STATE ENDS YEAR WITH SURPLUS; NEW HIGHWAY BILL RAISES \$136 MILLION FOR STATE ROAD FUND

Gov. Jim Justice confirmed Monday that West Virginia's state budget will end the fiscal year with a surplus. Gov. Justice and his revenue staff said the state finished fiscal year 2018 with net collections of \$4.245 billion which is \$20.2 million ahead of estimate. The final report on the budget surplus will be determined at the end of July and should be more than \$28 million, the governor said. The last time the state finished a budget cycle with a surplus, without mid-year budget cuts, was fiscal 2012, six years ago. Among the strongest drivers was personal income tax collections, which came in nearly \$60 million above estimate and about 6 percent ahead of last year. Half of any surplus funds left over at the end of the fiscal year will be deposited into the state's Rainy Day Fund.

In his news conference, the governor specifically highlighted AGC of America's data showing that West Virginia is now first in the nation in the largest percent of growth in construction employment. A few years ago, West Virginia was dead last in construction employment growth. "Imagine that, moving from last to first," Governor Justice stated. "People (outside the state) have confidence in West Virginia again." The governor said there are a lot of good things happening in West Virginia. He commented on the Roads to Prosperity bond amendment and highway funding bills which he described as "already making an economic impact."

The historic highway funding bill passed in June 2017 anticipated generating \$135 million in additional revenues for the West Virginia Division of Highways' construction and maintenance programs. S.B. 1006 increased the state gas tax, registration fees and the privilege tax on vehicles. At the end of the 2018 Fiscal Year June 30, the bill raised over \$136 million. GOV. JUSTICE APPOINTS GREAR AS 13TH JUDICIAL CIRCUIT COURT JUDGE

Governor Jim Justice announced this week that he has appointed Daniel W. Greear to the 13th Judicial Circuit Court. Greear fills a vacancy created by the retirement of Judge James Stucky. Greear, who most recently served as Chief of Staff for House of Delegates Speaker Tim Armstead, resides in Kanawha County with his wife Amy, and two sons, Josh, who just completed his first year at the United States Naval Academy; and Ben, who will be a high school senior this fall at Cross Lanes Christian School.

WEIRTON-WV / STUEBENVILLE-OH EXPERIENCE LARGEST GAIN IN PERCENTAGE OF CONSTRUCTION JOBS

Construction employment increased in 263 (73 percent) out of 358 metro areas between May 2017 and May 2018, declined in 47 (13 percent) and was unchanged in 48, according to a new analysis of federal employment data released this week by the Associated General Contractors of America. Construction employment in 63 areas was at a record high for May, in a history dating back to 1990 in most locations, the association's analysis showed. The Dallas-Plano-Irving, Texas metro area added the most construction jobs during the past year (14,200 jobs, 10 percent), followed by Phoenix-Mesa-Scottsdale, Ariz. (11,500 jobs, 10 percent). The largest percentage gains—29 percent each—occurred in Merced, Calif. (700 jobs) and Midland, Texas (7,800 jobs). The Weirton-Steubenville, W.Va.-Ohio area reported a 19 percent (300 jobs) increase, tying in fourth place with New Bedford, Massachusetts also with a 19 percent (500 jobs) increase. The Weirton-Steubenville, W.Va.-Ohio metro area ranked first in the March 2018 analysis with a 29 percent (400 jobs) increase. CONSTRUCTION EMPLOYMENT REACHES 10-YEAR HIGH

In a related issue, construction employment increased by 13,000 jobs in June and by 282,000 jobs over the past year, reaching a 10-year high, according to an analysis of new government data by the Associated General Contractors of America. Association officials said many construction firms appear to be more willing to hire amid lower tax rates and a more favorable business environment, but caution that trade fights and labor shortages pose risks to future growth.

“The construction industry continues to add workers faster than the economy as a whole, and the industry is paying premium wages to attract and retain those workers,” said Ken Simonson, the association’s chief economist. “The employment gains are occurring in both residential and nonresidential construction. However, the industry is having to rely more and more on workers without construction experience, as the pool of unemployed construction workers has nearly evaporated.”

