LEGISLATIVE INTERIMS REVIEW NUMBER OF CONSTRUCTION RELATED ISSUES

Lawmakers were in Charleston this week for their October interim meetings. A number of meetings dealt with issues relating to the construction industry. They include: Buy America Provisions, purchasing procedures, toll collection on the West Virginia Turnpike, and revenues for the state's General Fund. The Labor and Worker Safety Committee discussed the proposed Buy America Provision (BAP) for government construction contracts. Legal counsel for the committee told legislators that the BAP bill that has been introduced the past two years is more extensive than what is currently used in other states, the same position the CAWV has taken on the proposed legislation. Officials with the WV Division of Highways and School Building Authority of WV who served on the Buy American Task Force reported that the majority of the products included in their respective agencies' projects are made in America and that the proposed legislation would require additional bureaucracy without a guarantee that any more American made products would be used. One legislator noted that if state agencies have to hire additional employees to administer a BAP, this would be a "jobs creation" bill. The committee will continue to look at BAP legislation, as well as the 10-Hour OSHA requirement.

The Select Committee on Infrastructure discussed SCR 55, a proposal to do away with the Parkways Authority and making the WVDOH responsible for the maintenance and operation of the 88-mile WV Turnpike. The current bonds on the WV Turnpike will be paid off in 2019 and, if the roadway is in good shape, the WVDOH could take over responsibility. Bond counsel for the Parkways Authority told committee members that that's not feasible, since it would require breaking bond covenants and violating the Constitution. He said there's currently about \$54.8 million of principal on the 1989 bond issue to be paid off, and when the bonds were sold in 1989, and some refinanced in 2002, bond covenants mandated that the Parkways Authority would be an independent body that would operate and adequately maintain the Turnpike until the bonds are retired. The Governor's Blue Ribbon Commission has been reviewing options to allow tolls to continue on the Turnpike past 2019 and use the revenue to issue additional bonds for new construction projects.

State lawmakers reviewed sweeping purchasing reform proposals this week in response to recent audits of the state's use of federal stimulus funds to buy oversized routers and build microwave radio towers – part of a \$126 million high-speed internet expansion project in West Virginia. Last month, the Legislative Auditor released a report finding that state officials circumvented purchasing laws and ignored a directive to stop construction of a \$38 million microwave tower project designed to improve emergency communications. State Purchasing officials noted that there isn't a central agency that oversees grant funds. Legislators heard options to expand the state's bribery laws to hold high-ranking state administrators personally liable and to face bribery charges if they receive kickbacks on purchasing contracts. Comments were made regarding "contradictions" in laws that apply to contractors, engineers and contractors. The CAWV has worked for many years to provide clear and transparent laws when dealing with publicly-funded construction contracts. Sen. Herb Snyder, chairman of the Senate Government Organization Committee, told the CAWV Tuesday that the committee is not considering changes to construction bidding procedures.

The proposed state budget for next fiscal year received a lot of attention due to its negative projections. The FY 2015 budget, starting July 1, 2014, has a potential gap of a least \$265 million. By law, the state cannot have a budget deficit. Absent a surge in economic growth, which is not on the horizon, state leaders will have to cut spending, raise taxes or use a combination of both. The Governor has already asked state agencies to submit two budget plans; one holds the line on spending for the next fiscal year while the other reduces spending by 7.5 percent. If the Governor takes the cut, that will save about \$80 million.

The budget projections are problematic for future highway funding proposals. One of the recommendations that is expected to come from the Governor's Blue Ribbon Commission on Highways is to transfer the current 6 percent sales tax on car parts, tires, batteries, repair, etc. from the state's general fund to the State Road Fund. Projections put this revenue around \$25 million. If lawmakers are scrambling to replace \$265 million in general fund revenues, transferring \$25 million to the road fund will be difficult. Legislators will meet again for interims November 18-20.

