TRANSPORTATION DAY AT THE CAPITOL” ADDRESSES NEED TO FIX STATE’S TRANSPORTATION INFRASTRUCTURE – GROUP LAUNCHES NEW CAMPAIGN

Over 200 members and highway supporters gathered at the State Capitol on Monday, January 18, to rally for increased funding to repair and maintain West Virginia’s deteriorating road system. Jan Vineyard, president of the WV Trucking Association and treasurer of West Virginians for Better Transportation (WVBT), led the news conference. “A lot has happened since we were here last year. I’m sorry to say, not in West Virginia,” said Vineyard. “Legislators and governors in Pennsylvania, Ohio, Virginia and Kentucky have all accelerated their funding for roads and bridges while West Virginia’s transportation system continues to deteriorate.”

Speaker of the House Tim Armstead, Senate Majority Leader Mitch Carmichael, Transportation and Infrastructure Committee Chair Senator Chris Walters, and Chair of Roads and Transportation in the House, Delegate Marty Gearheart, each spoke during the event. “This state’s transportation infrastructure is a critically important issue that is recognized by the new leadership in the Capitol,” said Majority Leader Carmichael. “It has been too long that we have not allowed our roads, bridges and infrastructure projects to be a priority in West Virginia.”

“It’s imperative that we recognize that the economy is tied to infrastructure development,” said Senator Carmichael. “We recognize that in order to move West Virginia forward in terms of our infrastructure, economic development, jobs, opportunity, growth and prosperity, a dedicated effort within the legislative branch to channel funding in the direction of our State’s transportation infrastructure is imperative.”

“One of the keys elements that is needed to move West Virginia forward is our infrastructure,” said Speaker Armstead. “This is one of those issues that affects everyone in the state. Infrastructure is the key to economic growth and our goal is to move West Virginia forward and get people back to work.”

“We need to make sure that our Turnpike tolls stay in place,” said Senator Walters. “That’s \$60 million that we can not afford to lose in our budget.” Senator Walters also assured supporters that he will not allow \$10 million to be removed from the secondary road fund, as Governor Tomblin proposed in the state’s budget. Chairman Gearheart said he supports roads but viewed funding in a different light. “As we go forward you are going to see a variety of bills drafted that have innovative ways of funding roads that won’t increase taxes,” said Delegate Gearheart.

PREVAILING WAGE, RIGHT TO WORK LEGISLATIONS DOMINATE THIS WEEK'S LEGISLATIVE DISCUSSION

The Senate Thursday passed S.B. 1, Right To Work legislation, by a vote of 17-16. All Republicans voted for the bill with all Democrats opposing. The bill now goes to the House of Delegates. The House Government Organization Committee, also on a partisan effort, voted 15-9 for H.B. 4005, repealing the state prevailing wage statute. The bill goes to the full House and is expected to be on passage stage – Third Reading – Tuesday. Members received a CAWV Legislative Alert Thursday with an update on H.B. 4005 and where it is headed next.

The House Government Organization passed Wednesday H.B. 4046. This is the rule bill the CAWV instituted to eliminate construction projects from the statute that change orders had to have final approval by the state Purchasing Division and the Attorney General's office before work related to the change order could begin. The bill now goes to the House Judiciary Committee for review and passage.

The West Virginia Supreme Court heard arguments Tuesday in a case that will impact the leadership of the state Senate and key pieces of legislation this session, including Right-To-Work legislation which passed Thursday in the Senate. At issue is whether the vacancy in the 9th Senatorial District should be filled by a Republican or Democrat. Currently, the Republicans hold a narrow 17-16 advantage in the chamber. At press time, there was no decision from the high court.

CAWV SAFETY AWARD PROGRAM ACCEPTING ENTRIES

Each year, the CAWV Safety Committee invites members of the association to participate in the Safety Award Program. Awards are presented at EXPO in March to companies who have exhibited excellence in safety at the workplace. Members participating in the program are scored on their documented safety policies and procedures, their commitment and approach to safety and health, as well as their recorded statistical data for the year. Special attention is given to the quality of safety training provided to employees and to companies who demand active employee involvement in their safety process. The Safety Questionnaire will be mailed to members next week and forms will also be available at www.cawv.org starting January 28.

Information is due by Friday, February 26, 2016. A panel of safety professionals, owner representatives and insurance experts judge the participants. Finalists are chosen from contractors and associates who achieve an excellent performance rating. Awards are presented in the following categories: Building Division, Utility Division, Industrial Division, Specialty Contractor Division and Associate Division.

Winners in each category will receive a plaque and their choice of items such as hats, jackets, shirts, travel mugs, and golf shirts that will display the CAWV Safety Award logo. Also, the award will be published in the CAWV Newsletter and *West Virginia Construction News* magazine. Awards will be presented at the CAWV State Meeting, which will be held March 23 at the Charleston Civic Center. 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STATE PURCHASING DIVISION MODIFIES VENDOR PROCUREMENT GUIDE

The West Virginia Purchasing Division's Vendor Procurement Guide has been modified rather extensively due to recent changes both in legislation and technology and/or systems. The Guide mirrors the Purchasing Division Procedures Handbook, which is geared to state agency purchasers.