Construction employment totaled 7,222,000 in June, the highest level since May 2008 and a gain of 4.1 percent over the past 12 months. The economist pointed out that the year-over-year growth rate in industry jobs was more than double the 1.6 percent rise in total nonfarm payroll employment.

“The steps Congress and the Trump administration have taken to create a more positive business environment and boost employment appear to be working,” Stephen E. Sandherr, the association’s chief executive officer, said. “But new trade disputes and chronic underfunding of career and technical education programs pose a real threat to continued employment gains in the sector.”

Lightning Awareness Week Policy for Outdoor Work Sites

West Virginia has seen a large number of thunder storms since July 1, and although Lightning Awareness Week began on June 24 you should always be aware of approaching electrical storms. According to the National Weather Service, there were 26 fatalities in 2014 resulting from lightning strikes in 14 states. Workers account for about one-third of the total number of people struck by lightning; roofers, construction workers, road crews, pipe fitters and farm workers are especially at high risk. Lightning typically strikes tall objects, including people standing on open ground or a roof. Work sites should have a plan in place to keep workers safe in case of a lightning storm.

- Monitor weather conditions in the early morning hours for reports of impending severe weather in your area. If warranted, continue to monitor weather conditions throughout the day. An inexpensive portable weather radio can provide timely storm data from local weather forecasts.
- All employees should understand what lightning safety plans are in place, which includes what shelters are available to them at that particular work site.(SEE BELOW)
- It's easy to determine when to take shelter. If you hear thunder, the associated lightning is within 8 miles. Suspend activities, allowing sufficient time to get to shelter. A good lightning safety motto is: "If you can see it (lightning), flee it; if you can hear it (thunder), clear it."
- If you feel your hair standing on end, and/or hear "crackling noises," you are in the lightning electrical field. If caught outside during a lightning storm, immediately remove all metal objects (including hats), place your feet together, duck your head, and crouch down low in baseball catcher's stance with hands covering your ears.
- Wait a minimum of 30 minutes from the last observed lightning or thunder before resuming normal work activities. Be extra cautious during this phase, as the storm may not be over.
- If someone has been struck by lightning, get emergency help promptly and apply first aid. It is a myth that lightning victims carry a charge after the strike—they are safe to handle and may need first aid immediately.

SAFE:

- Fully enclosed metal vehicles with windows up
- Fully enclosed buildings with plumbing and/or electrical service
- Low ground, ditches, or clumps of bushes
- Trees of uniform height, such as a forest

UNSAFE:

- Outdoor areas with metal objects such as power poles, fences, high-mast light poles, metal bleachers, electrical equipment, mowing and road machinery
- Solitary trees
- Bodies of water, open fields, high ground and caves

AGENCIES CLARIFY INTENT TO PERMANENTLY REPEAL 2015 WOTUS RULE

On June 29, the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) and the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers (USACE) issued a supplemental proposal to the July 2017 proposed action to repeal the 2015 Obama Administration definition of "Waters of the United States" (WOTUS). Public feedback on the July 2017 proposal indicated some level of public confusion about the agencies' intent. As such, the EPA and USACE issued this supplemental proposal to clarify that the agencies are proposing to permanently repeal the 2015 WOTUS rule in its entirety and keep the pre-2015 regulatory framework in place until a new WOTUS rule is finalized. AGC supports the EPA and USACE effort to repeal and replace the 2015 WOTUS rule and will provide comment as necessary on this proposal.

2017 HIGHWAY FUNDING BILL GENERATES ADDITIONAL \$136 MILLION FOR STATE ROAD FUND

Last year’s historic highway funding bill to raise the state gas tax, registration fees and privilege tax on vehicles has met expectations for additional revenue for the State Road Fund. The bill was designed to provide about \$135 million in new revenues annually for WVDOH construction and maintenance projects. On June 30, 2018, the last day of the current state fiscal year, the WVDOH collected over \$136 million over the same period last year. This revenue will be used to pay debt service on the “Roads to Prosperity” road bond amendment and for a pay-as-you-go construction and maintenance program.

