LEGISLATURE MEETING CONTINUOUSLY TO MEET SATURDAY ADJOURNMENT DEADLINE

Committee meetings and floor sessions in both houses have been long this week as legislators advance legislation before the Saturday, March 12, midnight adjournment. Legislators will stay in session next week to finalize the budget but all bills must pass before the midnight deadline or they are dead for this session. A number of CAWV related bills are still in play today and tomorrow.

S.B. 555, the highway funding bill, is dead for this session when the House would not vote for any tax increases. The Senate has passed its version of the budget and the House is currently working on its budget bill. The two versions are wide apart since the Senate budget contains income from the governor's 45 cents per pack tobacco tax and other taxes and the House budget contains two tax measures. Delegates are proposing to sweep one-time money from various state accounts and dipping into the state's Rainy Day Fund to fill a multimillion dollar budget hole. Governor Earl Ray Tomblin came out strong today that he will veto the budget as it is currently being proposed. There is discussion that there is a high probability that there will not be an agreement on the budget by next week and that legislators will be brought back in April or May to continue work on the budget.

"All the division meetings were well attended and our committees and task forces will be busy the next few months studying and implementing the ideas and recommendations presented," he said. "I was pleased to see such a

great number of children and grandchildren at this year's meeting. They are truly the future of our industry," the president said.

CAWV CONGRESSIONAL FLY-IN SET FOR MAY 11

The 28th annual CAWV Congressional Fly-In to Washington will be Wednesday, May 11. Last year, 17 members attended the fly-in, which was the first meeting with West Virginia's new congressmen, Alex Mooney and Evan Jenkins, and the first meeting with Shelley Moore Capito as a U.S. Senator. "We had good meetings with everyone and it was good to meet with West Virginia's newest members of Congress," said Immediate Past President Dan Flesher following last year's fly-in. "Everyone was aware of the problems and issues and understood the urgency to take action." Current CAWV President Dan Cooperrider noted that Congress passed a five-year highway reauthorization bill last year. "This will be first time in about 10 years we won't have a highway funding issue on the agenda," said President Cooperrider. "This is good news. Although Congress' recently-passed highway and transit bill, the FAST Act, temporarily stabilizes highway and transportation programs, legislators have so far failed to address the root cause of the funding shortfalls that have plagued the Highway Trust Fund since 2008. Additionally, a short-term extension of federal aviation programs expires at the end of March, and Congress is working on a multi-year bill to fund those programs." The president said there will be other issues important to CAWV members and the construction industry that will be addressed at this year's event.

AGC OF AMERICA WEBINAR: LINKING SPECIFICATIONS TO MODELS

AGC of America will conduct a BIMForum webinar on Tuesday, March 22, from 2 PM to 3 PM. Cost is free for BIMForum members and \$75 for nonmembers. Specifications are the non-graphical information about the materials of a building project. This half of the building information is regularly missing from discussions about building information modeling. This presentation will explain the structure of this information, contrast the method for adding this information, which is easy and the madness of real projects and delivery methods that make adoption slow at best. In this seminar members will discover what specifications are; look at the feasibility of putting that information into a building information model; review current methods of linking specifications to models; and finish with the areas of madness posed by real project processes, schedules, timing, and delivery methods that make adoption slow at best. FAYETTE COUNTY SCHOOLS PLAN UNDERWAY

The process for developing a countywide facilities plan for Fayette County is finally getting started. School Building Authority Executive Director David Sneed recently outlined the process for the State Board of Education. The authority will collect and review data without the mindset that any schools need to be replaced or consolidated. A plan will be developed and presented to the State Board of Education in September, just in time to meet the Oct. 1 deadline to submit a project proposal for funding to the School Building Authority. While ZMM Architects and Engineers did cost estimates on fully renovating those buildings, no estimates exist on repairing them to make the structures suitable for occupancy. After the presentation, Sneed said the SBA would be fine working with ZMM, the firm contracted to the county under the current facilities plan through 2020. He said the SBA would oversee the work.

COMPLACENCY

The term complacency has several definitions; perhaps the one most suitable (in the context of safety) is as follows, "a feeling of quiet pleasure or security, often while unaware of some potential danger, defect, or the like". Ironically, this feeling can develop from a perception that you live and work in a safe environment. An environment of few, if any, workplace incidents and when an incident does occur, it is often of a minor nature. The message here is, never let your guard down. We maintain our safety by doing just that, maintaining it.

