Sunday Prayer Breakfast. Pastor Hanson, a West Virginia native, has spent 48 years building schools, churches and spreading the gospel in Haiti. "We never had one dime to build a church, we just got men together with picks and shovels to build footers. We never stopped after that. We have now built seven, all on faith," Pastor Hanson told a record crowd at the morning prayer service. "What a touching message he presented about service over self," President Pierson stated.

The CAWV Board of Directors held its meeting during this year's Midyear Meeting. "I just want to say that all members are welcome to attend our board meetings," the president said at the closing banquet. "Every person on our board has the best interest of the CAWV and our industry at heart. We all take our jobs seriously and I invite all members to bring topics to our meetings for discussion and debate."

A golf tournament, a welcome night reception and President's Banquet, both on Marco Island's beautiful beach, and the Highway/Heavy, Building and Utilities Division meetings were all part of

this year's meeting. "I think everyone enjoyed this year's meeting and I think everyone took something away from it," said President Pierson. "One thing we decided is that membership recruitment will be a major thrust this year. The CAWV went to bat for highway funding and the association is always working to change laws and regulations to make our businesses better. Every member needs to go out a recruit a new member. This is the lifeblood of our association."

Attendees will receive a survey asking their opinion of the meeting. A complete wrap-up of the CAWV Midyear Meeting will be a future issue of *West Virginia Construction News* magazine.

The 2019 CAWV Midyear Meeting will be held February 8-13 at the Westin Grand Cayman Seven Mile Beach Resort which has undergone a \$50 million renovation project. The CAWV Board of Directors has selected Costa Rica for the 2020 Midyear Meeting location.

### **CAWV/BRICKSTREET PREMIUM DISCOUNT INCREASES**

Because of members doing a better job of improving safety on the jobsite, the discount offered on the CAWV/BrickStreet workers' compensation program is increased in 2018 from 6.1% to 6.9%. "The rate is driven by loss ratio and CAWV members on the plan are doing a better job in controlling losses," BrickStreet Executive Chairman Greg Burton told members attending the CAWV Midyear Meeting last week. "We appreciate our partnership with CAWV. We have had good experience with CAWV members," he said. Following Burton's comments, Allan Williams, senior safety and loss control specialist for BrickStreet, provided members a six-point roadmap to a better safety program. "Our loss control services are available to all CAWV/BrickStreet members. Our goal is zero fatalities," he said. He also discussed the process to better manage claims. "CAWV contractor members have done a good job in this which is why the discount has grown to 6.9%," he said.

CAWV contractor members interested in getting the CAWV discount on their workers' compensation premiums can contact their personal insurance agent for details.

### **TEACHER PAY RAISES, PEIA INSURANCE TAKE TOP BILLING AT CAPITOL**

The West Virginia Legislature has two versions of a bill to raise pay for teachers and public employees. The House of Delegates conducted hours of debate before approving its version of Senate Bill 267 as teachers and school service personnel made plans for "work action" to protest the size of the raises planned for them and the cost of their health care insurance. Teachers in at least six counties – Cabell, Wayne, Lincoln, Mason, Clay and Brooke – are reported to be planning walkouts today to allow many of them to gather at the Capitol in Charleston to put pressure on legislators. Teachers in other counties are reported to be considering walkouts.

The House Finance Committee this week passed out a bill to eliminate an annual \$12.5 million transfer from the state general fund to the State Road Fund. In 2005, the legislature passed a CAWV-sponsored bill that reimburses the State Road Fund the 6 percent state Consumer Sales Tax paid on material incorporated in a highway project. The transfer has averaged about \$12 million annually. House Finance Committee action Tuesday discontinues the transfer, reason given is to help pay for the teacher pay raise. H.B. 4157 is on First Reading in the House today.

A number of bills have been introduced impacting contracting. These include S.B. 506, deregulating persons who perform work on heating, ventilating and cooling systems, S.B. 558, relating to certification requirements for crane operators (placed into a subcommittee for further review), S.B. 583, bringing West Virginia in compliance with federal pipeline safety regulations (one call), and S.B. 561, increasing minimum contract price requiring execution of bond with respect to building or repairing school property.

S.B. 341, which will create an Intermediate Appellate Court in West Virginia, passed on a vote of 23-11 in the Senate. While the Senate was debating an Intermediate Appellate Court, members of the House of Delegates debated for nearly three hours on H.B. 4268, the Co-Tenancy Modernization and Majority Protection Act. This bill will allow 75% of the owners of a property to consent to development, while providing proper compensation for minority owners or owners who cannot be located. Removal of the state's inventory tax, a top priority of Governor Jim Justice and legislative leaders, has been caught up in the teacher's pay raise debate.

Monday is the last day to introduce bills in the Senate. February 13 was the last day to introduce House bills. Look for the Monday, February 19 CAWV Legislative Bulletin which will have a complete rundown on bills impacting CAWV members and the construction industry.

### **CHANDA ADKINS APPOINTED TO HOUSE**

Chanda Adkins, R-Raleigh, has been appointed to the House of Delegates by Governor Jim Justice. She fills the vacancy created by Lynne Arvon, who was appointed to the Senate. Del. Adkins is a pharmacist, business owner, licensed manicurist, substitute teacher and middle school girls' basketball coach.

Finalists are chosen from contractors and associates who achieve an excellent performance rating. Awards are presented in the following categories: Building Division, Utility Division, Industrial Division, Specialty Contractor Division and Associate Division.

