TRANSPORTATION DAY AT THE WEST VIRGINIA CAPITOL HIGHLIGHTS NEED FOR HIGHWAY INFRASTRUCTURE FUNDING

Over 200 members and highway supporters gathered at the State Capitol on Tuesday, January 20, to send a message to new legislators: West Virginia needs a safe and modern transportation system. The group all wore reflective vests making the message of “Roads = Jobs” visible to lawmakers.

Joe Deneault, treasurer of West Virginians for Better Transportation (WVBT), led the press conference. “A lot has happened since we were here last year. I’m sorry to say, not in West Virginia,” said Deneault. “Surrounding states have all accelerated their funding for roads and bridges, while West Virginia’s transportation system continues to deteriorate.”

Speaker of the House Tim Armstead, Senate President Bill Cole, Transportation and Infrastructure Committee Chair Senator Chris Walters, and Chair of Transportation in the House, Delegate Marty Gearheart, each spoke during the event.

“One of the keys to moving forward is funding. Our funding situation that we currently have is a challenge, funding roads only from gas tax and DMV fees,” said Speaker Armstead. “We need to look at ways to restructure our funding system.”

“I think all of us can agree the most important part of economic development is the creation of safe and reliable roads and highways,” President Cole stated. “We are working in the Senate to create the kind of West Virginia that invites companies to locate here and provide jobs.”

“Funding is a huge struggle,” said Senator Walters. “We have close to a \$200 million dollar budget shortfall and that’s because our incoming taxes were off. Our coal severance taxes were off and a lot of the money would go into the highways.”

“We have more to do here in West Virginia with less money,” said Delegate Gearheart. “Our task is to find a way to accomplish that and hopefully to grow business and our tax base so we do have more money to do the important things, like build roads.”

LEGAL REFORM, PREVAILING WAGE, INFRASTRUCTURE BUDGET CUTS TOPICS DURING THIS WEEK'S LEGISLATIVE SESSION

Republicans are moving forward with their campaign promise to reform West Virginia's legal system. The House Judiciary Committee has passed out of committee H.B. 2002, which addresses the joint and several liability issue that businesses have long said is unfair. The CAWV made joint and several a legislative priority a number of years ago when members were being held liable for the majority of an award even though they were only deemed partially responsible. The bill never had an opportunity for discussion until this year when the House and Senate leadership changed and made tort reform a priority. The bill is on First Reading today in the House.

Numerous bills have been introduced to eliminate the state's prevailing wage law. S.B. 100, S.B. 245, H.B. 2206 and H.B. 2273 either make changes to or fully repeal the requirement. Many CAWV members have met with Senate President Bill Cole, Speaker Tim Armstead and legislative leadership to express their concern over outright repeal of the prevailing wage. There is hope the bill will be put in a subcommittee to look at amending the bill to address the methodology of how the wage is calculated, raising the threshold before prevailing wage rates apply (currently projects \$25,000 and above), and redirecting the collection of wage rates to an agency other than the state Labor Department. Proponents of the bill note there are enough votes in both the House and Senate for a total repeal.

Highway funding was front and center Wednesday as the House Finance Committee was presented the WV Department of Transportation's budget by Transportation Secretary Paul Mattox. Sec. Mattox appeared the following day on MetroNews "Talkline" and noted that the WV Division of Highways could only do so much with the revenue available. CAWV Executive Director Mike Clowser appeared on "Talkline" today to note the importance of additional highway funding to commerce, safety, jobs and economic development. The governor's bills to divert funds to the state's general fund the State Road Fund, School Building Authority, WV Infrastructure Fund and WV Port Authority were introduced this week.

ANTICIPATE WHAT CAN HAPPEN

Regardless of the belief that accidents “just happen,” they do not. One phrase used repeatedly by those involved in an accident is, “I never saw him.” Another is, “I would never have thought that this would happen.” The sad part about these statements is that, in a way, they are true.

During an accident investigation, those involved and witnesses many times share the same story. “They just didn’t think that the task being performed held any danger.” One key factor can be found in every statement. Either the workers or supervisors didn’t think or they didn’t anticipate the possibilities of risk.

