HOUSE PASSES SIX-YEAR HIGHWAY AND TRANSIT BILL

Following nearly three days of debate and the consideration of 147 amendments, the House of Representatives passed the Surface Transportation Reauthorization and Reform Act (STRRA) of 2015 by a vote of 363-64. The six-year bill is the first long-term bill to be passed in the House in a decade. The next step is for House and Senate negotiators to work out final details of the bill prior to the expiration of the current extension on Nov. 20. Prior to the vote, AGC sent a letter urging support for passage of the bill. In addition, the AGC and ARTBA - led Transportation Construction Coalition and their partners in the Americans for Transportation Mobility voiced support for passage of the Act.

Prior to passage, a number of amendments were adopted by House. An AGC-championed amendment to expand the mileage limit from 50 to 75 miles allowing construction drivers to reset their hours-of-service time after a 24-hour break was adopted by voice vote. The amendment would also allow states to opt out of the increase for travel solely within a state. An AGC-opposed amendment expressing a "Sense of Congress" in support of devolution failed by a vote of 310-118. But potentially, the most important amendment to the bill passed with overwhelming bipartisan support. Representative Randy Neugebauer (R-Texas) stripped two of the Senate pay for's that provided \$19 billion for the Highway Trust Fund with a new provision that would provide \$59 billion for the Highway Trust Fund. What this means is that House and Senate negotiators must now decide on whether to use the extra \$40 billion to fund the final bill for five years at increased funding levels or six years at current funding levels. Funding and other issues will be worked out during negotiations in what is called a conference committee.

AGC will work with conferees to ensure the final bill provides long-term stability and increased funding for federal highway and transit programs.

SENATE VOTES TO REPEAL EPA'S "WATERS OF THE UNITED STATES" RULE

The Senate took two actions recently aimed at blocking the United States Environmental Protection Agency's (EPA) controversial "Waters of the United States" (WOTUS) rule. ARTBA opposes the rule because it would expand wetlands jurisdiction to include roadside ditches and other bodies of water, leading to increased delays and permitting burdens for transportation improvements.

On Nov. 2, the Senate attempted to proceed with S. 1140, the "Federal Water Quality Protection Act." The ARTBA-supported legislation would have forced EPA to withdraw the WOTUS rule and develop a new rule in close consultation with the regulated community. Unfortunately, the 57-41 vote was shy of the 60-vote threshold needed to end debate on the measure.

On Nov. 4, the upper chamber by 53-44 passed a motion to block the WOTSUS rule under the Congressional Review Act (CRA). This action, which only required a simple majority to pass, would prevent the regulation from taking effect. However, the CRA motion requires – and is highly unlikely to get – the approval of the president. The Obama Administration has repeatedly indicated its support for the WOTUS rule. The WOTUS rule is being temporarily blocked by the federal courts as the result of multiple lawsuits filed by ARTBA and numerous other trade associations, as well as 31 states.

BATTERY SAFETY

Batteries provide a portable – and usually safe – source of electrical power for countless applications. From tiny cells used in wristwatches to industrial-size utility backups, batteries keep things working for us. There are some hazards associated with batteries, however. The chemical reactions required to generate electricity involve toxic and explosive substances, harmful to humans and the environment. Large batteries can deliver fatal electrical shock. Consider the many uses for batteries in your workplace, such as personal lights, UPS (Uninterruptible Power Supply) units for electronic equipment, power for handcarts and forklifts, alarm and testing equipment, clocks, communications and bar code readers.

Batteries produce hydrogen gas, also known as H₂. This gas is explosive. When an accumulation of hydrogen gas mixes with oxygen in the air and meets an ignition source such as a spark, an explosion occurs. The result is often an eye injury from fragments of a battery or tool. The explosion also propels the hazardous content of the battery, such as sulfuric acid or lead. While it does not happen often, even an ordinary flashlight can explode. Excess hydrogen gas is likely to be produced when batteries are being charged, and when batteries are mismatched, connected incorrectly, damaged, overcharged or otherwise misused.

These general safety tips apply to batteries of all sizes: Read and follow the manufacturer's instructions; do not mix batteries of different brands; do not mix old and new batteries; do not mix batteries of different types, such as alkaline and non-alkaline, or rechargeable and non-rechargeable; do not use damaged or leaking batteries; and observe the correct polarity when installing batteries.

A battery explosion is a serious matter in any work environment, but especially when the atmosphere of the work area is flammable. For use in hazardous atmospheres, observe all safety precautions to prevent fire and explosion. As directed, use lights and batteries designed to minimize the hazards of sparks. Make sure the batteries are in good condition and installed correctly. Open the battery compartment to allow any accumulated hydrogen gas to escape. Of course, you must not inspect your light in a hazardous area or near an open flame.

Many workplaces have battery rooms where large batteries that power mobile equipment are charged and changed. Handling these batteries requires special training to prevent explosions and other kinds of exposure. The rooms have to be well ventilated. Workers need to use the correct battery lifting devices to avoid injury. Heavy batteries being moved from delivery vehicles to storage can also fall and crush toes.

Large stationary batteries are also present in utility settings where they provide temporary power in an outage until the fuel-powered generator kicks in. These high voltage batteries are stored in secure, well-ventilated power rooms. Only trained, authorized personnel who know how to avoid shock, electrical arcing, blast and chemical hazards should handle them. Even an apparently discharged battery of this size can retain enough electrical power to kill. Combustible materials, sources of ignition – and unauthorized personnel – must be kept away from these areas.