Winners in each category will receive a plaque and their choice of items such as hats, jackets, shirts, and golf shirts that will display the CAWV Safety Award logo. Also, the award will be published in the CAWV Newsletter and *West Virginia Construction News* magazine. ## **CONGRESSIONAL BUDGET AGREEMENT EXTENDS AGC-SUPPORTED 179D TAX DEDUCTION**

When Congressional leaders struck their bipartisan budget agreement last week, they included an AGC-supported provision extending an energy efficiency tax deduction for commercial buildings, commonly known as 179D. One of many provisions known as the “tax extenders,” the deduction expired on December 31, 2016, but was retroactively extended through December 31, 2017. Shortly after the agreement, Kevin Brady, Chairman of the House Ways and Means Committee, announced that he intends to hold hearings over the next year to closely examine these tax extenders, with the goal of narrowing or modifying them in a post-tax reform world. We will closely monitor the Committee’s oversight action over the coming year.

## COMPLACENCY

The term complacency has several definitions; perhaps the one most suitable (in the context of safety) is as follows, "a feeling of quiet pleasure or security, often while unaware of some potential danger, defect, or the like". Ironically, this feeling can develop from a perception that you live and work in a safe environment. An environment of few, if any, workplace incidents and when an incident does occur, it is often of a minor nature. The message here is, never let your guard down. We maintain our safety by doing just that, maintaining it.

### **The ways we maintain our safety:**

- We maintain a safe workplace by following established protocols and procedures.
- We have daily safety meetings to discuss changes and potential hazards that develop from day to day on our worksite.
- We wear the appropriate PPE for the task at hand.
- We complete an FLRA and/or review a JSA before starting a task.
- We take a "Four Second Reset" to stop and think about the safety side of the task we're about to start.
- We manage our "Zone of Control" on the worksite. Hazards identified, eliminated or controlled. Maintaining housekeeping and organization. Other workers and/or mobile equipment coming into your work area.
- We report any and all perceived or potential hazards on the worksite.
- We report all near misses. When reported, we are able to collect information, identify trends, correct current problems, and prevent future incidents and injuries from happening.
- We coach, mentor and watch out for each other throughout the day.

A level of safety in the workplace where incidents are indeed a rare occurrence, does not guarantee future success, however it is an indication of a strong safety culture. It's up to all of us to never let our guard down. Continuous safety maintenance is the backbone of a strong safety culture and a truly safe workplace.

## **UTILITY PROGRAMS PART OF PRESIDENT'S INFRASTRUCTURE PLAN**

The White House unveiled its long-awaited infrastructure plan Monday, fulfilling a signature campaign promise of President Trump. The [55-page plan](#) included details not previously released. The official announcement from the White House means that the conversation amongst lawmakers can begin in earnest, especially with last week's budget deal that creates a level of stability through September 2019.

As outlined in the proposal, the Administration would like to leverage \$200 billion of direct federal investment into \$1.5 trillion in output over the next decade for a range of infrastructure, including water and sewer programs. Of the proposed \$200 billion, the plan sets aside: \$50 billion for rural infrastructure projects in the form of state block grants; \$20 billion for the

"Transformative" Projects Program to fund cutting-edge projects deemed too risky to qualify for traditional funding, but which have the potential to fundamentally transform the way infrastructure is delivered or operated; \$20 billion to expand Infrastructure Financing Programs like TIFIA, RRIF, WIFIA, in addition to broadening the use of Private Activity Bonds; and \$100 billion for an Incentives Program that will provide block grants to states and localities as an incentive to invest, capped at 20% of the overall project cost. A number of West Virginia utility projects are funded with this type of funding.

The document also outlines proposals to relax some regulatory requirements and bureaucratic hurdles in order to decrease project delivery time and increase cost efficiency, at topic recently discussed by CWCC members.

In addition, funding levels for the Clean Water and Safe Drinking Water SRF's was announced in the President's FY19 Budget: CW SRF - \$997 million, and SDW SRF - \$863 million.

### **MINDEN SEWER PROJECT HALTED BY GOVERNOR**

Governor Justice halted work this week on a sewer plant in Fayette County. Gov. Justice issued the work stoppage until a final report from the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) is issued. That report is expected to come out in late February or early March. The decision to stop the work was made after representatives of the Governor met with concerned citizens. The sewer pipe route cuts through soil EPA testing shows has some PCB contamination. It said Minden residents have repeatedly asked Oak Hill City Council members to delay the project until after the final EPA report, which is expected to be released later this month or in early March. PCB is an industrial chemical the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention lists as a probable human carcinogen. The project is part of a \$23.5 million sewer upgrade by Oak Hill to stop the flow of fecal contamination from Oak Hill and Minden sewer plants into Arbuckle Creek. The line runs from the old Arbuckle Public Service District sewer plant in Minden to the Oak Hill sewer plant.

## TRUMP INFRASTRUCTURE PLAN UNVEILED; PRESIDENT BACKS 25 CENT GAS TAX INCREASE

AGC applauded President Trump for releasing his \$1.5 trillion infrastructure plan on Feb. 12 and backs his reported endorsement of a 25 cent federal gas tax increase to help make the Highway



Trust Fund solvent. We link here to one-page summaries of the administration's infrastructure funding, environmental streamlining and workforce development proposals. With action on an infrastructure bill moving to Congress, it is critical that the construction industry lets Congress know that the time for infrastructure investment is now. Contact your U.S. representative and U.S. senators right now so that they understand that investing in and improving our nation's infrastructure helps America prosper.

It has also been widely reported that the president—at a bipartisan meeting at the White House on Feb. 14—endorsed a 25 cent gas tax increase, which would raise \$394 billion for the Highway Trust Fund. The U.S. Chamber of Commerce—with AGC's support—put forth such a gas tax increase proposal in January.

Action now turns to Congress, where committees in the House and Senate will commence hearings on the president's plan in early March. Given election year realities and Congress's knack for only passing major legislation when it must, AGC is eyeing March 23—when government funding runs out, again—and the ensuing government funding bill as a prime vehicle for moving.