The ways we maintain our safety:

- We maintain a safe workplace by following established protocols and procedures.
- We have daily safety meetings to discuss changes and potential hazards that develop from day to day on our worksite.
- We wear the appropriate PPE for the task at hand.
- We complete an FLRA and/or review a JSA before starting a task.
- We take a "Four Second Reset" to stop and think about the safety side of the task we're about to start.
- We manage our "Zone of Control" on the worksite. Hazards identified, eliminated or controlled. Maintaining housekeeping and organization. Other workers and/or mobile equipment coming into your work area.
- We report any and all perceived or potential hazards on the worksite.
- We report all near misses. When reported, we are able to collect information, identify trends, correct current problems, and prevent future incidents and injuries from happening.
- We coach, mentor and watch out for each other throughout the day.

A level of safety in the workplace where incidents are indeed a rare occurrence, does not guarantee future success, however it is an indication of a strong safety culture. It's up to all of us to never let our guard down. Continuous safety maintenance is the backbone of a strong safety culture and a truly safe workplace.

GOVERNOR TOMBLIN PRESENTS 13 COMMUNITIES WITH SMALL CITIES BLOCK GRANTS

Gov. Earl Ray Tomblin presented more than \$12 million in Small Cities Block Grant funds for 13 critical infrastructure projects to support communities across West Virginia. In total, more than \$44 million in other federal, state and local funding will support these projects for more than 17,000 West Virginia households, improving infrastructure reliability statewide. "Today's grant funding kicks off a number of anticipated improvement projects in cities and communities across West Virginia," Gov. Tomblin said. "Economic development projects and infrastructure improvements, like those supported by the Small Cities Block Grant program, are investments that not only open the door to new business prospects, but also improve the quality of life for West Virginians now and for years to come." Small Cities Block Grant funding is provided by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development. The Community Development Division of the West Virginia Development Office manages the administration of these funds.

GREENBRIER COUNTY COMMISSION

\$200,000

This \$10 million project will enable the Greenbrier Public Service District to extend water service in and around several Greenbrier County communities along I-64 / US Rt. 60 including, but not limited to, Crawley, Shawver's Crossing, Sam Black Church, Clintonville, Alta, Williamsburg and Trout to more than 400 new households. The project will provide water service to customers who currently rely on wells and cisterns. The project will also provide an interconnection to the Town of Rupert, which will enable the town's aging plant to be placed on standby status.

The project includes a 100,000 gallon storage tank; one pressure reducing station; and 51 fire hydrants, valves, and individual customer services.

LOGAN COUNTY COMMISSION

\$1,300,000

This \$4.95 million project will enable the Logan County Public Service District to extend water service to approximately 195 residential households in the communities of Big Harts Creek,

Smokehouse Road, White Oak Branch, and surrounding areas of Logan County. The project will provide a reliable source of water in the project area which is currently served by private wells.

MARION COUNTY COMMISSION

\$238,694

This \$2.1 million project will allow the Colfax Public Service District to decommission its waste water treatment plant; and extend the Colfax sewage system to the Kingmill Valley Public Service District, benefitting a total of 230 households. This project promotes a regional approach to the provision of critical public services and eliminates duplication of treatment facilities. The project will protect public water sources by halting overflow into the Tygart Valley River, which is upstream from the Town of Monongah and the City of Fairmont's public water intakes.

TOWN OF MARLINTON (Pocahontas County)

This \$4.35 million project will enable the Town of Marlinton to upgrade its existing water treatment plant and water storage system to 721 households. HIGHWAY FUNDING CONTINUES TO DECLINE

While legislators continue to pass the buck on highway and bridge funding, revenues for the State Road Fund continue to decline. Through the month of February, the eighth month of the current fiscal year, the WVDOH has collected \$463 million, down \$23.7 million for the same period last year. The biggest decline is in the motor fuel tax. Through February, the gas tax brought in \$278 million compared to \$296 million last year, an \$18 million drop. Registration fees were off \$8.7 million from last year -- \$48 million versus \$57 million last year. The privilege tax on vehicles was up \$2.6 million, \$135.7 million this year versus \$133 million last year. This information was shared with legislators when they were debating S.B. 555, the \$300 million highway funding bill (see this week's Newsletter page for details).
