TRANSPORTATION DAY AT THE WEST VIRGINIA CAPITOL HIGHLIGHTS NEED FOR HIGHWAY INFRASTRUCTURE FUNDING

Over 200 members and highway supporters gathered at the State Capitol on Thursday, January 9, to call attention to and to fight for transportation funding in the Mountain State. The group all wore reflective vests making the message of "Roads = Jobs" visible to lawmakers. The day included a press conference at 10 a.m. where the findings were unveiled of a new study by TRIP – "West Virginia Transportation by the Numbers: Meeting the State's Need for Safe and Efficient Mobility." The study provides updated information on the condition of the state's roads and bridges and also shares data about the positive and negative impacts of proper funding of transportation infrastructure. Senate President Jeff Kessler, Senate Transportation Committee Chair Robert Beach, and House Transportation and Infrastructure Committee Chairwoman Margaret Stagers each spoke during the event.

Senate President Jeffrey Kessler said the need for improvements is at an emergency level and his idea to create a trust fund with a portion of natural gas industry taxes might eventually help. "It is the future of the state to make sure we have adequate roads and infrastructure."

"We need economic development and that starts with highways," Senate Transportation Chairman Bob Beach, D-Monongalia, told the group. He said the Governor's Blue Ribbon Commission on Highways has proposed innovative ways to fund road construction and maintenance, but warned, "There are other legislators in this building who will oppose those ideas... You need to get those legislators -- you need to hold their feet to the fire."

House Roads and Transportation Chairwoman Margaret Stagers, D-Fayette, told the rally, "The one true function of our government is the building and maintenance of transportation and infrastructure."

GOVERNOR'S STATE OF STATE OUTLINES SUCCESSES AND FINANCIAL CONCERNS

Governor Earl Ray Tomblin delivered the annual State of the State address Wednesday night at the State Capitol. He talked about recent economic development successes, including the cracker plant planned for Wood County which could mean 10,000 construction jobs, the Carboonyx plant in Jackson County and the Sogefi Group expansion in Wayne County. The majority of his address talked about West Virginia's challenging financial condition.

The governor's proposed budget uses a creative combination of cuts and one-time dollars, including a dip into the state's Rainy Day fund, to fill a \$265 million projected gap and balance the \$4.7 billion budget for fiscal year 2015. State Tax and Revenue Secretary Bob Kiss called the budget "austere" during a budget briefing earlier in the day. "The next couple of years going forward are going to be tight," said Kiss, who added the state isn't projecting budget surplus until 2018 and 2019. The increasing costs of social service programs are causing the biggest challenges in the budget. Medicaid will cost the state nearly \$663 million next year, an increase of \$87 million. All of social service spending is increasing \$127 million to \$1.2 billion.

The governor proposes sweeping various state accounts for more than \$60 million and reducing state spending by \$70 million to cover most of the remaining shortfall. Another \$70 million in savings comes from budget cuts. Most state agencies will see cuts of 7.5 percent. Higher education will be cut by 3.75 percent. The budget does propose a 2 percent pay raise for school teachers and service workers, along with a \$504 raise for state employees.

Governor Tomblin said the economic development projects, combined with the development of the Marcellus Shale and prospects for value added products, demonstrate the state is moving forward. "As we celebrate these new investments, there are other types of investments we often take for granted: investments in water and sewer infrastructure, schools, airports, rail, intermodal facilities and broadband," he said. "Used by all of us, roads and bridges are one of the biggest investments and they come at a cost." The governor did not make any reference to the activities of the Blue Ribbon Commission on Highways or possible funding mechanisms. He did refer to legislation passed last year by saying, "This Legislature, in a bipartisan fashion, had the wisdom and foresight to enact two pieces of legislation last year that are already paying off for our State Road Fund. The continuation of the Design-Build and the Public-Private-Partnerships is allowing the Division of Highways to be more innovative in the construction of our roads and bridges."

ACCIDENT FACTORS

Accidents on construction projects cause many painful injuries and claim far too many lives. Our primary concern when we discuss the factors or causes behind an accident is to find a way to prevent a recurrence. The cause of an accident can be found in two areas -- **Unsafe Acts and Unsafe Conditions**.

As a construction worker you control the first cause, **Unsafe Acts**. For example: a worker uses equipment that is defective or damaged, or they may use good equipment in a careless or other unsafe manner. Other examples of unsafe acts include disregarding posted warning signs, failure to wear a hard hat, smoking near flammables or explosives, working too close to power lines, handling chemicals or other hazardous materials improperly, putting your body or any part of it onto or into shafts or openings and lifting material incorrectly.

The second accident factor or cause is **Unsafe Conditions** which can be found on many construction sites. Examples include inadequate or improperly installed guard rails or a lack of any guarding at all which most certainly will lead to an accident. Insufficient illumination, poor ventilation, electrical grounding requirements not observed, too few fire extinguishers available, containers that are not labelled, careless disposal of waste or excess material -- these are just a few of many unsafe conditions that may be caused by co-workers, subcontractors, or the general contractor.

You can make a difference by taking the time to perform your work safely and reporting any unsafe condition you discover to your supervisor immediately.

When the cause behind the accident is found, you'll find that safety on the job plays a major part in preventing that accident from occurring again. If everyone on the job cooperates, injury and death statistics will be reduced and it will be much safer for you to do your job.

Don't view any accident as just a "thing" that happens in the construction business. Here are seven key topics to focus on when an accident, regardless of how minor it might be, takes place:

1. Learn the cause - Not the fault.
2. Find the solution - Eliminate it from happening again.
3. Involve the work force in the learning the cause and finding a solution.
4. Tell all employees - Share the results of your investigation.
5. Inspect for compliance of the solution with supervisors and employees.
6. Demand that everyone take responsibility for complying with the solution.
7. Expect positive results