The Motor Fuel Tax generated about \$450 million this fiscal year, compared to \$381 million last year, a \$69 million increase. Registrations are \$148.6 million this year compared to \$104.4 million in FY 2017. The Privilege Tax on vehicles collected about \$227.4 million this year compared to \$204 million for the same period last year. Total highway revenues for FY 2018 are about \$827.9 million compared to \$691.6 million before the highway tax bills passed the West Virginia Legislature.

This year’s trend reverses years of stagnation in the State Road Fund when gas tax revenues and registrations fees declined on a year-over-year basis. As a result, the WVDOH reduced the amount of construction and maintenance contracts put out for bid. A major reason for the previous decline in Motor Fuel collection was the declining price of gasoline. The state’s wholesale gas tax, which is based on the wholesale price of gas, dropped 1.1 cents per gallon in 2015 and another 1.4 cents per gallon in 2016. In 2017, the wholesale gas tax dropped 1 cent per gallon. Each cent of the wholesale tax generates about \$15 million.

S.B. 1006, passed June 16, 2017, after the West Virginia Legislature’s 60-day regular session and two special sessions, contained the following provisions. In all, the bill was estimated to

generate about \$135 million. Governor Jim Justice signed the bill into law June 22, 2017 before a large group of highway supporters, including many CAWV members.

- An increase in the sales tax on vehicles from five percent to six percent.
- A reset of the floor price used to calculate the wholesale tax on gasoline that will raise the gas tax by three to four cents a gallon.
- An increase in DMV fees, most notably the annual vehicle registration fee which will rise from the current \$28 to \$50.

Legislators also passed Senate Bill 1003, which was approved by both chambers and sent to the Governor, continues tolls on the West Virginia Turnpike past the 2019 date when the current bonds are paid off. The Governor wanted higher tolls, but also a provision allowing motorists to pay a nominal one-time fee annually for unlimited turnpike use. The money raised from the tolls will support new borrowing to upgrade the turnpike and pay for other road projects, up to about \$500 million.

Earlier during the regular session, lawmakers agreed to raise the amount the highway department can borrow against future federal highway funds from the current \$200 million to \$500 million. This is not new money, but it does allow the WVDOH to move more quickly on road projects that are ready to go to construction.

WV PARKWAYS AUTHORITY CLEARS TURNPIKE BONDS TO GO TO MARKET IN EARLY AUGUST

With a final vote this week by the West Virginia Parkways Authority, the state is on track to sell the first \$172 million in Turnpike bonds the week of Aug. 6. Authority members adopted a Debt and Capital Planning Management Policy, the authority's last formal action before the first of two rounds of bond sales go to market in August. Parkways General Manager Greg Barr said that of the two bonds issued, they are going to do the smaller bond issue first, \$172 million, to see how everything works.

While legislation passed in 2017 extending tolls on the West Virginia Turnpike for 30 years to fund the new bond issues envisioned a total of \$500 million in bonds, traffic engineers have scaled that back to the \$300 million range, anticipating lost revenue from deeply discounted E-ZPass rates and from commercial traffic opting for routes to bypass the Turnpike. Barr said he's hopeful that, once the Parkways Authority has 1½ to 2 years of actual traffic figures following the toll increase, the state will be able to have a larger bond offering than what the traffic engineering study is projecting. That also will give the Authority time to assess the impact of discounted E-ZPass subscriptions.

WVDOH TRIENNIAL DBE GOAL SETTING MEETING JULY 12 - MEMBERS ENCOURAGED TO ATTEND

ARMY CORPS TO FUND ADDITIONAL \$1.8B IN PROJECTS WITH NEW WORK PLAN

The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers has posted its FY 2018 Work Plan, which allocates money for construction projects affecting commercial navigation, flood and storm damage, and aquatic ecosystem restoration. The plan includes an additional \$1.772 billion provided in Congress' \$1.3 trillion spending package enacted March 23. Of that amount, \$956 million will go to navigation projects; \$541 million for flood risk management; and \$275 million for other projects. According to the American Association of Port Authorities (AAPA), navigation construction projects in the plan include construction, investigations, and operations and maintenance. The Corps of Engineers says that with the total funding for this fiscal year, the work plan funds to completion 39 feasibility studies, four projects in the preconstruction engineering and design phase, and 13 construction projects or elements of projects.