Accidents can be greatly reduced and even eliminated if time is taken to plan for the possibilities of an injury or accident before taking on a job task. The following points can help if you will make them part of your safety culture.

- * Ask yourself. **WHAT IF?** What if someone is behind that vehicle that’s about to back up? What if the tension on that part that is being forced out releases suddenly, can it strike someone? What if the load being lifted falls, would someone be in harm’s way if it did? What if someone comes along on the job site long after workers have left for the day, could they be harmed by walking into a hole, unseen in the dark that was dug and left unguarded?

- * Look around. **KNOW THE ENVIRONMENT.** Stop and take a moment to think about where workers are and where they are going. Going out on the job site can be very dangerous if you do not know what hazards are out there every day. This is construction work. The landscape changes, work progresses, job tasks are constantly changing. What was being performed yesterday, three days ago or last week is going to change. Look around.

- * Communicate changes. **TELL OTHERS.** If on a multi-contractor project, you will see things changing that you have no responsibility for and have no control over. But those changes may create a new hazard for workers. Warn workers of hazards created by others. An accident can many times be eliminated if everyone knows what conditions exist on the job site. Staff can avoid the hazard or plan the necessary safety precautions to work near the hazard.

These ideas seem simple. **ANTICIPATING WHAT MIGHT HAPPEN** and knowing the work environment can go a long way toward keeping everyone safe.

GOVERNOR TOMBLIN PRESENTS 14 COMMUNITIES WITH SMALL CITIES BLOCK GRANTS

Gov. Earl Ray Tomblin presented more than \$12.3 million in Small Cities Block Grant funds for 14 critical infrastructure projects for communities across West Virginia. In total, more than \$27 million in other federal, state and local funding will support public infrastructure projects for more than 7,300 West Virginia households and improve reliability statewide.

"Investing in our state's infrastructure is critical to our continued economic growth and the continued wellbeing of those who call our state home," Gov. Tomblin said. "Economic development follows water and sewer projects like those supported by the Small Cities Block Grant program, and these grants provide a foundation for future developments in our communities and ensure the Mountain State is an even greater place to call home."

Small Cities Block Grant funding is provided by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development. The Community Development Division of the West Virginia Development Office manages the administration of these funds.

TOWN OF BURNSVILLE (Braxton County)

\$1,325,000

This \$4.1 million project will extend water service to 68 households along Route 5 and Orlando Road in Braxton County, which currently rely on private wells that provide poor quality water.

CLAY COUNTY COMMISSION

\$1,325,000

This \$2.96 million project will provide safe and reliable water service to 136 households along Pack Fork Road and Independence Road off Route 16 in Clay County, where residents rely on poor quality wells.

TOWN OF HARMAN (Randolph County)

\$180,774

This \$4 million project will be used to improve the Town of Harman's water treatment plant and extend water service in Harman along Route 32 to include Pennington Road and Bonner Mountain Road, serving approximately 200 households - many of whom have individual wells with poor quality and quantity.

LEWIS COUNTY COMMISSION

\$250,000

This \$3.6 million project will enable the Lewis County Commission to extend water service to 96 households in the Churchville and Sugar Camp area, including Laurel Run, Mare Run, Limestone Run and Murphy Creek areas in the Northwest Lewis Water Extension. This area is currently served by individual wells, many of which have low quantity and quality.

LOGAN COUNTY COMMISSION

\$200,000

This \$4.95 million project will enable the Logan County Public Service District to extend water service to approximately 195 households in the communities of Big Harts Creek, Smokehouse Road, White Oak Branch and surrounding areas of Logan County. This area currently does not

have a reliable source of water, and private wells prove unreliable in terms of both quality and quantity.

TOWN OF MARLINTON (Pocahontas County)

\$500,000

This \$4.35 million project will enable the Town of Marlinton to upgrade its existing water treatment plant and water storage system. The project will also enable the town to replace three water storage tanks; update booster stations, install telemetry to the plant, tanks and boosters; and complete related upgrades throughout the system to ensure its long-term viability.

