## **WEST VIRGINIANS FOR BETTER TRANSPORTATION TO HIGHLIGHT ROUGH ROAD CONDITIONS, CALL FOR STATE'S ROADS TO BE IMPROVED NOW**

West Virginians for Better Transportation (WVBT) will be hitting the airwaves next week to highlight the rough road conditions and greater challenges facing our state transportation network, which have become much worse due to this winter's harsh weather and extreme cold spells. WVBT will be doing media activities on Monday, April 28 and Tuesday, April 29. Joe Deneault, WVBT's past Chairman, will be talking with TV and radio stations across the state, including TalkLine with Hoppy Kercheval on Monday, April 28, at 10:30 a.m. Deneault will be highlighting the fact that this past winter weather has only worsened already bad road conditions, produced more road slips and caused rock slides.

"This past winter was very tough on the state's roadways, causing more potholes and rough surface conditions for motorists across the mountain state," said Carol Fulks, WVBT's Chairperson. She noted that driving on the rough roads cost West Virginia motorists a total of \$400 million annually in extra vehicle operating costs, which costs the average West Virginia driver \$333 a year. Costs include accelerated vehicle depreciation, unexpected expense repair costs, greater tire wear, not to mention blown tires, damaged wheel rims, new brakes, worn out shocks, front-end alignments, increase fuel consumption and aggravation.

West Virginia is one of only four states in which there is no county and/or township ownership of highways. As a result, the W.Va. Division of Highways has the responsibility for the construction, improvement and maintenance of nearly all public highway miles. The DOH has said inflation and stagnant resources are making it increasingly problematic to keep with up with needed maintenance and construction projects.

## **WEST VIRGINIA'S CONSTRUCTION EMPLOYMENT HAD HIGHEST PERCENTAGE DECLINE FROM ONE YEAR AGO FOR THIRD STRAIGHT MONTH**

Construction firms added jobs in 38 states between March 2013 and March 2014, according to an analysis by the AGC of America of U.S. Labor Department data. Unfortunately, West Virginia had the highest percentage decline in construction employment during that period, ranking the state 51 out of 50 states and the District of Columbia. In March 2013, 34,700 were employed in

the construction industry in West Virginia. In March 2014, the number is 33,000, a 4.9% reduction. This puts West Virginia with the highest percentage decline, followed by New Jersey (-3.4 percent, -4,600 jobs); District of Columbia (-2.9 percent, -400 jobs); Vermont (-2.8 percent, -400 jobs) and Kentucky (-2.8 percent, -1,900 jobs). **CONSTRUCTION UP 42 PERCENT THROUGH FEBRUARY**

Contracts for future construction in West Virginia in March 2014 were up 125 percent from March 2013, \$133 million in 2014 versus \$59 million in 2013. Nonbuilding construction experienced the largest boost, from \$8 million in March 2013 to \$43 million in March 2014. Nonbuilding construction includes roads, bridges, water and sewer facilities, dams and airports. Nonresidential construction was up 204 percent from \$19 million in March 2013 to \$60 million in March 2014. Residential construction was down 2 percent, from \$30 million in March 2013 to \$29 million in March 2014.

**WVDOH, FHWA, CAWV TO PROMOTE WORK ZONE SAFETY - APRIL 30**

The annual press conference to promote work zone safety will be held Wednesday, April 30, outside the WVDOH headquarters at the State Capitol. A recent study by the AGC showed that forty-five percent of highway contractors had motor vehicles crash into their construction work zones during the past year. The study also supported what the Federal statistics show that work zone crashes are more likely to kill vehicle operators and passengers than construction workers. However, more than 20 percent of work zone crashes injure construction workers, and 6 percent of those crashes kill them. Details from the press conference will appear in the May 2 newsletter.

## EYE INJURIES

Every day an estimated 1,000 eye injuries occur in American workplaces. No matter where we work, flying particles, dusts, splashes or flying objects are apt to expose us to potential eye injury. Fortunately, we can protect against these hazards by using the appropriate protective eyewear for our jobs.

A survey by the Labor Department's Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS) of about 1,000 minor eye injuries reveals how and why many on-the-job accidents occur:

- Not wearing eye protection. BLS reports that nearly three out of every five workers injured were not wearing eye protection at the time of the accident.
- Wearing the wrong kind of eye protection for the job. About 40 of the injured workers were wearing some form of eye protection when the accident occurred. These workers were most likely to be wearing eyeglasses with no side shields, though injuries among employees wearing full-cup or flat-fold side shields occurred, as well.

