## **GOVERNOR TOMBLIN ANNOUNCES TENTH CONSECUTIVE REDUCTION IN WORKERS' COMP RATES - WEST VIRGINIA EMPLOYERS TO SAVE \$32 MILLION THIS YEAR**

Gov. Earl Ray Tomblin Thursday announced West Virginia employers will see a projected \$32 million in workers' compensation premium reductions in the coming year, and have seen a savings of more than \$280 million since the program was privatized in 2005. This week, the National Council on Compensation Insurance (NCCI) filed a proposed reduction in workers' compensation loss cost rates with the Offices of the West Virginia Insurance Commissioner - the tenth consecutive reduction in 10 years.

"We've worked hard in West Virginia to create a business climate that encourages companies to innovate, expand and create new jobs," Gov. Tomblin said. "With this rate reduction, our businesses are reaping the rewards of both lower taxes and lower workers' compensation insurance premiums. The new rates are an excellent sign that our state continues to move in the right direction for continued job growth."

NCCI, West Virginia's rating agent, has proposed an overall 9.1 percent loss cost rate decrease with the West Virginia Insurance Commissioner. The new loss cost rate is effective November 1, 2014. This reduction serves as the tenth consecutive decrease in loss costs since privatization and accounts for a cumulative decrease of 58.7 percent from pre-reform levels. However, each classification will be individually rated so CAWV members will need to talk with their workers' compensation provider to see what changes apply.

The CAWV BrickStreet workers' compensation program has over 100 members in the plan. These members are getting an 8 percent reduction in their workers' comp premium by being part of the CAWV plan. Any member wishing information on the CAWV BrickStreet plan can contact their insurance provider.

## **ARE YOUR EMPLOYEES TRAINED ON YOUR DRUG AND ALCOHOL TESTING POLICY**

Recently the CAWV has been made aware that some contracts may contain language that is more restrictive and requires the contractor to meet standards that are not required by the Alcohol and Drug Free Workplace Act, West Virginia Code 21-1D. The current law requires contractors to have a written Drug and Alcohol Policy if they work on public improvement projects and conduct pre-employment and random drug screenings for all full time employees. The law also requires that a contractor provide, within six weeks of new employment, at least two hours of drug-free workplace employee education for all employees, and annually thereafter. The employee education shall include all of the following:

- (A)** Detailed information about the content of the contractor's specific drug-free workplace policy and an opportunity for employees to ask questions regarding the policy;
- (B)** The distribution of a hard copy of the written drug-free workplace policy including collecting an employee signed acknowledgment receipt from each employee;

(C) Specific explanation of the basics of drugs and alcohol abuse including, but not limited to, the disease model, signs and symptoms associated with substance abuse, and the effects and dangers of drugs or alcohol in the workplace; and

(D) A list of community resources where employees may seek assistance for themselves or their families.

Also it is required that a contractor provide at least two hours of drug-free workplace supervisor training for all supervisory employees, and annually thereafter. The supervisor training shall include all of the following:

(A) How to recognize a possible drug or alcohol problem;

(B) How to document behaviors that demonstrate a drug or alcohol problem;

(C) How to confront employees with the problem from observed behaviors;

(D) How to initiate reasonable suspicion and post-accident testing;

(E) How to handle the procedures associated with random testing;

(F) How to make an appropriate referral for assessment and assistance;

(G) How to follow up with employees returning to work after a positive test; and

(H) How to handle drug-free workplace responsibilities in a manner that is consistent with the applicable sections of any pertinent collective bargaining agreements.

### **VENDORS AND AGENCIES ADAPTING TO wvOASIS**

The West Virginia Enterprise Resource Planning (ERP) Board announced last week the third phase of the state's ERP project went live on July 8. With the implementation of Phase C, the new wvOASIS Financial, Procurement and Treasury applications will provide enhanced vendor opportunities through online registration and bidding. State agencies are coming out of a week-long blackout period in which no invoices or payments could be processed as the state transitions into the first phase of wvOASIS.