MERCER COUNTY COMMISSION

\$250,000

This \$5.1 million project will enable the Oakvale Road Public Service District to extend water service to approximately 150 residents in the Elgood area, including the communities of Elgood, Twin Oaks and Christians Ridge in eastern Mercer County. The project will include the installation of new water lines, booster stations, water storage tank and related improvements needed to provide safe drinking water to area residents.

PENDLETON COUNTY COMMISSION

\$1,500,000

This \$2.85 million project will enable the Pendleton County Public Service District to extend water service to 134 households in the Seneca area, to be served by the Riverton water system. Residents of this area currently rely on wells and cisterns that run dry in summer months and produce poor quality water.

CITY OF PIEDMONT (Mineral County)

\$700,000

This \$700,000 project will enable the City of Piedmont to upgrade its water treatment plant. The project will address a deteriorated booster pump building and improve plant performance. These improvements are expected to extend the life of the antiquated facility for decades.

TOWN OF PINE GROVE (Wetzel County)

\$1,500,000

This \$1.5 million project will enable the Town of Pine Grove to improve its sewage collection system with the installation of a gravity system, pumps and force mains. The project will replace the existing vacuum system, which is plagued by failure causing backup into residential basements.

TOWN OF ROWLESBURG (Preston County)

\$1,500,000

This \$4.5 million project will enable the Town of Rowlesburg to extend water service to approximately 100 households in the Etam and Macomber areas of Preston County. The project will include the installation of water lines, fire hydrants, meters, a water booster station, and one 100,000-gallon water storage tank, and other improvements needed to provide safe and reliable drinking water to area residents.

TUCKER COUNTY COMMISSION

\$250,000

This \$5.7 million project will upgrade the existing Hamrick Public Service District water treatment plant, improve the existing distribution system and provide water service along Location Road. The project will include the refurbishment and replacement of existing water lines, tanks, valves, hydrants and telemetry to ensure the longevity of the existing water treatment plant.

WETZEL COUNTY COMMISSION

\$1,325,000

This \$1.5 million project will enable the Hundred Littleton Public Service District to provide water service to 81 households along Route 250 and Route 7 in the areas of Rush Run, Cottonwood, Burton and Pogue Run areas of Wetzel County. Many residents in the area rely on private wells and cisterns that provide poor water quality and low quantity throughout the year.

This \$2.27 million project will enable the Eastern Wyoming Public Service District to upgrade and replace a failing water system serving approximately 170 residents and customers in the Bud and Alpoca areas of Wyoming County. The project will include the installation of new water lines and hydrants to serve an area which has been plagued by a deteriorating system.

CWC COALITION PRESENTS LEGISLATIVE PRIORITIES FOR THE 114TH CONGRESS

Clean Water Construction Coalition representatives have met with Congressional leaders to discuss the Clean Water Construction Coalition's main priorities for the 114th Congress. As a result of last November's elections, there have been committee member changes as well as leadership changes in both the House of Representatives and the Senate.

The Coalition's priorities include, but are not limited to, the reauthorization of the Clean Water Act and the Safe Drinking Water Act as well as other key water infrastructure initiatives such as "W21: Water in the 21st Century" and the "California Emergency Drought Relief Act," that meet critical needs, promote economic development and generate jobs. The Coalition also noted to Congressional Representatives and staff that it is critical to increase the annual appropriations for the Clean Water and Drinking Water SRF's. In a related public works matter, the Coalition noted that we support the reauthorization of MAP-21.

The CAWV is a founding member of the Clean Water Construction Coalition.

SENATOR BARBARA BOXER REINTRODUCES THE "WATER IN THE 21ST CENTURY ACT" TO FUND A NEW WATER INFRASTRUCTURE PROGRAM

U.S. Senator Barbara Boxer (D-CA) reintroduced legislation last week that would fund a new water infrastructure program to address the Country's growing water resources needs. The bill, "Water in the 21st Century Act" or "W21", will provide grants and loans for projects and programs for water conservation, water storage, increased water efficiency or reuse, water quality improvement and research and development in these related areas. The legislation will promote and fund residential water conservation projects as well as larger public works water systems.

