GOV. JUSTICE APPOINTS JEFF CAMPBELL TO HOUSE SEAT IN 42ND DISTRICT

Gov. Jim Justice has appointed Jeff Campbell of Lewisburg to a seat in the House of Delegates representing District 42. Campbell fills the vacancy created earlier this month when former Delegate Stephen Baldwin was named to the State Senate in District 10 following the resignation of Sen. Ron Miller.

Campbell has been a teacher in the Greenbrier County school system since 2001 and has taught Social Studies at Eastern Greenbrier Middle School in Ronceverte for the last nine years. He also has been a radio broadcaster in Greenbrier County for 33 years and for 29 years he has served as statistical coordinator for West Virginia University football broadcasts.

"I am humbled by this appointment from Gov. Justice and look forward to representing the citizens of this district in the House of Delegates," Campbell said.

OSHA BEGINS FULL ENFORCEMENT OF THE SILICA IN CONSTRUCTION STANDARD

On October 23, 2017, the U.S. Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA) began full enforcement of its respirable crystalline standard for construction. If your construction

company operates under OSHA state-plans in one of 26 states or two territories, it is important that you check to see if your OSHA state-plan agency is following the federal OSHA's lead with this enforcement policy. Although AGC remains engaged in litigation against the rule in federal court, a final decision is not expected until 2018 at the earliest. As such, AGC continues to engage the Trump administration.

In the meantime, AGC recognizes that construction companies must abide by the silica regulation, because it is the law. That is why we developed the members-only "Respirable Crystalline Silica in Construction" webpage with a host of resources—sample forms, webinars, flowcharts, FAQs, and more—to help AGC members understand their compliance responsibilities. HOUSE GOP UNVEILS TAX REFORM BILL

On November 2, the House Ways and Means Committee unveiled its long-anticipated tax reform measure, H.R. 1, the Tax Cuts and Jobs Act. The measure would overhaul our nation's tax code for the first time since 1986. The bill has several provisions, including the following:

- Lowers the corporate tax rate from 35 percent down to 20 percent.
- Lowers the S Corporate tax rate down to 25 percent.
- Reduced the number of brackets from seven to four, at the following rates: 12, 25, 35, and 39.6 percent.
- Doubles the exemption and fully repeals the Estate Tax after six years.
- Allows businesses to immediately write off the full cost of new equipment.
- Preserves the Research & Development Tax Credit.
- Repeals the Alternative Minimum Tax.
- Increases the standard deduction from \$6,350 to \$12,000 for individuals, and \$12,700 to \$24,000 for married couples.
- Allows 529 plans to be utilized to pay for costs directly related to participation in a DOL-approved apprenticeship program.

Republicans have made clear their intent to pass and sign the bill into law before year's end, noting that the 429 page bill, H.R. 1, is scheduled to be taken up for consideration in the House Ways and Means Committee beginning next week on Nov. 6.

Featuring 120 individual provisions that would add to, augment, or eliminate sections of the current tax code, the Republican tax reform bill—crafted behind closed doors—is already generating intense debate among business leaders. Steve Sandherr, CEO of AGC of America, has already weighed in on the unfolding debate, noting that the AGC “will work to ensure that pass-through businesses, including the majority of construction firms, also benefit from tax reform.” The CAWV looks forward to providing its members with greater, construction-specific analysis in the coming weeks.

CONSTRUCTION JOBS INCREASE IN 35 STATES BETWEEN SEPTEMBER 2016 AND 2017; 26 STATES ADDED JOBS BETWEEN AUGUST AND SEPTEMBER

Thirty-five states and the District of Columbia added construction jobs between September 2016 and September 2017, while 26 states added construction jobs between August and September 2017 according to an analysis by the Associated General Contractors of America of Labor Department data released this week. West Virginia ranked 22nd, adding 900 construction jobs

(3.1 percent) between September 2016 and September 2017, but lost 100 jobs between August 2017 and September 2017.

California added the most construction jobs (44,600 jobs, 5.7 percent) during the past year. Oregon added the highest percentage of new construction jobs during the past year, followed by Rhode Island (13.7 percent, 2,500 jobs); Nevada (12.6 percent, 9,700 jobs); Louisiana and New Hampshire (10.2 percent, 2,600 jobs). Fourteen states shed construction jobs between September 2016 and September 2017 while construction employment was unchanged in Idaho. Iowa lost the highest number of construction jobs (-6,600 jobs, -8.1 percent), followed by Missouri (-6,400 jobs, -5.3 percent); Georgia (-6,200 jobs, -3.4 percent) and Illinois (-5,800 jobs, -2.7 percent).

Among the 26 states that added construction jobs between August and September, Texas added more than any other state (4,100 jobs, 0.6 percent). Ken Simonson, chief economist of AGC, noted that Hurricane Harvey, which struck Texas and other Gulf Coast states in late August, had probably contributed to a large rebound in construction employment in Texas from August to September. Hurricane Irma hit Florida in mid-September and led to an extreme but probably temporary drop in construction employment there.

OSHA BEGINS FULL ENFORCEMENT OF THE SILICA IN CONSTRUCTION STANDARD

On October 23, 2017, the U.S. Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA) begins **full enforcement** of its respirable crystalline standard for construction. If your construction company operates under OSHA state-plans in one of **26 states or two territories**, it is important that you check to see if your OSHA state-plan agency is following the federal OSHA's lead with this enforcement policy.

