## **WVDEP OPENS REGISTRATION PERIOD ON STORAGE TANKS**

As part of its work to implement a new Aboveground Storage Tank Regulatory Program, the West Virginia Department of Environmental Protection (WV DEP) has opened the registration period for tank owners to submit information required for a statewide inventory. Any tanks that are subject to the Aboveground Storage Tank Act (Senate Bill 373) that are not registered with the DEP by October 1 will be out of compliance with state law. Registration information is being collected online through the agency's Electronic Permitting/Electronic Submission System (ESS) so that data can quickly and easily be stored and accessed. Companies that already use ESS for permit applications and/or discharge monitoring reporting can use their existing user IDs and passwords. Tank owners who do not already have ESS user IDs and passwords need to visit the DEP's Aboveground Storage Tank web page for instructions on how to gain access to the system.

The page, [www.dep.wv.gov/tanks](http://www.dep.wv.gov/tanks), also includes a complete explanation of the program requirements and deadlines, a survey to help tank owners determine if they need to register and links to useful information such as frequently asked questions, nationally recognized standards for tanks, and public input received by the agency about the rules for the program. ## **CHANGE ORDERS ON STATE CONTRACTS, WORKPLACE SAFETY TO BE STUDIED IN INTERIMS**

The WV Legislature announced its Interim Committees would study 76 separate issues between now and the beginning of next year's Regular Session in January 2015. The joint Interim committees are made up of both House and Senate members and meet monthly. Approximately two-thirds of the topics were recommended by resolutions during this year's Regular Session, while the remaining third have been suggested by members, staff or other interested groups. The Purchasing Division's oversight of state contract change orders, county participation in transportation infrastructure, and water quality are a few of the interim studies. Other topics related to construction include:

### ***Joint Legislative Oversight Commission on State Water Resources***

- HCR51 - Requesting the Joint Committee on Government Organization and Finance study the need for interconnectivity and other improvements in West Virginia's water resources
- SCR98 - Study management of contaminants that can impact public water quality and distribution

### ***Joint Standing Committee on Finance***

- Study Department of Commerce budget to ensure no overlapping of funding to economic development projects,
- Distribution and Appropriation of Lottery Proceeds

***Joint Standing Committee on Government Organization***

- SCR71 - Requesting Joint Committee on Government and Finance study State Building Code enforcement
- SCR83 - Requesting Joint Committee on Government and Finance study Purchasing Division's oversight of state contract change orders

***Joint Standing Committee on the Judiciary***

- Review of timing and implementation of public service district and municipal water and sewer rates and related regulatory process and creation of a fund to assist with unplanned emergency repair or replacement of utility facilities.

***Labor and Worker Safety Issues***

- Study workplace safety issues generally

***Select Committee on Infrastructure***

- SCR63 - Requesting Joint Committee on Government and Finance study discounts and credits to motor vehicle fuel suppliers
- SCR75 - Requesting Joint Committee on Government and Finance study county participation in transportation infrastructure construction
- SCR85 - Study water infrastructure

**FIRST CAWV & BRICKSTREET OSHA 10 HOUR COURSE HELD**

The CAWV partnered with BrickStreet Insurance to offer an OSHA 10-Hour Course for association members that participate in the CAWV / BrickStreet Workers Compensation program on Wednesday, June 18 and Thursday June 19. The training was held at the BrickStreet Headquarters in Charleston and is the first of several OSHA 10 Hour courses that will be offered over the next year. Senate Bill 376 was passed into law during the 2014 legislative session and will go into effect on July 1, 2014. It requires all construction workers on a publicly financed project over \$50,000 to complete the OSHA 10-Hour Course. A few of the provisions of the new law are: All construction workers on a publicly-financed project over \$50,000 must complete the OSHA 10-Hour safety course (Course); The course is a one-time requirement, not annual; For the first year (July 1, 2014 to July 1, 2015) construction workers have to be employed at least 90 days at the public improvement site before they need the course. # Safety bulletin

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June 20, 2014

## Heavy Equipment

The primary sources of injury to operators and other personnel working around heavy equipment are:

1. Repairing and servicing equipment in dangerous positions.
2. Striking individuals or other vehicles with the equipment, particularly its blade.
3. Unexpected violent tipping of the equipment.
4. Uncontrolled traffic within or through the work area.
5. Unexpected violent shocks or jars to the machine.
6. Sudden movement of a power unit while it is being attached to earth moving equipment.
7. Limbs of trees or overhead obstructions
8. Leaving earth moving or other equipment in dangerous positions while unattended.
9. Failure of lifting mechanisms.

### General Operating Precautions:

1. Machines should be maintained in good working order. All vital parts such as motors, chassis, blades, bladeholders, tracks, drives, hydraulic and pneumatic mechanisms, and transmissions should be thoroughly inspected each day.
2. Before starting a job, the operator should be given instructions regarding the work to be done.
3. Before using the starting motor, the operator should check to make sure that all operating controls are in the neutral position.
4. Machines should be operated at speeds and in a manner consistent with conditions on the particular job.
5. At no time should a piece of equipment be left unattended while the motor is running, especially if the machine is on an inclined surface or on loose material.
6. If possible, equipment should be driven entirely off the road at night. When any portion of the machine projects into the road, it should be adequately marked with red lights or flares. Red flags should be used in daytime.
7. Personnel should stop motors and refrain from smoking during refueling operations.
8. The operator should keep deck plates or steps on equipment free from grease, oil, ice and mud. Corded soles shoes are recommended.
9. Employees, other than operator, should not ride on equipment.
10. Operators should not wear loose clothing, which can get caught in moving parts of equipment.

## **GAS TAX INCREASE PROPOSED IN SENATE**

With the balance in the Highway Trust Fund quickly being depleted to the point that it is projected to have insufficient revenue to pay states for ongoing construction activities within the next few weeks, Senators Chris Murphy, (D-Conn) and Bob Corker, (R-Tenn) Wednesday introduced legislation that would raise the 18.4 cents per gallon gas tax and 24.4 cents per gallon diesel tax by 12 cents each, and then indexing the taxes to keep pace with inflation. The increase would be phased in over two years, raising 6 cents per year. Their plan calls for offsetting the tax increases by permanently extending six federal tax breaks that expired this year. They also said they would be open to other suggestions for offsets. The plan provides enough revenue to fund current MAP-21 spending levels over the next 10 years and replaces all of the buying power the federal gas tax has lost since it was last raised in 1993.

The proposal received immediate reaction from various points of view. The American Automobile Association said, "Many Americans are willing to pay a little more if it will lead to improved transportation and a better commute." AAA President Bob Darbelnet also cited a AAA survey that found 52 percent of those questioned were willing to pay more to fund roads, bridges and mass transit. However, two influential conservative groups quickly lined up against the bipartisan plan. Americans for Tax Reform, a leading voice opposing all tax increases said it "does not endorse the outline," joined the Club for Growth which also denounced the proposal.

AGC lined up in support with a statement from CEO Stephen Sandherr which said in part, "This proposal provides the kind of long-term funding solutions that virtually every independent, bipartisan commission has said are needed to repair and upgrade our aging transportation network. As important, by finding the courage to cross aisles and tackle difficult funding questions, the Senators are demonstrating the legislative process at its finest."

The six expired tax breaks identified by the senators as possible offsets for fuel tax increases are a research and development tax credit, certain expensing by small businesses, the state and local sales tax deduction, increasing employer-provided transit benefits to the same level as parking benefits, a deduction for spending by teachers on classroom supplies, and an increased deduction for land conservation and easement donations.
