WV TRANSPORTATION & INFRASTRUCTURE SUMMIT TO FEATURE TOP OFFICIALS

A statewide transportation summit will be held in Charleston on July 14 at The Culture Center, Capitol Complex, from 9:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. and will feature the new U.S. Transportation Secretary, Anthony Foxx. The summit is being organized by the Discover The Real West Virginia Foundation, in conjunction with U.S. Senator Jay Rockefeller. Rep. Nick Rahall will be a keynote speaker and Sen. Joe Manchin has been invited to speak. Topics include “Preparing West Virginia’s Infrastructure for the 21st Century,” “Innovative Financing – Public Private Partnerships,” and airport development. “A generation ago, the United States invested heavily to create one of the world’s best transportation infrastructure networks. But today, real investment is stagnating and much of our nation’s infrastructure is both outdated and deteriorating,” the summit flyer notes.

The summit’s goal is “to explore innovative ideas for growing our transportation infrastructure to prepare West Virginia’s infrastructure for the challenges and demands of the 21st Century, and allow for continued growth and job creation for thousands of West Virginians.”

Registration is \$75.00 per person and will close on July 10 or when maximum capacity is met. The CAWV is a co-sponsor of the transportation summit. Others include E.L. Robinson Engineering and West Virginians for Better Transportation.

McGraw Hill Construction Data Through May

McGraw Hill Construction reports that May contracts for future construction in West Virginia are down 64 percent compared to May 2013, \$61.9 million in 2014 versus \$173.6 million in 2013. Nonresidential construction was down 76 percent, \$4.9 million this year versus \$20 million last year. Nonbuilding construction decreased 76 percent from \$116.2 million in May 2013 to \$27.6 million in May 2014. Nonbuilding construction includes roads, bridges, water and sewer facilities, dams and airports. Residential construction is down 22 percent, \$37.4 million in 2013 versus \$29.6 million in 2014.

These numbers reflect the trend West Virginia is experiencing in construction employment. As noted in the June 27 CAWV Newsletter, West Virginia again leads all states in shedding jobs during a twelve month period by losing the highest percentage of construction jobs, a 6.3 percent drop, 2,200 jobs. For the months of January through March 2014, West Virginia ranked 51 out of 50 states and the District of Columbia in the percentage of lost construction jobs in a year over year basis, according to an analysis of federal Bureau of Labor Statistics data by the Associated General Contractors (AGC) of America. In April, the state inched up to 49 but is now 51 for the month of May. In May 2013, 34,900 West Virginians were employed in the construction industry. In May 2014, that figure declined 6.3 percent to 32,700 jobs.

McGraw-Hill Construction provides the following totals for year-to-date construction activity in West Virginia through May 2014.

NEW SCHOOL BUILDING AUTHORITY EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR NAMED

The new executive director of the state School Building Authority is David Sneed, the SBA's former chief of architectural services who served from 1990 until 2012. Governor Earl Ray Tomblin announced Sneed's appointment on Monday. "David is no stranger to West Virginia's School Building Authority and played a key role in developing a number of planning mechanisms currently used by educational planners and architects in West Virginia," Gov. Tomblin said in a statement. "I'm confident his continued experience and thorough working knowledge will serve him well in this new role."

Most recently, Sneed has worked as director of educational planning services for Project and Construction Services, a CAWV member. Prior to going to work for the SBA, he was director of school planning in the Kanawha County school system. He helped develop the SBA's guidelines and procedures when it was created in 1989. Sneed replaces Mark Manchin who will be sworn in as superintendent in Harrison County on Tuesday. Manchin had held the SBA role for seven years. Lightning Safety Policy for Outdoor Work Sites

According to the National Weather Service, there were 23 fatalities in 2013 resulting from lightning strikes in 14 states. Workers account for about one-third of the total number of people struck by lightning; roofers, construction workers, road crews, pipe fitters and farm workers are especially at high risk. Lightning typically strikes tall objects, including people standing on open ground or a roof. Work sites should have a plan in place to keep workers safe in case of a lightning storm.

- Monitor weather conditions in the early morning hours for reports of impending severe weather in your area. If warranted, continue to monitor weather conditions throughout the day. An inexpensive portable weather radio can provide timely storm data from local weather forecasts.
- All employees should understand what lightning safety plans are in place, which includes what shelters are available to them at that particular work site.(SEE BELOW)
- It's easy to determine when to take shelter. If you hear thunder, the associated lightning is within 8 miles. Suspend activities, allowing sufficient time to get to shelter. A good lightning safety motto is: "If you can see it (lightning), flee it; if you can hear it (thunder), clear it."
- If you feel your hair standing on end, and/or hear "crackling noises," you are in the lightning electrical field. If caught outside during a lightning storm, immediately remove all metal objects (including hats), place your feet together, duck your head, and crouch down low in baseball catcher's stance with hands covering your ears.
- Wait a minimum of 30 minutes from the last observed lightning or thunder before resuming normal work activities. Be extra cautious during this phase, as the storm may not be over.
- If someone has been struck by lightning, get emergency help promptly and apply first aid. It is a myth that lightning victims carry a charge after the strike—they are safe to handle and may need first aid immediately.

SAFE:

- Fully enclosed metal vehicles with windows up
- Fully enclosed buildings with plumbing and/or electrical service
- Low ground, ditches, or clumps of bushes
- Trees of uniform height, such as a forest

UNSAFE:

- Outdoor areas with metal objects such as power poles, fences, high-mast light poles, metal bleachers, electrical equipment, mowing and road machinery
- Solitary trees
- Bodies of water, open fields, high ground and caves

WVDOH REVENUES UP \$46 MILLION OVER PREVIOUS YEAR

In some good news for a change on the funding front, the WV Division of Highways ended its Fiscal Year 2014 on June 30, 2014 with total revenues of \$734.7 million. This is \$34.8 million over the Governor's FY2014 estimate and \$46.4 million over 2013 actual revenues of \$688.3 million.

