'UNCERTAINTY IN PRIORITIES' HINDER CONGRESSIONAL ACTION CONGRESSIONAL FLY-IN ATTENDEES LEARN

CAWV members went to Washington Wednesday to meet with West Virginia's congressional delegation and discuss issues that are vitally important to the state's construction industry. CAWV President Phil Weser, March-Westin, Inc., led the 19-member delegation at the 26th annual CAWV Congressional Fly-In. This year's fly-in was, again, held in conjunction with the June 10-11 Transportation Construction Coalition (TCC) conference which was attended by over 400 construction, engineering, highway and transportation representatives from around the nation. On the CAWV's agenda again at this year's meeting is the reauthorization of the federal-aid highway bill which expires September 30, 2014. Adding to the uncertainty in the highway construction program is the anticipated insolvency of the Highway Trust Fund, which could occur as early as mid-July. "A lot of our members depend on infrastructure construction programs," President Weser told West Virginia's delegation. "These programs – roads, bridges, schools, water and sewer systems – also are vital for a vibrant economy, future growth and jobs."

"There is uncertainty in Congress and that uncertainty is killing everything," said Senator Joe Manchin, D-WV. "When I was governor, the National Governors Association said all available monies should go into infrastructure. In Congress, we are not committed to get a budget but roads should be the least controversial of any funding proposal," he said. The state's newest senator said he thinks the system in Washington is not working the way it was designed to work. Priorities should be set and then work to accomplish the goals. "In Washington, there are no priorities." He noted there are a lot of different opinions on how to fund highways including a proposal to offer tax incentives to corporations to repatriate profits they maintain out of the U.S. A portion of the repatriated funds would be used to purchase bonds that would capitalize an infrastructure fund that would make loans, loan guarantees and other credit assistance for a variety of infrastructure projects. The senator also noted the defeat of House Majority Leader Eric Cantor in Tuesday's Virginia Primary Election and the chilling effect it will have on legislators to vote on issues that are tax or fee related. "We won't vote on anything after Rep. Cantor's defeat," Sen. Manchin offered. The senator, who stated his heart lies with infrastructure development because it is a uniting voice for Congress, state legislators and other public officials, said he doesn't think there will be another six-year highway reauthorization bill even though Senate Environment and Public Works Committee Chair Barbara Boxer, D-CA, is pushing for one. "Today, people are toting in all different directions. It's hard to get people united behind one proposal."

The former governor said he is convinced there is a war on coal and that U.S. Environmental Protection Agency rules dealing with navigable waters will spawn much litigation. “The agency is doubling down on their efforts and this will not only hurt West Virginia’s economy, but the nation’s. The Polar Vortex and frigid temperatures this winter taxed the nation’s energy grid. If we take coal-fired power plants off line, we are going to come up short in our ability to provide enough electricity to heat homes and power manufacturing. It’s going to be a ‘tough slug’ to fight back these regulations,” the senator predicts.

The House is not leaning toward passage of a highway reauthorization bill by the September 30. Instead, House Transportation and Infrastructure Committee Chair Bill Shuster, R-PA, told TCC attendees he is pursuing an extension of MAP-21 until May 2015. After May, Congress will take action to provide a fully funded highway reauthorization, he predicts. “Congress should be looking at all options for funding the highway program,” said Rep. Nick Rahall, D-WV. “We need to bite the bullet and fully fund a six year bill. The White House must help out on this as well.” The Ranking Member on the House T&I Committee also expressed concern that House Majority Leader Cantor’s defeat could stall talks on raising fees or taxes for highways. “Rep. Cantor was trying to get the House to come to the middle on some of these issues and he was the main supporter of the proposal to eliminate Saturday postal delivery and transfer the savings into the Highway Trust Fund.” Rep. Rahall said the postal plan didn’t provide a long-term funding solution to the “HTF problems but it “elevated funding problems higher on the radar screen.”

Before meeting with the CAWV, Rep. Rahall was in a hearing where he challenged EPA’s proposed rulemaking expansion relating to the definition of the “waters of the United States.” The definition would expand the agency’s Clean Water Act permitting jurisdiction. This was one of the CAWV Fly-In’s major topics for discussion. Members told the Third District Congressman that EPA is attempting to define tributaries, for the first time ever, man-altered and man-made water bodies, including ditches, as “navigable waters.”

In a news release issued following the hearing Wednesday, Rep. Rahall stated, “The EPA likes to cultivate the impression that science and pragmatism govern the day and that is not swayed by ideology. I see an agency that is so hard over against coal that it will gloss over the science if doing so helps stop the construction of coal-fired power plants.” He said he has heard from proponents of the rule that the intention is provide certainty for businesses and individuals before undertaking construction and other projects. “This proposal certainly does provide certainty – the certainty that if you want to undertake any activity whatsoever that may involve as much as a puddle, you must seek a permit,” the release stated. CAWV members want Congress to direct EPA to pull its proposed rules. Otherwise, the federal permitting process would increase the cost of, and delay, necessary improvements to the public and private infrastructure that forms the foundation of the nation’s and West Virginia’s economy.

