CONSTRUCTION MATERIAL COSTS INCREASE 7.4 PERCENT, AS CONTRACTORS CONTINUE TO BE SQUEEZED BY TARIFFS AND RISING FUEL PRICES

The cost of many products used in construction climbed 7.4 percent over the past year due to double digit increases in commonly-used construction materials, according to an analysis by the Associated General Contractors of America of new Labor Department data. Association officials noted that the cost increases come as many construction firms are already grappling with shortages of skilled craftsmen essential for projects but have limited ability to increase prices for their services.

"The new construction materials cost data likely under-reports actual price increases, since federal officials collected most of their data in the first half of the month, before new tariffs affecting many construction materials started," said the association's chief economist, Ken Simonson. "Contractors are paying more for the materials they use and workers they employ but aren't able to pass most of those new costs on to their clients."

Simonson noted that the producer price index for inputs to construction industries—a weighted average of all goods and services used in construction—increased 0.2 percent from August to September and soared 6.2 percent since September 2017, while the index for goods except services rose at a faster pace of 7.4 percent. In contrast, an index that measures what contractors say they would charge to construct five types of nonresidential buildings rose just 3.5 percent over the year, indicating that contractors were absorbing more of the costs than they were passing on to owners.

Diesel fuel, steel pipe and tube, asphalt paving mixtures and aluminum products were among the diverse products that contributed to the large year-over-year cost increases, the economist said. He pointed out that from September 2017 to September 2018, there were producer price index increases of 29.3 percent for diesel fuel, 22.1 percent for steel pipe and tube, 11.7 percent for fabricated structural metal, 11.2 percent for asphalt paving mixtures and blocks and 10.7 percent for aluminum mill shapes. Additionally, the administration recently imposed an interim

tariff of 10 percent on \$200 billion worth of Chinese imports, including goods (link is external) important to the construction industry, and plans to increase the rate to 25 percent in the new year.

A <u>survey</u> the association released in August found that 80 percent of respondents reported difficulty filling hourly craft worker positions. As a result, sixty-two percent of firms report they are paying higher salaries to attract and retain workers. "The more firms get squeezed by higher materials and labor costs, the less likely they are to continue hiring and investing in new equipment," said Stephen E. WOOD COUNTY GOP PICKS TOM AZINGER TO REPLACE FRANK DEEM

The Wood County Republican Executive Committee voted Thursday to appoint former Delegate Tom Azinger to replace the late Frank Deem on the ballot this November. Deem died Wednesday at the age of 90. First elected to the House in 1954, Deem served a total of 48 years in the House and state Senate. Most recently, he served four terms in the Senate, ending in 2010. He was again elected to the House in 2014 and re-elected in 2016 and was seeking re-election this November. Azinger served in the House of Delegates between 1995 and 2015 and was always supported by HUB/PAC, the CAWV's political action committee.

WRDA PASSES SENATE 99-1, HEADS TO PRESIDENT TRUMP

The Senate passed the WRDA bill (S. 3021, America's Water Infrastructure Act of 2018) with the same language as the House version passed in September. WRDA now heads to President Trump for his signature. This new WRDA bill (aka "America's Water Infrastructure Act") will:

- Authorize federal funding for water infrastructure projects, which leverages billions in water infrastructure spending;
- Expand water storage capabilities;
- Include billions of dollars in deauthorizations and reduce the deficit;
- Assist local communities in complying with the Safe Drinking Water Act and Clean Water Act by upgrading aging drinking water, wastewater and irrigation systems;
- Reduce flooding risks for rural, western, and coastal communities;
- Ensure that America maintains the competitiveness of our coastal and inland ports, and maintain the navigability of our inland waterways;
- Create a new framework to allow for more Army Corps projects to be budgeted with increased local stakeholder input and expanded transparency;
- Authorize or reauthorize important water infrastructure programs and projects; and
- Address significant water infrastructure needs in tribal communities.