CHARLES TRUMP SEEKS RETURN TO LEGISLATURE

Charles Trump, who served 14 years in the House of Delegates from 1992 to 2006, has announced he will run for the West Virginia Senate in the 15th District. This represents all or parts of Berkeley, Morgan, Hampshire and Mineral counties. The sitting Senator is Donald Cookman, who was appointed in 2013 by Governor Tomblin to replace Sen. Walt Helmick who won election as state Agriculture Commissioner. Trump served as House Minority Leader for eight years.

End of Daylight Savings

Early next Sunday morning, November 3rd, most of those in the United States will turn their clocks back one hour for the end of Daylight Saving Time. Most of us think: *“Fantastic! I get another hour of sleep”*; and yes you will. However, there is a huge difference between the “society clock” and the “biological clock” we all work from. During such time changes there is statistically an increase in safety incidents.

With the end of daylight savings time comes an increase of darkness around the time of rush hour, when traffic is at a peak and many are making our way home from work. Drivers aren't used to the decreased visibility – nor are construction workers, who might take chances crossing roads when they shouldn't.

The National Road Safety Foundation (NRSF) has done studies proving that auto accidents increase after the clocks fall back an hour. Besides the lack of visibility, the NRSF notes that commuting in the dark can also make drivers drowsier than usual. According to some health studies, changes in waking time coupled with the earlier onset of darkness throws off our internal clocks. This increases driving risks, primarily because in our 24/7 society, we have a fundamental problem of already being sleep deprived.

The end of daylight saving time can leave many feeling fatigued, which can pose safety risks both at home and in the workplace. Stay alert!

Safety professionals have long used the start and end of daylight saving time as reminders for performing recurring safety tasks. Use the occasion of setting your clocks back as a cue to:

- **Check and replace the batteries in your smoke and carbon monoxide (CO) alarms.** Ensure they are working properly and replace the batteries. As the cold sets in and many start up their gas-fired furnaces, fireplaces, portable unit heaters and the like for the first time, carbon monoxide poisoning risks increase dramatically during this time of year. Replace any smoke alarm unit that is older than 10 years.
- **Prepare a winter emergency kit for your automobile.** Such kits can be a lifesaver if you are stuck out in bad weather while driving. They should include items such as: warm clothes, blanket, flashlight, batteries, water, non-perishable snacks, shovel, flares, reflective hazard triangle, jumper cables, cat litter or sand for traction, ski hat and gloves.
- **Check to see if your fire extinguishers need recharging.** Check the small gauge at the top of the extinguisher. If the needle in that gauge is in the green, chances are, the extinguisher is okay. If it is in the red, you need to have the extinguisher recharged.

HELP IDENTIFY COST OF DOT DBE PROGRAM COMPLIANCE

The U.S. Department of Transportation (DOT) issued a 75-page proposal over a year ago describing 30 possible changes to the Disadvantaged Business Enterprise (DBE) program for federal-aid transportation projects. Based on comments received from AGC, ARTBA and AGC/ARTBA chapters and members, DOT has determined that this rulemaking is a “significant” rule and therefore a cost-benefit analysis is necessary before moving forward. The DOT has asked for the “specific, quantifiable costs and benefits” that would result from some of the proposed changes. To help generate this information, AGC and ARTBA are asking members to complete a short survey by October 25 although the deadline will likely be extended. ARTBA and the AGC submitted a joint request to the U.S. DOT requesting an extension to the deadline for comments on proposed changes to the DBE program. AGC and ARTBA will tabulate the confidential results and include them in new comments to the DOT. Take the survey [here](#).

DOH REQUESTS INPUT ON NEW ESTIMATE REPORT

The Contract Administration Division of the WVDOH has responded to a suggestion from the industry by developing a new report detailing adjustments on project Stockpiled Materials. A sample **Stockpiled Materials Adjustments Report** was provided to members by Deputy State Highway Engineer Todd Rumbaugh at an October 17 meeting of the CAWV Joint Construction Subcommittee and is attached to this week’s bulletin for your review. The report, as you will see, provides Item Number and Description, Adjustment Quantity, Unit Price and Adjustment Amount. The new report would be available for each job. INPUT NEEDED ON PROPOSED CHANGES TO SECTION 679--BRIDGE DECK OVERLAYS

