## HOUSE PASSES BUY AMERICAN BILL; FIGHT GOES TO SENATE

After the narrow 12-11 passage of [H.B. 4168](#) in the House Finance Committee last Friday, the House of Delegates Wednesday passed the Buy American bill by a vote of 90-7. Many delegates opposed the legislation but did not want to go on the board as voting “against America.” As such, the CAWV did not contest the bill on the House floor. The fight now goes to the Senate and to the committee to which the bill has been referred, Government Organization. Delegates speaking in favor of H.B. 4168 spoke of the jobs that will be created if the bill passes. However, they spoke of “jobs in America” and “jobs in manufacturing.” Very little mention was made of the West Virginia construction worker jobs and West Virginia supply company jobs that would be lost with the bill’s passage. Opponents did mention that the bill allows for products to be up to 10% higher if made in America and that this added cost to all public construction projects would result in less school, highway and water and sewer construction.

The business community did score a victory this week with the defeat of [H.B. 4001](#), the False Claims Act bill. On Tuesday, the House of Delegates voted down the bill which allows whistleblowers to bring lawsuits against companies that are allegedly defrauding state- and federal-run programs such as Medicaid and construction contracts. Ten Democrats joined all Republicans in creating a 55-42 defeat for the bill. In a press release following the vote, Speaker Tim Miley, D-Harrison, stated, “I am disappointed that this effort to reduce fraud on the government was rejected by a majority in the House of Delegates. Every member claims to come to Charleston with the goal of eliminating fraud and waste and to protecting taxpayer funds, yet that was not evident in the vote (Tuesday). Chris Hamilton, chairman of the WV Business and Industry Council, and Steve Roberts, president of the WV Chamber of Commerce, issued a press release stating, “On behalf of West Virginia’s businesses community, we appreciate the clear and progressing thinking a majority of the House of Delegates undertook in evaluating this bill and the potential negative impact it could have had on the State. We are particularly pleased with the bi-partisan rejection of this legislation. We thank those legislators on both sides of the aisle who took the time to listen to our concerns and did the right thing by voting against it.”

CAWV members need to start contacting their Senators first thing Monday morning on H.B. 4168. **Since Monday starts the final week of this legislative session, the CAWV Legislative Bulletin is being sent to members today, Friday, February, 28.** Please review to see up-to-the-minute news on the issues affecting West Virginia’s contracting industry and CAWV members.

This is the last week of the 2014 legislative session. It ends at midnight on Saturday, March 8. Legislative committees will be working to get all bills out of committee by Thursday so they can be read three separate days. The House will not vote to suspend this rule so any bill that doesn’t get out of a House committee by Thursday is probably dead for this session. The Senate usually votes to suspend the rules so bills can be debated in committee through Saturday.

### **ENCOURAGE YOUR ELECTED OFFICIALS TO SUPPORT THE SAVE AMERICAN WORKERS ACT**

The U.S. House could vote as early as next week on H.R. 2575, the Save American Workers Act, which would repeal the 30-hour definition of "full-time employment" in the Affordable Care Act (ACA) by replacing it with the more traditional 40-hour definition. AGC is encouraging Congress to pass H.R. 2575 and urges members to use the Legislative Action Center to send a letter to their elected officials in support of the legislation.

Earlier this month, AGC sent a [letter](#) prior to consideration by the Ways and Means Committee in support of the legislation and highlighted the fact that the construction industry is typically project-based, transitory and seasonal, which distinguishes it from other professional industries with more predictable hours. As a result, many construction employers rely on part-time, seasonal and variable-hour employees. The construction industry also consists of many smaller employers with limited human resource and administrative staff. These two issues alone add layers of difficulty for a construction firm that is required to use the complex formulas in the ACA to determine whether or not it is considered a large employer under the law.

AGC also stressed that, despite the one-year delay of the reporting and enforcement provisions of the ACA, the law continues to add layers of administrative burdens for employers, while some regulations have still yet to be issued. Replacing the definition of a full-time employee to the more commonly accepted 40 hours per week will, at the very least, reduce some of the complexity associated with the ACA.

## House Panel to Vote on Prohibiting Reverse Auctions for Construction

On March 5, the U.S. House of Representatives Small Business Committee will mark up and vote on the [Common Sense Construction Contracting Act of 2013, H.R. 2751](#), introduced by Representative Richard Hanna (R-N.Y.), that would essentially prohibit federal agencies from procuring construction services through reverse auctions. [Please take action](#) and urge your members of Congress to support H.R. 2751 by clicking the link below to go to AGC's Legislative Action Center.

The bill was introduced shortly after AGC's [May 2013 testimony](#) before the House Small Business Committee on the need for this legislation. [AGC also testified](#) before a joint House Veterans Affairs and House Small Business Committee hearing on the need to prohibit procurement of construction services through reverse auctions in December 2013. Several agencies, including the [Department of Veterans Affairs](#) and [Department of the Interior](#), are using reverse auctions to procure construction services for full-range construction projects, including million dollar building renovations, national park road construction, and material supply and delivery. In addition, the [General Services Administration](#) launched its own web-based reverse auction platform—which includes the option of procuring construction services—for federal agency use last year.

## **PPE AND CONTACT LENSES**

At one time contact lenses were thought to be a danger in many work environments and while doing many tasks. Current safety thinking about contact lenses is this: Contacts are safe for use in all work environments, providing other appropriate eye protection is also used. They have even been approved for use with a respirator.

The problems which give contact lenses a bad name at work have usually turned out to be the result of over-use and failure to use protective safety eyewear.

Contacts should not be worn in any situation where they might absorb chemical vapors or trap dust. If you wear contact lenses, these tips are for you:

- Appropriate eye protection must be worn along with the contacts. Contact lenses and street eyewear are no substitute for the correct safety glasses or goggles.
- The worker should consider telling the first aid crew he wears contacts in case of an eye injury. Wallet cards identifying contact lens wearers are also a good idea.
- Bring your contact lens care kit to work in case a lens needs to be removed and cleaned. Keep an extra kit in your locker just in case.
- Keep extra set of eyeglasses at work in case the contacts have to come out because of dust in the eye or other problems.
- Follow the care program recommended by the lens provider. Smudged and dirty contacts can impair vision and lead to eye irritation and infection.
- Over wearing can cause excessive drying, leading to ulceration of the eye cornea.
- In case of a chemical splash in the eye, begin flushing the eye with water immediately and continue for 20 minutes. The lens may be washed away in this process, or a first-aid-er may be able to take them out while flushing continues. Call for medical help immediately.
- Sometimes an impact will knock a contact lens away from the cornea at the front of the eye and send it under an eyelid. If flushing with a clean saline solution does not work, see an eye specialist.

Fighter pilots in the Persian Gulf War found contact lenses worked better with their respirators and goggles than eyeglasses did. Their experience contributed to the new thinking about contact lenses in the workplace.