The final bill also includes the following:

- Reauthorization of the DWSRF at \$1.174B for FY19, \$1.3B for FY20 and \$1.95B for FY21, effectively doubling the funding available to State SRF Programs;
- DWSRF provisions included David Bacon, assistance for disadvantaged communities, compendium of best practices, technology review, source water usage, assessment and elimination of cross-cutting requirements, natural disaster area assistance, monitoring of contaminants, drinking water fountain replacement for schools, innovative water technology grant program, \$100M authorization for meeting regulations in underserved areas;
- WIFIA (made permanent, special rules for certain combined projects and repayment, \$50M authorized for FY20 and FY21, state loan funds can finance up to 100% of project costs subject to default, can't pass through fees, no new reviews required, 180 day approval of applications, and funding tied to SRFs' FY18 or 105 % of FY17, whichever is greater, levels), sewer overflow control grants (\$225M authorized for FY19 and FY20), and water sense program;
- Other provisions of interest included stormwater infrastructure funding task force, Indian reservation drinking water program, technical assistance for treatment works, study of intractable water systems, and water infrastructure and workforce investment.

PPE AND CONTACT LENSES

At one time contact lenses were thought to be a danger in many work environments and while doing many tasks. Current safety thinking about contact lenses is this: Contacts are safe for use in all work environments, providing other appropriate eye protection is also used. They have even been approved for use with a respirator. The problems which give contact lenses a bad name at work have usually turned out to be the result of over-use and failure to use protective safety eyewear.

Contacts should not be worn in any situation where they might absorb chemical vapours or trap dust. If you wear contact lenses, these tips are for you:

- Appropriate eye protection must be worn along with the contacts. Contact lenses and street eyewear are no substitute for the correct safety glasses or goggles.
- The worker should consider telling the first aid crew he wears contacts in case of an eye
 injury. Wallet cards identifying contact lens wearers are also a good idea.
- Bring your contact lens care kit to work in case a lens needs to be removed and cleaned. Keep an extra kit in your locker just in case.
- Keep extra set of eyeglasses at work in case the contacts must come out because of dust in the eye or other problems.
- Follow the care program recommended by the lens provider. Smudged and dirty contacts can impair vision and lead to eye irritation and infection.
- Over wearing can cause excessive drying, leading to ulceration of the eye cornea.
- In case of a chemical splash in the eye, begin flushing the eye with water immediately
 and continue for 20 minutes. The lens may be washed away in this process, or a firstaider may be able to take them out while flushing continues. Call for medical help
 immediately.
- Sometimes an impact will knock a contact lens away from the cornea at the front of the
 eye and send it under an eyelid. If flushing with a clean saline solution does not work,
 see an eye specialist.

Fighter pilots in the Persian Gulf War found contact lenses worked better with their respirators and goggles than eyeglasses did. Their experience contributed to the new thinking about contact lenses in the workplace

AGC ASKS FOR CONSTRUCTION EXEMPTION FROM TRUCKER HOS RULES

AGC of America submitted comments this week, individually and as part of the Construction Coalition, to the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Administration (FMCSA) requesting that construction industry drivers be exempted from hours of service (HOS) rules. The comments pointed out that the type of driving undertaken by industry drivers does not create the same demands or fatigue concerns as long haul drivers. Because of the seasonal nature of construction and demands on contractors to complete projects under tight time limits the HOS restrictions have significant negative and unnecessary impacts on construction.

Congress and FMCSA have acknowledged this problem by providing a variety of exemptions from HOS requirements for some construction operations and materials. HIGHWAY FUNDS GREATLY IMPROVE

State Road Fund (SRF) revenues are up 21% for the first three months of the fiscal year over the same period last year. Total dedicated tax revenues through September 2018 are \$229.3 million compared to \$190 million last year – a \$39.5 million increase. This year's revenue is also 16% above the Governor's Estimate of \$197.3 million. The increase is due to the highway funding increases passed in June 2017 by the West Virginia Legislature.

Motor Fuel, Registration and Privilege Tax revenues – the main revenue sources for the SRF -- increases make up the \$39.5 million increase. Motor Fuel taxes are up \$22.6 million (23% increase), Registration Fees are up \$8.8 million (24% increase), and Privilege Tax is up \$8 million (15%).