Contractors and other vendors may be experiencing some delays receiving estimate payments as state agencies adapt to the new software, and as the Auditor's Office deals with a backlog of invoices. The CAWV has heard from members working on WVDOH, WVDEP, Corrections, Higher Education, Purchasing and other state agency projects. Comments range from short or no delays in payments, to not receiving any payments after the blackout period.

### **STATE'S RURAL ROADS IN POOR CONDITION**

West Virginia's rural roads are now ranked one of the worst in the nation, according to study released July 10 by The Road Information Program (TRIP), a nonprofit organization devoted to improving the nation's highways. It found that 33 percent of West Virginia's rural roads are in poor condition – tied with Rhode Island for second worst in the United States, behind Connecticut. West Virginia also has the third-highest rural road fatality rate in the country, with 2.8 traffic accident fatalities per 100 million miles traveled. That ranks behind just South Carolina and Florida, and is nearly three times higher than the fatality rate for all other state roads, according to the report.

In a press release by TRIP, Carol Fulks, chairwoman of West Virginians for Better Transportation, stated, "A modern, well-maintained West Virginia transportation system is of vital importance to the state's economy, particularly in helping to preserve jobs of so many industries and drive new opportunities. However, long-term funding plans – on the federal and state levels – are needed to address the current problems and to meet future expansion projects."

A number of TV, radio and newspaper outlets covered the TRIP survey and reached out to the CAWV and CAWV members to talk about the funding problems affecting the state's transportation system. # Safety bulletin

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July 25, 2014

## **PREPARE FOR WEATHER RELATED SAFETY CONCERNS**

Weather related injuries and deaths, on construction projects are not as uncommon as we think.

Thinking of the “what ifs” can go a long way in eliminating these kinds of preventable incidents.

**SECURE all materials** and tools daily to prevent them from being blown away. Bad weather can come up in a short time, with little notice to react. Remember....we have an obligation to protect the public as well as other persons who might frequent the project, even after hours, on weekends and holidays.

**Keep up with the jobsite housekeeping.** Housekeeping is not an exciting topic, but keeping trash and debris picked up can save someone from injury. Especially, when a storm kicks up and things start blowing around. Many employee injuries occur during the moments just before a storm, trying to make things secure. It's normally too late to react to an incoming storm after it begins to show signs of hitting your location.

**Don't allow employees to stay outdoors in a lightning storm.** Most storm threats are short lived and work can proceed within an hour. Don't take a chance with lightening!

**Use ground fault circuit interrupters (GFCI)** protection on all electrical power tools. Wet ground after a storm is an invitation for serious problems. Make sure GFCI's are always in use, regardless of weather conditions.

**Drop the boom** of the cranes to a 45-degree angle and turn them away from prevailing winds. Land the load on all cranes. Don't leave tool boxes, gas cylinders, welding machines and compressors hanging on the hook. A strong wind storm can tip the crane over.

Prevent injury to employees, by thinking ahead. Check the weather forecast for your location prior to starting your shift each day and prepare the jobsite.

**Have a plan for employees to take shelter.** Teach employees where the safe location is at the project site, in the event of severe weather, wind and tornado.

## **CAVV HIGHWAY DIVISION MEMBERS MEET WITH CONGRESSMAN MCKINLEY**

CAVV contractor and supplier members met July 19 in Parkersburg with Congressman David McKinley, R-WV, to express their concerns over the federal highway trust fund running out of money next month unless lawmakers act. Rep. McKinley says he's glad the House passed an extension of the HTF through May 2015 and he's hoping the Senate will consider the bill quickly and get it to the President for his signature. The First District Congressman said passage of the highway bill was important in two respects. "One, it protects our jobs, keeps things going," he told members. "And secondly, we did it without any tax hike. Everyone's struggling to balance their purses, pocketbooks and checkbooks. This is not the time to be raising taxes on people," he said.