Fly-In attendees told legislators the need for investment in water and wastewater infrastructure continues to far outpace the amount of funding that is available at all levels of government. A nationwide survey shows West Virginia’s drinking water needs total \$1.1 billion and wastewater needs in 2012 were estimated at \$3 billion. West Virginia’s annual allocation from the Clean Water State Revolving Fund (SRF) program has dropped from \$31.7 million in FY2010 to \$21.8 million in FY2014. The President’s FY2015 proposed budget would drop the allocation to \$16.2 million. The state’s Safe Drinking Water SRF program dropped from \$13.6 million in FY2010 to \$8.8 million in FY2014. The President’s budget estimate would be around \$8 million in FY2015.

Rep. David McKinley, R-WV, said one of his main priorities is to restore funding for the Clean Water and Safe Drinking Water State Revolving Funds. Funding levels for SRF's have dropped from about \$3.9 billion to \$1.78 billion. "I questioned EPA Administrator Gina McCarthy in committee on the administration's commitment to clean water given the president's proposed FY2015 budget," he told members. "We see increasing climate change and air quality enforcement but I talk with a lot of small communities in rural America. They are not as concerned about climate change enforcement. They just want water and sewer lines," he said. In the committee meeting, he told Administrator McCarthy that the president's stance on funding "takes away the hopes and dreams of small towns who are trying to create economic development and get a healthy environment." Sen. Manchin stated he has asked for full funding for water and sewer SRFs.

"The big issue in Washington today is the Highway Trust Fund," said Rep. Shelley Moore Capito. "People now understand there are two issues: finding enough money so the federal-aid highway program doesn't run out of money in July and passing a long-term federal highway reauthorization bill. I think Congress will find a proposal to get through September 30 but the question is where to find new money for a six-year bill." Rep. Capito, who sits on the House T&I Committee, said a positive is that other groups, not directly affected by transportation projects, like contractors, are forming coalitions to promote the need for highway funding. "This is the next level down, mom and pop businesses who know the need for a modern transportation system. They bring the perspective that 'this bill helps me' and, therefore, Congress should act.

Rep. Capito said she is "not pessimistic that we can't get something done" given the fact that the Water Resources Reform and Development Act (WRRDA) bill passed by a vote of 412 to 2. "We got the \$12.3 billion bill passed without partisan issues. We need to do the same for a highway bill." She too, is working against EPA's expansion of the CWA jurisdiction. "If EPA can pull a permit after all approvals have been given, who's going to commit to a project," she questioned. She said she appreciated a question a fellow representative had of EPA in the hearing held Wednesday. "He asked, 'if a water is navigable, shouldn't you be able to put a canoe on it?'" Rep. Capito noted. "I thought that was a great question."

Members attending this year received a personal update on the WRRDA bill that was signed Tuesday by President Obama. David Wegner, Senior Democratic Staff for the House Transportation and Infrastructure Committee, spoke at a reception hosted by the Clean Water Construction Coalition, of which CAWV is a member. "There has not been a WRDA bill since 2007," Wegner told members. "This bill will provide better definition to the Corps of Engineers on how to do their work." He said the bill will provide guidance on how to face the nation's deteriorating older infrastructure, how to make that investment, how to deal with huge backlog of needed projects and how to deal with new infrastructure projects. The Capitol Hill staffer also commented on the firestorm created by EPA's position on the Clean Water Act jurisdictional issue. "What we need right now is a clarification on what the ruling says," Wegner told members. "We must find an approach that everyone can agree with."

Another issue on this year's fly-in is certain federal agencies are increasingly turning to reverse auction procurement for construction services, which include million dollar building renovations, national park road construction, and material supply and delivery. "Reverse auctions may work to procure commodities, not professional services for variable projects like construction," CAWV members told Sen. Manchin and his staff. "Reverse auctions for construction services do not guarantee to lowest price or agency savings and they unnecessarily limit competition," members stated. The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers stopped using reverse auctions for construction 10 years ago because they determined it cost taxpayers millions more in construction costs.

The House passed H.R. 2751, The Common Sense Construction Act of 2013, which prohibits federal agencies from procuring construction services through reverse auctions. The bill will be included in the National Defense Authorization Act of FY 2015. Sen. Manchin said he will consider the issue when it reaches the Senate.

“Our congressional delegation seemed glad that we were there to talk about these issues,” President Weser commented. “Everyone was completely aware of the problems and understood the urgency to take action. I’m confident they know the needs of West Virginia and of our members. We shared with them how CAWV can help them with promoting their activities, which they seemed to appreciate.”

HARD AT WORK LICENSE PLATES CAMPAIGN WINS FIRST PLACE AWARD

Transportation design and construction firms and public agencies from Oregon to New York were recognized for “excellence in community relations and public education” during the American Road and Transportation Builders Association (ARTBA) Transportation Development Foundation’s 2014 PRIDE Awards lunch, held June 10 in the Nation’s Capital. Established in 1999, the PRIDE Awards honor outstanding programs in two categories that enhance the image of the transportation design and construction industry.