ROUTE 35 DESIGN / BUILD PROJECT RFQs DUE MARCH 10

The WVDOH will accept Request for Qualifications for the design and construction of the remaining 14.6 miles of U.S. Route 35 that runs through Putnam and Mason counties. Proposals for roadbed construction will be accepted until 4:00 p.m. on March 10, and after receiving both technical and cost proposals, the winning firm will be selected May 20. A paving contract will follow. Completion is set for October 2018. Project information is on BidX.

The CAWV met in December with the WV Division of Highways and Federal Highway Administration to discuss Route 35 as a design/build project with payments spread out, about the same procedure as used in the Coalfields Expressway project which bid December 9. This Route 35 project, which will not have pavement or signage in the contract, is estimated around \$159 million. Based on previous discussions with CAWV members and WVDOH at the Joint Cooperative Committee, the project may be bid as one, any or all of the following:

Project A: WV 869 (Putnam County) to CR 78 Mason County) 7.9 miles
Monthly payments of \$2.1 million for 42 months

Project B: CR 78 (Mason County) to CR 40 (Mason County) 6.7 miles
Monthly payments of \$1.7 million for 42 months

Project AB: WV 869 (Putnam County) to CR 40 (Mason County) 14.6 miles
Monthly payments of \$3.8 million for 42 months

The award will be based on the lowest bid. If the sum of bids on Project A and Project B are lower than the bid on Project AB, the award will be given to the low bidder or bidders if they are two different contractors. The DOH will use a two-step process to select teams. All teams that get a minimum score of 70 will be able to respond to the Request for Proposals (RFP). There will be no stipend or short list on this project.

GAS TAX HIKE UNLIKELY

Congress is unlikely to pass an increase in the federal gas tax this year, the chairman of the House Transportation Committee said Thursday. Rep. Bill Shuster (R-Pa.) said a deal to boost U.S. infrastructure funding will likely have to find an alternative source of revenue, potentially as part of a broader tax reform package, because the tax hike won't pass muster with members of Congress. "I know the popular thing that a lot of people are talking about is the gas tax. But I just don't believe the votes are there in the Congress at this point to do that," Shuster said in a speech to the U.S. Conference of Mayors in Washington. "It seems that ... the number one source that's being talked about is this repatriation of funds," Shuster continued. "So as we go through this process and tax reform, it'll be part of tax reform. We'll figure out how to get there."

Lawmakers have expressed new hope for an infrastructure funding deal in recent weeks as gas prices across the U.S. have dropped sharply. The 18.4 cents-per-gallon gas tax is the primary source of revenue for funding transportation projects, and infrastructure supporters have been

pushing to increase it for the first time since 1993, arguing the time is right now that drivers are paying less at the pump than they have in years. Shuster, who has opposed prior efforts to increase the gas tax, said Thursday that passing a long-term transportation bill this year is "paramount" for lawmakers. "In my travels around the country in the last two years, it's become very apparent that producing a long-term bill, a five or six-year bill, is, I think, absolutely critical and paramount," Shuster said. "The first priority is to ... provide some certainty to those of you out there that have to plan these projects," he continued. "The states, the cities, the companies that actually build need to know what the — what the long-term plan is so they can make the investments to be ready to repair bridges and build roads." Shuster added that he believed transportation funding could be an area where Democrats and Republicans could find consensus later this year.

The tax, which has not been increased since 1993, brings in about \$34 billion per year. The federal government typically spends about \$50 billion per year on road and transit projects, and transportation advocates have maintained that the larger figure is only enough to maintain the current state of the U.S. infrastructure network. The current transportation funding bill, which authorizes the collection of the gas tax at its current rate, is scheduled to expire in May. Shuster said he was optimistic that lawmakers will be able to figure out another way to pay transportation projects this year. "I feel confident that we're going to figure out how to get that funding stream so that we can do a longer-term bill, because I believe that both sides of the aisle, both sides of the Capitol, both ends of Pennsylvania Avenue, everybody's committed to getting a funded bill that gives us that certainty that we need," he said.
