GOVERNOR TOMBLIN CALLS SPECIAL LEGISLATIVE SESSION

Governor Tomblin is calling lawmakers into a special session on Sunday to cover West Virginia's share of recovery costs after deadly floods in June caused nearly \$340 million in damages. Gov. Tomblin told reporters on Tuesday that the administration is finalizing its damage totals. But in a worst-case scenario, if the federal government will only cover 75 percent of the costs, the state would need to chip in about \$85 million. The June 23 flooding killed 23 people in West Virginia, destroyed more than 2,100 homes, caused major damage to more than 1,300 others and inflicted minor damage on another 700. More than 8,800 households have applied for Federal Emergency Management Agency aid. The latest estimate for damage to the state's highway system is \$55 million. Five schools totaling \$130 million need to be replaced, including \$68 million in Kanawha County alone (see this week's Building Bulletin for details).

Part of the state's share will likely come from the Rainy Day Fund, which has a \$681.9 million balance. Those reserves have been tapped a few times in recent years to plug budget holes, largely due to falling tax money from the state's depleted coal industry and from low natural gas prices. Speaking on today's "Talkline" on WV MetroNews, House Speaker Tim Armstead, R-Kanawha, said there is a \$9 million budget surplus budget and \$21 million in excess lottery funds that can be used to provide West Virginia's match. FEMA has already approved \$33.1 million in housing aid and \$6.3 million for other individual needs.

Many CAWV members have been performing flood relief work in the counties hit by June's flooding. The West Virginia Conservation Agency has just advertised emergency watershed projects in Clay, Greenbrier, Nicholas and Webster counties (see this week's Heavy/Highway Bulletin for complete details). Stream clean up due to the floods is estimated at \$32 million. Mitigation work to lessen the potential for future damages is another \$37.5 million.

YOUNG CONTRACTORS FORUM LEADS SUCCESSFUL TRAIL RESTORATION PROJECT

Members of the CAWV Young Contractors Forum led a successful project in restoring the Spotted Salamander Trail at Kanawha State Forest. CAWV members met on Friday, September 9, to install post and guide ropes to complete a major makeover of the trail, which is for blind and handicap visitors. West Virginia Paving, Inc. had already paved the parking lot and made asphalt repairs to the trail.

The *Charleston Gazette-Mail* wrote a great article on September 14 on the trail restoration. Josh Booth, Highway Safety, Inc. and YCF chairman, told reporter Rick Steelhammer, "This is a relevant project that benefits everyone in the community, and I think that's why so many people responded. Also, contractors in my generation are generally not office people – we like to get outside."

SCHOOL REPLACEMENT COSTS WILL MAKE THE DIFFERENCE ON FLOOD REIMBURSEMENT RATE

It could be several months before the state officially meets the damage amount threshold FEMA has set for West Virginia to qualify for 90 percent reimbursement from FEMA in connection with the June 23 flood. The threshold is \$254 million in damages, Gov. Earl Ray Tomblin's Chief of Staff Chris Stadelman said this week. The state doesn't expect to have the final costs on flood damage until county school systems know exactly what it's going to cost to replace the several schools that were destroyed in the flood. Those costs are currently being estimated at \$130 million, which would put the total cost of the flood beyond \$300 million, according to Stadelman. For now, Gov. Tomblin will move forward assuming the reimbursement rate will be 75/25 from FEMA. That's the number he'll use during next week's special session of the legislature. Gov. Tomblin will ask lawmakers to allocate \$85 million of state funding next week. It will come from the Rainy Day Fund and leftover budget money.

REBUILT KANAWHA COUNTY SCHOOLS TO COST \$68 MILLION

The Kanawha County school board took a step Thursday night to allow its officials to ask the state School Building Authority to provide part of the \$68 million that the planned new Herbert Hoover High and Clendenin Elementary schools are projected to cost. Charles Wilson, Kanawha County Schools' executive director of facilities planning, gave the \$68 million figure Thursday night, saying the Federal Emergency Management Agency is expected to fund at least 75 percent of that cost, if not 90 percent, and the public school system plans to ask the SBA for the remaining 25 percent or 10 percent this year. Wilson pointed out that the figure is an early estimate. The late-June floods ravaged both school buildings, and the school system previously announced the original buildings will never reopen. The SBA's board distributes state general revenue, bond proceeds and lottery money to school construction and renovation projects around the state on a competitive basis, and it's expected to vote in December on which counties will receive money in this year's funding cycle.