Although AGC remains engaged in litigation against the rule in federal court, a final decision is not expected until 2018 at the earliest. As such, AGC continues to engage the Trump administration. In the meantime, AGC recognizes that construction companies must abide by the silica regulation, because it is the law. That is why we developed the **"Respirable Crystalline Silica in Construction"** webpage with a host of resources—sample forms, webinars, flowcharts, FAQs, and more—to help AGC members understand their compliance responsibilities. Please take advantage of those resources.

Details on Latest OSHA Enforcement Guidance

OSHA issued a **memorandum** to OSHA Regional Administrators providing interim enforcement guidance for Compliance Safety and Health Officers (CSHOs) commencing enforcement on October 23. The memorandum serves as interim enforcement guidance and expires when the standard's companion compliance directive becomes effective and available to the field.

It is important to note, however, that the memorandum does not provide specific enforcement guidance on all the standard's provisions. In addition, due to the new requirements in 29 CFR 1926.1153, OSHA has revoked their *National Emphasis Program on Crystalline Silica* which provided guidance to CSHOs for targeting inspections of jobsites with the potential to generate elevated exposures to crystalline silica. The memorandum outlines inspection guidance for CSHOs for both methods of compliance – Specified Exposure Control Methods (Table 1) and Alternative Exposure Control Methods (Performance and Scheduled Monitoring Options). During an inspection/investigation, CSHOs will:

- Collect personal breathing zone samples when controls for tasks list in Table 1 are not being fully and properly implemented or when alternative exposure control methods are not being properly implemented;
- Review the employer's written silica Exposure Control Plan (ECP) and other relevant programs (Respiratory Protection Program, Hazard Communication Program, etc.). If the employer conducted an exposure assessment, those records will also be reviewed; and
- Interview affected employees, including the competent person, as part of the as part of the overall assessment of the employer's implementation of its ECP.

The memorandum also approves the use of sweeping compounds (e.g., non-grit, oil- or waxed-based) as a housekeeping method; clarifies that the 30-day trigger to make medical examinations available to employees who will be required to wear a respirator for 30 or more days a year applies *per employer* (exposures with previous employers do not count toward the 30-day total); and outlines how exposure variability will be taken into consideration when comparing the results of employer and CSHO samples. Although the memorandum does not include specific guidance on required employee information and training (paragraph (i)(2) of the standard), AGC encourages contractors to continue to ensure that employees covered by the standard are trained in accordance with the provisions outlined in the standard.

FIRST FIVE MONTHS OF HIGHWAY REVENUES UP \$32 MILLION OVER LAST YEAR

Total revenues for the State Road Fund revenues for the first five months of the fiscal year are ahead of estimates and well above actual collections for the same period last year. Through October 31, 2017, the State Road Fund collected \$276.5 million, or 0.74% above the governor's \$274.5 million estimate. This year's actual collections for five months of \$276.5 million are \$32 million more than last year's collection of \$244.5 million. Gas tax collections from July to November totaled \$152 million, up \$11.3 million from the same time frame the previous year. Registration fees collections are \$49.8 million, \$20.6 million above last year's figure. The Privilege Tax generated \$74 million, \$62,000 above last year.

The increased revenue is a result of S.B. 2006 passed in June which increased the wholesale gas tax, DMV fees and a 1 percent increase in the sales tax on vehicles. The additional money has allowed the WVDOH to add millions of dollars worth of projects to the bid schedule this year.

WEST VIRGINIA ROADS AMONG NATION'S WORST

A recent study looked at the state of America's road infrastructure and found that roads in West Virginia are among the worst in the nation. The survey by Wall Street 24/7 ranked West Virginia as number three in their list of "States that are Falling Apart." Ohio also was in the top 20 for the worst roads, bridges, and highways. An analysis for U.S. and Global Equity found that West Virginia is 25th in the country when it comes to having roads in poor condition. The state also ranked 14th from the bottom in highway spending as a percentage of total state spending. West Virginia was 5th in the nation for the number of deficient bridges and 3rd in the nation for dams at high hazard risk. The estimated cost of repairing infrastructure in the U.S. is projected to top \$2.4 trillion by 2025.

WVDOH REQUIRING NEW MONETARY DISCLOSURE AFFIDAVIT

We want to remind contractors working on a DOH project that they will be impacted by a bill passed during the most legislative session. The new legislation states that the WVDOH cannot award a construction contract to any bidder that is known to be in default on any monetary obligation owed to the state or a political subdivision. Consequently, a prime cannot utilize a subcontractor that is in default. The DOH will be requiring contractors and their subcontractors to complete an affidavit certifying that they are not in default of any financial obligations, including payroll taxes, property taxes, sales and use taxes, fire service fees or any other state or local fees. The following alert has been posted on the WVDOH website:

Pursuant to W. Va. Code 5-22-1(i), the West Virginia Department of Transportation, Division of Highways, may not award a construction contract to any bidder that is known to be in default on any monetary obligation owed to the State or a political subdivision of the State, including, but not limited to, obligations related to payroll taxes, property taxes, sales and use taxes, fire service fees, or other fines or fees. An AFFIDAVIT form has been created by the WVDOT and will be sent via email to your company whenever you are deemed as the apparent low bidder and/or until advised otherwise.

The DOH also has an alert posted regarding a new requirement for Disclosure of Interested Parties that was highlighted in a previous bulletin.