The CAWV’s “Hard at Work License Plates Campaign” won first place in the Community Relations: Public Sector category. The selection was made by an independent judging panel of public relations agency professionals and construction industry journalist. The panelists wrote, “The license plates program, started in 2012, is an extension of a larger “Hard at Work” campaign aimed at raising the visibility of contractors in West Virginia, renewing industry pride, improving public perception of the industry and encouraging students to consider careers in construction. Since the plate design was approved and made available by the West Virginia Division of Motor Vehicles, more than 300 vehicles have been fitted with the “Hard at Work” plates. CAWV utilized traditional media, social media, and one-on-one contacts, to promote the program to its members and businesses. TIME IS RUNNING OUT TO REGISTER FOR THE CAWV & BRICKSTREET OSHA 10 HOUR COURSE

The CAWV has partnered with BrickStreet Insurance to offer an OSHA 10-Hour Course for association members that participate in the CAWV / BrickStreet Workers Compensation program for \$35.00. The training will be held at the BrickStreet Headquarters located at 400 Quarrier Street in Charleston from 8:00 A.M. to 5:00 P.M. on Wednesday, June 18, and from 8:00 A.M. to 12:00 P.M. on Thursday, June 19. Senate Bill 376 was passed into law during the 2014 legislative session and will go into effect on July 1, 2014. It requires all construction workers on a publicly financed project over \$50,000 to complete the OSHA 10-Hour Course. Because the class is limited to 40 students, registration is required. Registration forms are available on the CAWV website. Also the CAWV will be adding additional OSHA 10-Hour classes so students that get left out of this first class will be notified and placed into the next class. A few of the provisions of the new law are: All construction workers on a publicly-financed project over \$50,000 must complete the OSHA 10-Hour safety course (Course); The course is a one-time requirement, not annual; For the first year (July 1, 2014 to July 1, 2015) construction workers have to be employed at least 90 days at the public improvement site before they need the course. HOUSE PASSES TWO TAX BILLS

This week, the House of Representatives voted to approve two more bills that permanently extend expired tax provisions. The “America’s Small Business Tax Relief Act of 2014,” (H.R. 4457) would extend increased expensing limitations under Section 179; and the “Permanent S Corporation Built-in Gains Recognition Period Act,” (H.R. 4453) would make permanent the reduced recognition period for built-in gains of S-corporations. On Monday, AGC joined 154 business associations on a letter to representatives calling on them to pass the bill to permanently extend Section 179 expensing.

H.R. 4457 sponsored by Congressmen Pat Tiberi (R-Ohio) and Ron Kind (D-Wis.) would retroactively restore the 2013 expensing and phase-out levels for Section 179 to \$500,000 and \$2 million respectively. The bill also would make these provisions permanent and index those levels for inflation.

Under current law, an S-corporation is subject to an entity-level tax at the highest corporate rate on certain built-in gains of property that it held while operating as a C corporation. The tax applies to gain recognized within ten years from the date that the C corporation elected to be an S corporation, and in the past, Congress has shortened that period to five years. H.R. 4453 would make permanent the five year period, eliminating a significant deterrent that often discourages closely held C-corporations from electing S-corporation status, thus subjecting them to double tax.

SAFETY MEETINGS.....A VALUABLE TOOL

Keeping safety meetings active and interesting to employees is sometimes a challenge. Finding topics to discuss every day or every week can be difficult. But, the value of getting the work crew together frequently and talking about safety and health issues is one of the most important functions a supervisor can perform.

Taking time at the beginning of the week or at the start of a new project to talk to employees about safety is good business. The first thing to accomplish is establishing the importance of safety and health to the employees. Workers need to know that the company cares and is committed to providing the safest workplace environment possible. This is also the time to stress the company's commitment and policy of SAFETY FIRST.

Staying focused on the ever changing construction activities of any project is a must. It is equally important that all the job site leaders meet to discuss issues of safety affecting their individual daily project activity. Keeping supervisors, foremen and managers attention on safety each day by conducting frequent safety meetings to address planned activity is a very valuable tool to eliminate risks to employees and reduces costs associated with accidents.

Making notes of issues discussed and the corrective action taken is mandatory. Keeping safety meeting discussions documented will satisfy OSHA requirements that employees are instructed on current safety issues related to the project. Well documented safety meetings can be one of the most effective tools toward accident reduction, cost control and promotion of a safe project.

HOUSE PASSES FY 2015 TRANSPORTATION FUNDING BILL

Earlier this week, the House of Representatives passed the fiscal year 2015 funding bill for the Departments of Transportation & Housing and Urban Development (THUD). The bill remained largely intact from the one approved by the Appropriations Committee two weeks ago.

The bill which provides \$52.02 billion in discretionary funding is over \$2 billion less than the \$54.4 billion Senate bill, which is expected to be considered later this month. The major differences between the bills on the transportation side deal with Amtrak and TIGER grants.