Diane Holley-Brown, assistant director for the Purchasing Division, said, "Focusing on our vendor community in our Vendor Procurement Guide, our goal is to provide helpful information for businesses interested in participating in the competitive purchasing process in West Virginia state government." West Virginia State Government Vendor Procurement Guide Revised to Address System and Statutory Changes

The **Vendor Procurement Guide**, which is available on the West Virginia Purchasing Division's website at WVPurchasing.gov, serves as a valuable resource guide on purchasing procedures for current and potential suppliers and contractors to the state of West Virginia. Due to recent changes in state law and rules, this resource guide was recently revised to provide updated information relating to how vendors may participate in the state competitive purchasing process.

"The Purchasing Division offers this **Vendor Procurement Guide** to our business community in order to provide information on registration, bidding and general contracting practices," said Purchasing Director David Tincher. "It is our goal to encourage as many businesses as possible to participate in the state's competitive bid process."

Several changes were made recently to the **Vendor Procurement Guide** which related to the implementation of wvOASIS, a system that replaced more than 100 of the state's legacy systems, such as TEAM and the West Virginia Financial information Management System (WVFIMS).

Other revisions related to changes in law and rule which affected procurement processes are now included in this new version.

Detailed explanation of the new procedures related to change orders is addressed, which states that, in accordance with the **West Virginia Code of State Rules** 148-1-6.8, any change to existing contracts that adds work or changes contract cost, and were not included in the original contract, must be approved by the Purchasing Division and the Attorney General's Office (as to form) prior to the implementation of the change or commencement of work affected by the change. An emergency rule promulgated in the Summer of 2015 also clarified that this new change order procedure did not apply to construction contracts.

Administrative changes to contracts should be made in advance and approved by the Purchasing Division and the Attorney General's Office (as to form) prior to the implementation

of the change. However, administrative changes may be made prior to being approved by the Purchasing Division and the Attorney General's office. These administrative changes may include:

1. Changing a vendor name
2. Changing funding sources or accounting lines
3. Changing a vendor's address
4. Correction of a clerical mistake made by the State
5. Adding a renewal/extension year that was originally contemplated in the contract, provided that no new commodities/services or increases in price are included.
6. Contract closeout where quantity required was originally unknown or estimated, unit prices were included in the original contract, unit prices are not modified as part of the change order, and the quantity required was less than originally anticipated.
7. Inclusion of the Notice to Proceed documentation.
8. Changes made to sheltered workshop contracts which fall under the state set-aside program.
9. Any other administrative change not included may be approved by the Purchasing Director on a case-by-case basis.

Procedural changes are also reflected in this version of the Guide, which include disclosure of public records, online vendor registration, and protest procedures related to reverse auctions and master contract and direct order process.

To ensure consistency, the Purchasing Division also enhanced the listing of definitions in the **Vendor Procurement Guide** to avoid any confusion in the meaning of the various terminology used in public procurement.

PREVENTING FROSTBITE AND HYPOTHERMIA

Prolonged exposure to low temperatures, wind or moisture whether it be on a ski slope or job site can result in cold-related illnesses such as frostbite and hypothermia.

How to detect and treat cold-related illnesses

Frostbite is the most common injury resulting from exposure to severe cold. Superficial frostbite is characterized by white, waxy or grayish-yellow patches on the affected areas. The skin feels cold and numb. The skin surface feels stiff but underlying tissue feels soft and pliable when depressed. Treat superficial frostbite by taking the victim inside immediately. Remove any constrictive clothing items and jewelry that could impair circulation. If you notice signs of frostbite, immediately seek medical attention. Place dry, sterile gauze between toes and fingers to absorb moisture and to keep them from sticking together. Slightly elevate the affected part to reduce pain and swelling. If you are more than one hour from a medical facility and you have warm water, place the frostbitten part in the water (100 to 105 degrees Fahrenheit). If you do not have a thermometer, test the water first to see if it is warm, not hot. Rewarming usually takes 20 to 45 minutes or until tissues soften.

Deep frostbite usually affects the feet or hands and is characterized by waxy, pale, solid skin. Blisters may appear. Treat deep frostbite by moving the victim indoors and immediately seek medical attention.

Hypothermia occurs when the body's temperature drops below 95 degrees Fahrenheit. Symptoms of this condition include change in mental status, uncontrollable shivering, cool abdomen and a low core body temperature. Severe hypothermia may produce rigid muscles, dark and puffy skin, irregular heart and respiratory rates and unconsciousness.

Treat hypothermia by protecting the victim from further heat loss and calling for immediate medical attention. Get the victim out of the cold. Add insulation such as blankets, pillows, towels or newspapers beneath and around the victim. Be sure to cover the victim's head. Replace wet clothing with dry clothing. Handle the victim gently because rough handling can cause cardiac arrest. Keep the victim in a horizontal (flat) position. Give artificial respiration or CPR (if you are trained) as necessary.

How to prevent cold-related illnesses

Avoid frostbite and hypothermia when you are exposed to cold temperatures by wearing layered clothing, eating a well-balanced diet, and drinking warm, non-alcoholic, caffeine-free liquids to maintain fluid levels.
