VISION OF THE FUTURE OF WATER IN WEST VIRGINIA TO BE EXPLORED AT CAWV ANNUAL MEETING

Water infrastructure plays a critical role in protecting public health, promoting economic prosperity, and ensuring the quality of life across West Virginia and the nation. Though largely out of sight and out of mind, many of the complex systems are aging and in need of immediate attention. Parts of the state don't have access to a safe and modern water system. The WV Department of Environmental Protection puts the state's water needs at nearly \$900 million.

The CAWV Program Committee has developed an informative program for the CAWV Annual Meeting that will discuss the vision for the future of water in West Virginia. Jeff McIntyre, president of WV American Water Company, and Tim Ball, general manager of the Morgantown Utility Board, will be the speakers at Saturday's General Business. Mr. McIntyre will address the January 8 chemical leak that caused 300,000 WV American Water customers in nine counties to go without water for up to nine days. Mr. Ball will discuss S.B. 373 passed by the WV Legislature in the wake of the chemical leak and what impact the bill will have on the protection and availability of water. Both speakers will then participate in a panel discussion with CAWV members about what private and public water owners will have to consider when upgrading or constructing new water treatment facilities, such as alternative water sources, protection from future spills and leaks, storage facilities and other topics that will affect the cost of construction and cost to users.

"This is a very topical subject and one that affects all West Virginians," said CAWV Program Committee Chairman Scott Pierson, Pipe Plus, Inc. "In West Virginia there are over 500 independent water systems and many have reached their design life. The general population has no clue about the condition of these systems and the costs associated with them." The chairman, who is a water and sewer contractor, said funding for repair and replacement continues to decline and the public needs to be educated about the value of clean water to health, economic development and jobs. "The CAWV can be a conduit to begin the debate on West Virginia's future water needs and Jeff and Tim will be able to educate our membership on the challenges that hinder water infrastructure development," the chairman stated.

Over 200 CAWV members and guests have already registered for this year's Annual Meeting being held July 10-13 at The Greenbrier in White Sulphur Springs. In addition to the business session, CAWV occupational division meetings, a Welcome Night Reception sponsored by the

Associate Division, golf and fishing tournaments and the President's Reception and Banquet round out the popular meeting. New officers and directors will be installed and Division chairmen will be elected. "This year's meeting is designed to inform members of important issues affecting contractors today," said CAWV President Phil Weser. "You will not want to miss this opportunity to network with your friends and peers in the industry," he said.

Traditionally this has been a sold out meeting. Members are encouraged to register for the meeting and make hotel reservations ASAP. CAWV & BRICKSTREET PARTNER TO OFFER OSHA 10 HOUR COURSE

The CAWV has partnered with BrickStreet Insurance to offer a OSHA 10-Hour Course for association members that participate in the CAWV / BrickStreet Workers Compensation program for \$35.00. The training will be held at the BrickStreet Headquarters located at 400 Quarrier Street in Charleston from 8:00 A.M. to 5:00 P.M. on Wednesday, June 18, and from 8:00 A.M. to 12:00 P.M. on Thursday, June 19. Senate Bill 376 was passed into law during the 2014 legislative session and will go into effect on July 1, 2014. It requires all construction workers on a publicly financed project over \$50,000 to complete the OSHA 10-Hour Course. Because the class is limited to 40 students you must return the [attached registration form](#) to the CAWV. Also the CAWV will be adding additional OSHA 10-Hour classes so students that get left out of this first class will be notified and placed into the next class. Below are the provisions of the new law.

- All construction workers on a publicly-financed project over \$50,000 must complete the OSHA 10-Hour safety course (Course). The course is a one-time requirement, not annual.
- For the first year (July 1, 2014 to July 1, 2015) construction workers have to be employed at least 90 days at the public improvement site before they need the course. This will give current employees time to take the course.
- After the first year, employees must complete the course no later than 21 calendar days after starting employment at a public improvement site. The time for a new employee starts when he/she begins on a project, not when he/she is hired. This gives the contractor time to evaluate the employee to determine if he/she is going to be made permanent and, therefore, needs to complete the course.
- S.B. 376 makes the course a requirement of the employee, not the contractor. Employees can pay for the course and take the course on their own time. Contractors can provide and pay for the course for their employees, and contractors can pay their employees' time for taking the course, but this is not required. The employee must show the contractor he/she has taken the course and provide the contractor with documentation.

- The WV Division of Labor may issue a cease and desist in performing work at the site to any employee who has not completed the course.
- The WV Division of Labor may assess a civil penalty of not less than \$100 nor more than \$1,000 to a business that does not get the necessary documentation from the employee. Anyone who falsely represents the training program has been completed is guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction, shall be fined not less than \$250 nor more than \$2,500. All provisions dealing with jail time was stricken from the bill.