Compared to FY 2013, actual Motor Fuel tax collection was up \$32.2 million, or 7.9%. Motor Fuel collection projections for 2014 were conservative but this year's actual collections were \$11.1 million, or 2.6% above the Governor's estimate. Registration Fees and the Privilege Tax also were above estimates and last year's actual collections. Registration Fees were up \$7 million over FY 2013 collections of \$90.2 million. The Privilege Tax continues to surpass expectations. The tax on the sale of vehicles is also \$7 million over last year's actual collections and \$19 million over the Governor's estimate. The Privilege Tax generated this \$194.4 million, or 11% over the Governor's estimate of \$175.4 million. A breakdown of FY 2014 collections verses estimates follows:

WORDS OF ADVICE FROM CAWV/WVDOH CONSTRUCTION SUBCOMMITTEE MEETING

The Construction Subcommittee of the CAWV Joint Cooperative Committee met June 26 and the committee recommended a few items be highlighted for consideration to the full CAWV Highway Division.

- The Department of Justice has reportedly found some design and construction issues on local projects with Pedestrian Access Routes on WVDOH projects not being in compliance. Firms should follow PROWAG best practices. Designers and contractors are encouraged to monitor their compliance with new ADA regulations on all projects, including design build projects. Anyone needing assistance may contact Drema Smith at the WVDOH.

- The WVDOH reminds contractors they are required to complete and return Prompt Pay Forms.
- The CAWV is assisting the DOH with updating production rates used in Design Directive 803. These rates are used by project designers for calculating contract completion dates. Contact the CAWV if you would like to assist with the effort.
- The DOH continues to debut new Bid Express features. The latest addition is “Advantage”, a feature for comparing bids. The DOH also reminds bidders to submit project questions thru the website as early as possible but at least three days before the letting. The advancement of SiteManager for WVDOH project management continues to progress. The materials component was recently expanded to all districts and the DOH points out the importance of vendors correctly identifying the source of all materials. Source means the origin of the materials and not the distributor of the item.
- The WVDOH has added a page on the Contract Administration website that explains nine different project delivery methods. Members can refer to the website for additional information on P3, Indefinite Delivery/Indefinite Quantity (IDIQ) and other methods. The WVDOH is focusing on the quality of pipe cradle installations. Installations should be in compliance with the Standard Specifications. Firms hauling on the interstate are reminded that loads to and from the project should be in compliance with state and federal road weight limits and, taking into consideration the impact of the bridge formula on allowable gross truck weights.

US DOT TELLS STATES PROCEDURES FOR REDUCED PAYMENTS

LATE NEWS: AT PRESS TIME, THE CAWV WAS MEETING WITH WVDOH OFFICIALS TO LEARN HOW WVDOH WILL PAY CONTRACTORS BASED ON USDOT’S NEW PAYMENT FORMULA. INFORMATION WILL BE SENT TO CAWV HIGHWAY CONTRACTOR MEMBERS MONDAY.

On July 1 Transportation Secretary Anthony Foxx wrote to state DOTs telling them how US DOT will handle reimbursements to states for on-going federal-aid highway construction projects in the event that additional revenue is not provided to the Highway Trust Fund. Foxx indicated that, absent Congressional action to resolve the issue, emergency cash management procedures would begin on August 1, 2014. The letter says that US DOT will take every possible measure to fully reimburse states but that limited payments will be necessary to manage the reduced levels of cash available. The cash management procedures will end the long standing policy of “same-day” payment to states. Instead, twice a month, starting August 11, DOT will determine the cash available in the HTF for payments. States will receive a pro-rated allocation of the available cash based on the statutory apportionment formula in the authorization legislation. States will then be reimbursed for submittals until their allocated cap is met. Further payments will not be made until the next semimonthly cash allocation cap is determined and made available.

In response to an AGC inquiry about the direct impact of payments to contractors, FHWA indicates that it has contacted states and many say they will be able to continue to pay contractors with state funds in the short term. However, it will vary from state to state and could result in slow or reduced payments. The more pressing problem many states indicate is the ongoing shortage of funds starting in FY 2015 which begins on October 1, 2014. Many states have said that they are carefully looking at future bid lettings and determining which projects

they will be able to fund in the current environment. Transit construction projects are not yet impacted by the funding shortfall but will be impacted in early fall. Follow [this link](#) for US DOT's Q&A on reimbursement procedures.

QUARRY RULES PUBLISHED IN STATE REGISTER; COMMENTS DUE JULY 25

The industry and public has until 3:00 p.m. on July 25 to comment on the proposed safety rules for quarry operations. The WV Office of Miners' Health, Safety and Training filed the rules last week with the Secretary of State and they have been published in The State Register. The rules are the culmination of over a year's work between members of the West Virginia Crushed Aggregates Council and WVHST officials. WVCAC members and WVHST staff spent countless hours reviewing current safety requirements for above and below ground quarry operations. Presently, when MHST inspects a quarry, the inspector utilizes coal mining laws. WVCAC members found these rules to be inconsistent and sometimes contrary to quarry operations. The WVCAC met with MHST Director Eugene White in January 2013 and he was willing to assemble a committee to look at drafting rules designed exclusively for quarries and quarry employees. A number of council members met regularly throughout the state to develop safety rules (future Newsletters will properly acknowledge the work of these members).

William Tucker, WVHST Administrator who has been involved since day one, has scheduled a meeting for Monday, July 28, to review comments received by the Secretary of State's office and to see if any last minute changes are required.