### What Causes Eye Injuries?

- Flying particles. BLS found that almost 70% of the accidents studied resulted from flying or falling objects or sparks striking the eye. Injured workers estimated that nearly three-fifths of the objects were smaller than a pin head. Most of the particles were said to be traveling faster than a hand-thrown object when the accident occurred.
- Contact with chemicals caused one-fifth of the injuries.
- Other accidents were caused by objects swinging from a fixed or attached position, like tree limbs, ropes, chains, or tools which were pulled into the eye while the worker was using them.

The BLS reported that more than 50% of workers injured while wearing eye protection thought the eyewear had minimized their injuries. But nearly half the workers also felt that another type of protection could have better prevented or reduced the injuries they suffered. It is estimated that 90% of eye injuries can be prevented through the use of proper protective eyewear. There are several types of eye protection and it's important you wear the right protection for the task.

## **TO COMBAT HIGH AMMONIA LEVELS, WINFIELD SEEKING NEW SEWER PLANT**

Winfield Mayor Randy Barrett says his city is planning a new sewer plant after more than a decade of its current facility dumping water with too much ammonia into the Kanawha River. Yogesh Patel, assistant director at the state Department of Environmental Protection's Division of Water and Wastewater Management, said Winfield has been struggling to meet acceptable ammonia levels since around 2001. Patel said being in violation can mean a maximum \$25,000 daily fine. Last month, the city applied to the state Infrastructure and Jobs Development Council, which recommended seeking a roughly \$7.5 million, 30-year loan from the DEP, said Jefferson Brady. Brady, engineering manager for the Clean Water State Revolving Fund Program, which uses state and federal funds, said the loan would have a 0.5 percent annual interest rate and a 0.5 percent annual administration fee. He said the loan and its terms aren't set in stone until the project finishes an approval process. That requires finishing the design, which Barrett said won't be complete for about nine months. The mayor said he hopes to break ground in 2016 on the sewer plant.

## **OBAMA TO PRESENT CONGRESS WITH PROPOSED TRANSPORTATION REAUTHORIZATION BILL**

President Barack Obama is preparing to present his proposed \$302 billion, four-year transportation reauthorization bill to Congress. Transportation Secretary Anthony Foxx announced on the DOT's Fast Lane blog that the president plans to send a draft of the legislation to lawmakers, though no specific timetable has been presented.

"This bill will support millions of American jobs repairing and modernizing our roads, bridges, railways, and transit systems," he continued. "And it will pave the way forward by increasing access to the ladders of opportunity that help Americans get ahead."

Foxx previously noted that he thinks President Obama's proposal could solve transportation funding problems, including the nearly-insolvent Highway Trust Fund (HTF), which could run out of money by the end of August. The DOT chief has pointed out that an insolvent HTF would delay or halt projects in every state, costing hundreds of jobs. However, recent data from the Congressional Budget Office (CBO) show that the HTF, which is funded by an 18.4-cent-per gallon gas tax that has remained unchanged for 20 years, would still go bankrupt under the president's proposed budget.

Both the House and Senate are also working on solutions. Earlier this month, the House GOP introduced its \$1.014 trillion budget, which aims to maintain HTF solvency, while four top transportation senators have unveiled Senate priorities for a new surface transportation bill.

## **AML COMMITTEE MEETS WITH AGENCY REPRESENTATIVES**

The CAWV AML Committee met on Thursday, April 24, at the CAWV Headquarters with Rob Rice, chief of the Office of Abandoned Mine Lands Reclamation, and Mike Sheehan, environmental program manager for the Special Reclamation Division. Mr. Rice gave attendees an update on the recent announcement by the Office of Surface Mining that drinking water projects using AML funds will have to meet new criteria in order to get funding. The OSM has not provided any guidance to date on what will be required, but the issue has already stalled a few drinking water projects. Mr. Rice also reported that the AML program has \$16 million to fund projects this year but that number could change depending on what happens with the drinking

water projects that AML has committed funds to. He added that his department expects to receive around \$35 million a year for the next several years for project funding. CAWV AML Committee Chairman Rod Clay, Green Mountain Company, noted "I really appreciate the working relationship we have with the Rob Rice and the AML program. We have been able to work through many issues over the years by bringing the agency management and CAWV members together and I am sure that relationship will continue as long as the program operates."

In other business, Mr. Sheehan reported that the Special Reclamation Division has 47 projects that must be completed by the end of 2015. He noted that his department has \$76 million for land projects and will be seeking design help from design consultants in the coming months to get projects ready for bid.
