TAX REFORM COMMITTEE DISCUSSES SALES AND USE TAXES; LEARNS STATE ROAD FUND REVENUES TO DROP \$20 MILLION IN 2016

The legislative committee on tax reform met Monday to continue its deliberations on West Virginia's tax structure to determine what changes can be made to make the state more competitive for business development. Monday's meeting focused on the state's consumer sales and use taxes, particularly on what products and services are taxed and what products are exempt from sales tax. Accounting, legal and other professional services are exempt from sales taxes. The committee was presented a list of specific exemptions that certain industries can apply. There was considerable discussion on CST on construction activities, particularly as it relates to time and material contracts versus lump sum bid. The committee also looked at what industries can perform construction contracts and be exempt from paying CST on materials incorporated in the project. The committee will continue to meet through the end of the year to study possible changes to the state's tax structure.

On a negative note, Mark Muchow, deputy revenue secretary for the State Tax Department, told legislators that State Road Fund revenues will drop \$20 million next year. The wholesale gas tax is based on the average wholesale price of gasoline from July 1 through October 31. Based on the current price of gas, Muchow projected that the current wholesale gas tax will drop 1.5 cent per gallon, effective January 1, 2016. This equates to about \$20 million. The wholesale gas tax dropped 1.1 cents per gallon January 1, 2015 which will cost the State Road Fund about \$15 million this year.

PREVAILING WAGE EMERGENCY RULE FILED

WorkForce West Virginia has filed an emergency rule related to changes made in the prevailing wage statute as outlined by Senate Bill 361. The rule filed defines the regions of the state to be used in the calculations and a procedure for those wishing to object to the methodology used to calculate rates. WorkForce West Virginia sent out 5,200 contractor and subcontractor surveys that will be used to set wage data for the state. As of this week, about 55 percent of those surveyed have responded. Today is the deadline for contractors to submit the survey. WorkForce will calculate the new wage rates and will submit them to the Secretary of State's office by September 30.

S.B. 361 exempts state funded projects \$500,000 and less from prevailing wage rates. Until new prevailing wage rates are determined, prevailing wage requirements on are hold on all state, and its political subdivisions, projects, regardless of the amount of the project.

DAVID NOHE RESIGNS FROM STATE SENATE

State Senator David Nohe (R-Wood), has resigned from his position with the West Virginia Legislature to accept an appointment to the West Virginia Parole Board. Nohe recently confirmed that he had accepted Gov. Earl Ray Tomblin's appointment to the parole board and tendered his resignation from the West Virginia Senate. Nohe will be filling the seat left vacant earlier this year when Jimmy Colombo resigned to be appointed as mayor of Parkersburg. The 3rd Senatorial District executive committee will make recommendations to the governor who will choose Nohe's replacement.

"I am honored and appreciative of Governor Tomblin's confidence in selecting me to serve the people of West Virginia in this new role as a member of the West Virginia Parole Board," Nohe said in a press release. "This will allow me to contribute to developing and adopting polices that are cost effective while holding offenders more accountable. I look forward to working with my fellow board members and supporting justice reinvestment to increase public safety in our state."

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INFRASTRUCTURE IMPROVEMENTS MAJOR TOPIC AT BUSINESS SUMMIT

The West Virginia Chamber of Commerce held its annual business summit this week at The Greenbrier. The condition of West Virginia's highways was front and center for much of the program. Gov. Earl Ray Tomblin opened his remarks with, "Trust me, I understand people's frustration about our highways. Hoppy Kercheval reminds me every day, FTDR, fix the damn roads." Gov. Tomblin noted he added \$82 million to repair potholes, slides, slips and other maintenance projects. He also noted the new expansion projects such as Route 35, widening of I-81 and the upcoming Corridor H project. "We must invest in our infrastructure to improve our quality of life and create jobs," the governor told the 800 business leaders gathered at this year's summit. "I have met with Senate President Bill Cole and Speaker Tim Armstead to look at what needs to be done to find a solution to our highway funding problems. We have to pave the way for increased opportunity around the state." The governor said now is the time for Congress to pass a long-term highway bill.

"Our roads are in deplorable condition," said Third District Congressman Evan Jenkins. "We must pass a long-term highway funding bill and all of your congressional delegation is absolutely committed to this effort," he told attendees. "It's an issue of safety and our economy." West Virginia's newest Senator said the Senate passed a six-year highway bill. "I will be encouraging my colleagues in the House to do the same," said Senator Shelley Moore Capito. "It is FTDR because of our deteriorating bridges, loss of jobs and our sagging economy. The way of the future is through good roads." The senator said she wanted to thank all the various groups that are working to educate people on the critical need of passing a long-term highway bill.

"We are all sick and tired of our infrastructure," stated Senator Joe Manchin. "America has always been about the future, the next big thing. We've got to ask ourselves what is our next thing." The senator related how the railroads lead to expansion of the nation. How the Panama Canal spanned the continents. How the interstate system created mobility. "America can be great again and infrastructure investment is the best way to do this," Sen. Manchin told the group. "It's the best way to create jobs and boost the economy. We have to get things moving again because we're lagging behind."

In response to a question during the Friday legislative panel, House Speaker Tim Armstead commented on highway funding during the 2016 legislative session. His comments are paraphrased in the following. "We all recognize quality of life and economic development are tied to highways. We have taken a close look at the Blue Ribbon Commission report and some of the recommendations will have a hard time being approved by the Legislature. The Legislature passed a bill to provide an audit of the West Virginia Division of Highways which will be completed December 31. This should help us develop a road map for future funding. We have a antiquated process of funding roads in this state. Basically we collect gas tax and registration fees but don't provide any general fund transfers to the road fund. I know contractors like have dedicated revenues into the State Fund but increasing DMV fees will be a tough sell. We might have to restructure the fees somehow.

"Everyone is committed to rolling up our sleeves and looking for solutions to the funding problem. I don't think you can raise a particular tax enough to get you what we need. It will have to be a combination of the things we've talked about. This includes shifting funds, giving cities and counties the ability to provide local share funding and savings and efficiencies in the WVDOH. This will truly be a priority in the 2016 legislative session."