MINIMUM WAGE, MECHANICS LIEN BILLS ADDRESSED DURING SPECIAL LEGISLATIVE SESSION

Lawmakers have concluded a special legislative session called by Gov. Earl Ray Tomblin. The three-day session, which coincided with the May legislative interim meetings, addressed several funding issues plus made technical corrections to a few bills passed during the regular 60-day session. The most followed bill was the one which increases the state minimum wage by \$1.50 to \$8 an hour in 2015 and \$8.75 in 2016. The bills, as passed during the session, inadvertently superseded federal law regarding maximum work hours and overtime pay. There were concerns that the bill originally would have made large number of employees eligible for overtime pay, including municipal firefighters who are on duty for 24-hour shifts. The bill passed Wednesday restores the federal exemption.

A bill that directly affected many CAWV members was H.B. 4347 which changed the way to perfect a mechanics' lien. After the bill passed in March, many supply firms noted that homeowners would not be liable to pay supplies or subcontractors bills if they had paid their contractor in full. Suppliers noted they might not have the opportunity to collect debts owed for the project. The special session bill changes the effective date of the bill to July 1, 2015 in order for all affected parties to get together and pass a revised bill in next year's legislative session. The current procedure for perfecting a lien will remain the same until the legislature makes changes or July 2015.

Lawmakers also restored funding for the state's Courtesy Patrol which was vetoed by the governor. With this week's action, the program which provides roadside assistance to highways will receive \$4.7 million a year from the tourism promotion fund with any unused funds going back to the Division of Tourism. The Courtesy Patrol used to be funded entirely by the State Road Fund but the CAWV was successful a few years ago in getting the program out from under the WV Division of Highways and into the tourism account.

GOVERNOR TOMBLIN ANNOUNCES SUCCESSFUL SBA BOND SALE

Gov. Earl Ray Tomblin today announced that the West Virginia School Building Authority successfully sold \$26 million in revenue bonds that will fund \$30 million in school construction projects. The bonds are the first sold by the state since legislation enacted during the First Special Session of 2014 that dedicated additional lottery revenues to support School Building Authority projects. Due to the state's good credit rating, the 15-year bonds carry an effective interest rate of 2.9 percent. Standard and Poor's rated the bonds as AAA, and Moody's rated the bonds A1. These ratings, combined with the security provided by the lottery proceeds, increased investor confidence, resulting in greater demands and the lower interest rate.

"Because of our foresight and commitment to keeping our financial house in order, we are able to provide funding to several school systems at a low interest rate," Gov. Tomblin said. "We will continue our commitment to fiscal responsibility so that we can invest in our future without putting undue burdens on future generations." The School Building Authority awarded funding April 28 that will be provided to local schools, much of it coming from this bond sale. "The state of West Virginia last month provided more than \$43 million in SBA funds that, combined with local funding, will result in more than \$89 million being invested into our local schools and educational systems," said Peter Markham, general counsel for Gov. Tomblin and chairman of the School Building Authority. "Students in Wayne, Monongalia, Gilmer and other counties across the state will benefit from these investments."

FLYING OBJECTS & THE ONE EYED CARPENTER

A carpenter asked his employer to pay for the damage done to his glass eye which was broken when a nail he had been driving flew up and struck it. When he was asked how he lost the eye in the first place he replied, "Oh, the same way, a flying nail." A dark world awaits this carpenter if the next nail hits his other eye before he decides to use safety glasses. It may be difficult getting used to eye protection, but have you tried getting used to a glass eye?

There are two kinds of foreign particles that can get in your eyes on job sites. The first type is wind-carried material like:

- sawdust, dirt, rust, etc.

Although a bother, these aren't as serious as the other type: namely high-speed chips that go flying when a hard material contacts another hard material. Some examples include:

- A jackhammer breaking rock or concrete
- Drilling, scaling, or reaming steel
- Cutting masonry products with a powered saw
- Demolishing walls or ceilings
- Striking a chisel or punch with a hammer
- Using a powder actuated gun into steel or concrete
- Cutting with a portable circular saw

And don't forget working with molten materials:

- Soldering
- Socketing wire rope end connections

Eye Protection Can Be:

- safety glasses
- safety goggles
- face shields
- prescription glasses with safety lenses

Each has a different use depending on whatever conditions exist for your particular job site. It is very important to make sure that your eye wear fits correctly. Remember that proper ventilation and sprays can help reduce fogging.

Eye Protection Tips:

- To prevent scratching the lens, take care when setting your eye protection down or putting them away for the day.
- Replace the lens or get new glasses when scratches on the lens become noticeable
- Clean eye protection regularly at the eye protection cleaning station, if available. Or use water and a soft absorbent towel such as a paper towel. Don't use your shirt or a rag that collects and holds dirt, it will scratch the lens.

U. S. HOUSE AND SENATE PASS WATER RESOURCES REFORM & DEVELOPMENT ACT

The U.S. House passed, by a bipartisan vote of 412-4, approved the conference report for the Water Resources Reform and Development Act (WRRDA) on Tuesday. The Senate approved the measure Thursday by a vote of 91-7. The WRRDA will be the first major water resources bill passed by Congress since 2007 once it is signed by the President.