The congressman, who has been in construction for nearly 40 years, asked CAVV members how they would propose finding additional funding. All members stated that increasing the federal gas tax, which hasn't been raised since 1993, would keep the "user fee" concept and provide a quick infusion of much needed dollars. Other funding measures – mileage tax, repatriation, tolling -- could be pursued but action needs to be taken immediately to shore up the trust fund, members told the Congressman. Members also discussed the U.S. EPA's proposed rules on navigable waters and the impact this would have on future highway development. The CAVV thanked the Congressman for his work to keep EPA from declaring fly ash a hazardous material. "Construction costs would escalate greatly if we can't use fly ash in concrete, for fill and for other purposes," Rep. McKinley stated.

## **GREG BAILEY NAMED WVDOH STATE HIGHWAY ENGINEER**

Gregory (Greg) L. Bailey, P. E. has been appointed to the position of State Highway Engineer for the West Virginia Department of Transportation, Division of Highways. He served as the Deputy State Highway Engineer—Programming and Planning -- from May 2014 and had been serving as acting highway engineer until being named State Highway Engineer. Mr. Bailey served as the Director of Engineering Division from 2005 until taking the Deputy State Highway Engineer. Prior to that he served as the Consultant Review Section Head for the Engineering Division and was responsible for managing the work performed by consulting engineering firms during the development of contract plans and design reports on WVDOH projects. Mr. Bailey previously served as the Section Head for the Technical Section of the Engineering Division. He worked in the Consultant Review Section of the Structures Division prior to moving to the Technical Section.

He is a former City Engineer/Public Works Director for the City of Charleston, WV. He received his B.S. in Civil Engineering from West Virginia Tech in 1977 and his M.S. in Civil Engineering from Virginia Tech in 1981. The CAVV welcomes Greg to his new position and looks forward to working with him in this new capacity.

## **SENATE TO VOTE ON HIGHWAY TRUST FUND EXTENSION NEXT WEEK**

On Wednesday, Senate leaders reached agreement on how to proceed with consideration of the short-term highway and transit extension bill, which passed the House last week. The agreement reached by Senate Majority Harry Reid (D-Nev.) and Minority Leader Mitch McConnell (R-Ky.) would allow for the consideration of four amendments each requiring 60 votes to pass. If the amendments do not receive the required 60 votes, the Senate would then vote on clearing the House-passed measure as-is, which would provide an \$11 billion transfer to



the Highway Trust Fund and an extension of the current transportation authorization (MAP-21) – through May 31, 2015.

Two of the amendments are of particular interest to AGC and ARTBA. The first of these is a bipartisan amendment by Senators Tom Carper (D-Del.), Bob Corker (R-Tenn.), and Barbara Boxer (D-Calif.) that would scale back the extension from May 31, 2015 to Dec. 31, 2014, and cut the Highway Trust Fund offset by \$3 billion. The intent of this amendment is to force Congress to deal with finding long-term revenue for the trust fund in the post-November election lame duck session of Congress. AGC and ARTBA support the intent of the amendment and are working with the offices of the three Senators to build additional support. Both organizations have consistently called for Congress to address the long-term revenue in the lame duck and they encourage all Senators to support the Carper-Corker-Boxer amendment. The second amendment, proposed by Senator Mike Lee (R-Utah) – known as “Devolution” – would eventually reduce the gas tax to 3.7 cents, forcing every state to either raise funding for their transportation programs elsewhere or make drastic cuts to replace the federal investments. AGC and ARTBA are actively opposing the Lee amendment.

If the Senate passes any of the amendments, included the two detailed above, the bill would then go back to the House where they can either take a vote on the Senate bill or try to work with the Senate to iron out differences between the two bills. With time running out before the August Congressional recess, it is still uncertain as to exactly when next week this will be resolved. However, AGC and ARTBA want the extension to pass before Congress breaks for their August recess and they continue to work with members of the Senate and House to ensure that outcome.