Wilson said the estimated cost to rent, set up and remove the portable classrooms that will house Hoover and Clendenin Elementary students until their new schools are built is about \$12 million to \$13 million. He said FEMA has committed to paying at least 75 percent of that, though a FEMA spokesman said he wasn't comfortable talking about funding Wednesday night.

The Legislature is going into special session Sunday to address flood repair, including how to address schools in other counties that were damaged in June's flooding.

Safety Bulletin

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CONSTRUCTION SAFETY: WORKING WITH HAND & POWER TOOLS

Can you think of a commercial construction project that has been completed without the use of hand tools or power tools? Yeah, neither could I. Maybe it's our familiarity with them or the fact that they are such a commonplace item on the construction site that hand tool and power tool safety often gets overlooked. Hand tools and power tools present a host of potential hazards such as flying objects, electrical shock, falling objects, punctures and lacerations. Here are 10 quick and easy tips for safely working with hand and power tools.

Inspect your tools. Never issue or use a damaged or defective hand or power tool. Always inspect your hand and power tools before and after each use to ensure they are in good working order. Check for cracked or loose handles on hand tools and make sure all guards, safety switches, electrical and hoses are in good condition. Tag any damaged tools and remove them from use until they can be repaired.

Pick the right tool. Make sure you are using the correct tool for the task at hand. Don't use a screwdriver as a pry bar or chisel. This also means using the right sized bits, blades and accessories on your power tools. Don't get creative if you don't have a tool you need. Using the wrong tool can lead to injury or damage to the tool.

Wear your PPE. Issue personal protective equipment to your employees and make sure they wear them properly. This includes items like safety goggles, face masks, ear plugs, hard hats and work gloves. Avoid wearing loose clothing or jewelry that could impede your work or get caught in any moving parts on power tools.

Don't alter your tools. Never remove guards or disable safety devices on power tools. Don't paint or cover up your tools as this could prevent you from noticing chips or cracks in your tools. If a tool is damaged or broken during use, don't attempt to make an on the spot repair if you don't have the right parts or tools to do so. This is one of those few instances where duct tape is not the answer.

Handle with care. Tools are not toys. Never throw or toss a tool in the direction of or directly to a coworker. Don't use electrical cords to lower or lift a tool to get it to a workspace. Always carry tools in a toolbox or on a tool belt, never shove a tool in your pocket if you are going to be walking around. Keep your finger off the trigger of power tools when moving about to avoid accidental discharge.

Keep your distance. When working with hand and power tools be sure you have enough room to safely operate without coming into contact with other objects or coworkers. If you are working at height, make sure there isn't anyone working beneath you in the event you drop a tool. When using something like a nail gun, check to see that everyone is clear of your line of sight in the event of an accidental discharge or misfire.

Pick up after yourself. Don't leave unused tools lying around the jobsite. They can create tripping hazards or accidentally get knocked on someone's head. Establish a check-out/check-in for company-owned tools to avoid accidents and to keep tools from mysteriously walking off the jobsite.

Unplug and disconnect. Don't leave electric power tools plugged in when not in use or when making adjustments such as replacing blades or bits. Disconnect pneumatic tools from the air line when loading fasteners or when not being used to avoid accidental discharge. Never leave unattended tools plugged in to avoid injuries by untrained workers. Always unplug and disconnect when moving the tool to a new location.

Keep your workspace clean. A cluttered floor can lead to accidental trips or falls which can be extremely dangerous when working with hand and power tools. Avoid working in wet conditions when working with electric power tools. Keep all power cords and air lines out of the way as much as possible to avoid getting tangled up or tripping a coworker.

Get trained up. Make sure you and your employees are thoroughly trained on the proper use of hand and power tools. Employees should know how to safely operate the tools they are required to use on the job. This includes knowing which PPE is required to be worn when working with specific tools.

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SENATE OVERWHELMINGLY PASSES WATER LEGISLATION

This week, the Senate passed the AGC-supported \$9 billion Water Resources Development Act (WRDA) of 2016 by an overwhelming 95 to 3. The Senate WRDA bill authorizes funding for U.S. Army Corps of Engineers civil works projects, including navigation (dredging, locks), flood control (levees), hydropower (dams), recreation (parks), and water supply. Additionally, the Senate WRDA bill creates a Clean Water Trust Fund, a longtime AGC priority, State Revolving Fund and Water Infrastructure Financing and Innovation Act funding for cities with declared lead in water emergencies (like Flint, Mich.), reauthorizing sewer overflow control grants, new funding for technical assistance to small treatment plants, Safe Drinking Water Act compliance assistance for small disadvantaged communities, reauthorizing funding for desalination, and assistance for low-income residents when replacing lead service lines to homes.