Described as “the most reform driven water resources bill in the last 20 years” by House Transportation and Infrastructure Committee Chairman Bill Shuster (R-PA), the measure provides \$12.3 billion in funding for various water related projects. Included in the legislation are 34 projects identified by the Army Corps “Chief’s Report”, modifications for 8 other projects and authorization for 15 Public Private Partnership (P3) pilot projects to be determined at a later date.

The following were specific actions advocated by Clean Water Coalition representatives:

- Reauthorization of Clean Water Act (CWA) – CWCC representatives met with Congressional and staff officials last August in an effort to get the U.S. House to add reauthorization of the CWA in the WRRDA. While the House members included the reauthorization of the CWA in their conference proposal, the Senate representatives did not want to be locked into funding the CWA SRF program at current levels. The Senate is seeking more flexibility (higher amounts) to fund the SRF program. Although reauthorization was not achieved, programmatic improvements to the CWA were approved. In addition, there seems to be a renewed commitment by many Congressional leaders to reauthorize the CWA in the near future.
- Include a WIFIA program in the House proposal and include flexibility with funding rates and loans in the WIFIA Program. The final conference report includes a WIFIA program and the measure allows for 50% forgiveness of principle on WIFIA loans for certain borrowers and interest rates can be at 0% or at negative.
- Remove the \$20 million project de minimus amount or include project bundling – The final measure retained the de minimus \$20 loan amount however, project bundling was included in the Act which will allow borrowers to avoid the minimal \$20 million loan amount.

HIGHWAY REPORT PRESENTED AT MAY LEGISLATIVE INTERIM MEETING

Transportation Secretary Paul Mattox spoke before the Select Committee on Infrastructure during this month's legislative interim meetings and told legislators the harsh winter cost the WV Division of Highways an additional \$13.5 million this year for snow and ice removal. The division normally budgets \$54.8 million but spent \$68.3 million. He said DOH crews are being paid overtime to fill potholes and make pavement repairs. The additional \$13.5 million spent on snow and ice is partially offset by the fact that highway revenues are running about \$31.5 million ahead of estimates. The secretary stated the state's paving program is doing well and all work will be out in the next few weeks. "We spend an average of \$162 million on state and federal paving annually but we need to be spending about \$377 million to get the state back on a 12-year paving cycle," he told legislators. The DOH will start looking at putting three-quarters inch layers of asphalt on roads instead of one and one-half inch layers. County roads will also start seeing more surface treatment rather than resurfacing.

Legislators heard that West Virginia's highway program would come to a halt if Congress fails to reauthorize the federal-aid highway bill or doesn't come up additional funding for the current fiscal year highway program (see related article on federal highway bill.) Secretary Mattox continues to promote Public Private Partnerships (P3) for three projects in the state and he thinks one project can save 10 million by changing the proposed alignment although. Although he did not mention what projects, he told legislators he was excited to use the P3 method on future projects. He also discussed the I-79 Morgantown Interchange project that is using the design-build method of construction.

Legislators questioned whether the DOH was losing operators to the private sector, particularly in the Northern Panhandle due to high demand for oil and gas industry workers. Secretary Mattox said the division is working with the state Division of Personnel to develop a career path for DOH workers that would allow for regular pay increases based on years of service and qualifications, much like the current plan for WV Parkways Authority personnel. Other legislators asked if the state was going to look at using tires in the asphalt mix, what mix designs could be developed to handle the higher truck weight limits, and what could be done to streamline permits and regulations that add to cost of construction.

HOUSE PROPOSAL TO MAINTAIN HIGHWAY AND TRANSIT INVESTMENT DEPENDS ON TRUST FUND FIX

The House Appropriations Committee approved 28 to 21, legislation that would fund the primary federal transportation construction programs at current levels during FY 2015. Committee leaders, however, readily acknowledged the measure's highway and public transportation investment levels are contingent on congressional action to both reauthorize the federal surface transportation programs and infuse additional revenues into the Highway Trust Fund (HTF) before the new fiscal year begins October 1.

Despite the Appropriations Committee's bill, the Congressional Budget Office has told Congress the HTF will be unable to support any new highway or transit investment in FY 2015. Further, even if the trust fund had resources, the authorization of the highway and transit programs must be renewed to allow any new spending under these programs. As a result, the House FY 2015 transportation funding bill largely functions as a placeholder for surface transportation funding levels that would materialize if other congressional committees act.

Specifics of the FY 2015 transportation spending bill include:

- \$40.3 billion for the core highway program (same as FY 2014);
- \$8.6 billion for public transportation formula grants (same as FY 2014);
- \$3.35 billion for Airport Improvement Program (same as FY 2014);
- \$1.7 billion for the transit capital New Starts Program (\$250 million less than FY 2014);
- \$850 million for the Amtrak capital program (\$200 million less than FY 2014); and
- \$100 million for the multimodal "TIGER" grant program (\$500 million less than FY 2014).

The Senate Environment & Public Works Committee approved a six-year reauthorization of the highway program last week. The House Transportation & Infrastructure Committee has not yet scheduled action on a surface transportation reauthorization measure. Further, it remains unclear when or how the House Ways & Means Committee and Senate Finance Committee will act to stabilize the Highway Trust Fund's looming revenue shortfall.