A CAWV/WVDOH Task Force is requesting input from members on proposed changes to Section 679 of the WVDOH Standard Specifications. A draft for Section 679 is attached to this week’s bulletin for your review. CAWV Task Force Chairman John Farley, Triton Construction, specifically needs data to support an industry recommended revision to Section 679.6.2.3--Full Depth Removal. The industry has asked for a fairer means of payment for blow-outs associated with bridge deck removal and preparation for overlay. The DOH has proposed "...the Contractor will be required to fully repair such locations accounting for 15% of the deck area for the individual bridge deck being overlaid at no additional cost to the Division. The provision goes on to say the Contractor will be paid \$200 per square yard for each square in excess of the 15% threshold. The industry suggested that 15% is excessive and that a better average would be 3% for necessary full depth repairs. The CAWV needs actual project data from overlay projects to support the correct percentage. CORRIDOR H AUTHORITY PUSHES FOR 2020 FINISH

Members of the Robert C. Byrd Corridor H Highway Authority hope the results of a new economic impact study will be powerful enough to move the completion date of Corridor H from 2036 to 2020. According to the study, an early completion would generate \$1.25 billion in new revenue to the state. In addition to the base economic impact, the study found construction of the highway would add another \$800 million to the state's economy. The study was conducted by RQA Group and modeled after similar studies executed on behalf of highways throughout the 13-state Appalachian Regional Commission region. The study measures projected economic growth, savings on insurance and other safety-related costs as well as expenses and travel time-related savings that affect travelers. U.S. CHAMBER OF COMMERCE: RAISE GAS TAX TO FIX ROADS

The U.S. should raise federal gas taxes to help pay for major infrastructure needs, according to the U.S. Chamber of Commerce. A higher gasoline tax would be extremely unpopular in a country where almost 90% people drive to work. It's also not a favorite of either the Obama Administration or the Tea Party Republicans. But it's one of the few economic policy ideas that big business groups and big labor unions agree on. The last hike of 18.4 cents a gallon took place on Oct. 1, 1993. Currently, the tax raises about \$30 billion a year for the country's coffers, according to the Institute on Taxation and Economic Policy. In April, a Gallup poll found two-thirds of Americans opposed a hike in state gas taxes of up to 20 cents, even if it went to pay for infrastructure. Click [here](#) for the full article.

THREE STATE AIRPORTS GETTING \$8.9M IN FEDERAL FUNDS

Airports in Kanawha, Randolph and Wayne counties are getting a total of \$8.9 million in federal funding for improvements. Sens. Jay Rockefeller and Joe Manchin and Rep. Nick Rahall announced the Federal Aviation Administration grants Wednesday. The bulk of the money, \$7.6 million, will go to Yeager Airport in Charleston for runway improvements. Yeager also is getting \$200,000 and Huntington's airport is receiving \$250,000 to help implement sustainability plans. The airport in Elkins is getting just over \$1 million to rehabilitate taxiways and taxi lanes.

679.3.1.2 – Removal of Existing Deck Surface Phase II:

DELETE PARAGRAPH THREE FROM THE SUBSECTION.

INSERT THE FOLLOWING SUBSECTION INTO THE SECTION:

679.3.1.3 – Full Depth Removal Of Material: When full depth removal of material is necessary it shall be handled in accordance with section 679.6.2.3.

679.6.2.2: – (untitled section)

DELETE PARAGRAPH TWO FROM THE SUBSECTION.

INSERT THE FOLLOWING SUBSECTION INTO THE SECTION:

679.6.2.3 – Full Depth Removal: It is reasonably expected that full depth removal of material will be encountered on the project at various locations.

It is expected that the Contractor will be required to fully repair such locations accounting for 15% (fifteen percent) of the deck area for the individual bridge deck being overlaid at no additional cost to the Division.

When full depth repairs exceed 15% of the bridge deck area being overlaid, the Contractor shall be paid \$200 per square yard (SY) for each square in excess of the 15% described above.