The House has yet to bring up its version of WRDA after it passed out of committee, however conversations with key members and staff indicate the House could bring up its version as early as next week. The House version does not include the drinking water/wastewater provisions in the Senate bill. AGC will continue to pursue passage of WRDA in both the House and Senate and fight for all AGC priorities in the bill through conference and presidential signature.

FUNDING APPROVED TO ASSIST IN CHEAT LAKE WATER LINE PROJECT

The Monongalia County Commission approved \$50,000 to assist in funding a water line project for the Rockley Road area, near Cheat Lake. The commission approved the funds during the Sept. 7 regular meeting at the request of Morgantown Utility Board (MUB) General Manager Tim Ball, who appeared on behalf of the 29 households to be served by the extension. Ball explained that funding for the \$1,290,000 project will largely come through the West Virginia Infrastructure and Jobs Development Council (IJDC), which will provide a 40-year loan of \$607,037 with an interest rate of one percent, plus a grant of the same amount. The 29 households to be serviced by the water line extension will repay the IJDC loan through MUB via a surcharge on their water bills. According to information provided by Ball, that surcharge will initially add \$58.17 each month per household, though it will be revisited annually to account for customers moving in or out of the service area.

FHWA REALLOCATES \$2.8 BILLION IN HIGHWAY FUNDS TO STATES

In a fiscal-year-end bonus, the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) has redistributed to the states \$2.8 billion in unused federal highway aid, which they can use to help fund road and bridge projects. FHWA's reallocation of unused highway obligation authority is an annual occurrence, taking place toward the Sept. 30 end of the federal fiscal year. Under the 2016 action, announced in an Aug. 31 FHWA notice, 49 states and the District of Columbia will share in the funds. West Virginia will receive \$40,430,410 in redistributed funds. Surrounding states will also receive funds including: Kentucky with \$68,770,992; Maryland with \$56,286,158; Ohio with \$119,968,778; Pennsylvania with \$123,354,177; and Virginia with \$90,000,000.

NATURAL GAS COMPANY PUTS \$1.5 MILLION TOWARD WV ROADWORK

Antero Resources is putting \$1.5 million toward repairs on a West Virginia road worn down by traffic from the industry's drilling and fracking operations. The state Division of Highways says the natural gas company will make the contribution for repairs to West Virginia Route 74 north of Pennsboro in Ritchie County. Work began this week on a \$3 million project to fix about 9 miles of State Route 74. The project includes paving and repairs that are expected to be finished by Nov. 18. Division of Highways spokeswoman Carrie Jones says the route is one of many in northern West Virginia that can't withstand the increased volume and weight of truck traffic for natural gas extraction operations. Antero is one of several companies using the route.

WVDOH CONSTRUCTION AND MATERIALS ISSUES?

AASHTO-AGC-ARTBA JOINT COMMITTEE URGES CONGRESS TO NOT SHORT CHANGE FAST ACT FUNDING

At the annual meeting of the AASHTO-AGC-ARTBA Joint Committee, two resolutions were approved addressing the need for action on highway and transit funding. The first called on Congress to complete action of a fiscal year 2017 appropriations bill for the U.S. Department of Transportation and not wait until well into calendar year 2017—as some members of Congress are currently proposing. Doing so would needlessly delay critical highway and public transportation investment increases and renew uncertainty about future federal-aid funding. Under the FAST Act highway funding is scheduled to increase by 2 percent next year. However, the inability of Congress to finalize any of the 12 appropriation bills for next year makes it likely that the increased funding will be delayed and puts into question whether the increase will ultimately be provided. The resolution also urges Congress to not adopt a \$2.2 billion rescission of unobligated highway contract authority as contained in the Senate passed bill. The resolution points out that this is a budget gimmick that impedes the flexibility of state departments of transportation to meet their individual infrastructure needs, and disrupts transportation planning and timely delivery of projects.

In a related issue, the Southeastern Association of State Highway and Transportation Officials (SASHTO) held its annual meeting August 27-31 at The Greenbrier Hotel. The meeting was hosted by the WV Department of Transportation and was attended by over 800 representatives in the 14-state SASHTO region. West Virginia hosted the meeting in 1977, 1991 and 2003. AGC and ARTBA held joint committee meetings with state and federal highway officials at SASHTO.
