GOVERNMENT SHUTDOWN ENTERS FOURTH DAY – WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW

The partial government shutdown is on its fourth day and there is no clear indication as to how it will end or how long it will last. The House of Representatives and the Senate have spent almost a week playing a game of legislative ping-pong, where the Senate passed four clean continuing resolutions (CRs) and the House Republicans refused to pass a clean CR and have, instead, passed four CRs that include provisions either repealing, defunding or delaying different parts of Obamacare. The Senate Democrats have voted down all four House-passed CRs because of the respective Obamacare provisions. With the shutdown looking to continue into the weekend and certain conservative Republicans refusing to compromise, there appears to be a growing realization that Congress and the president will likely have to deal with resolving the debt ceiling issues at the same time as the government shutdown. This may present the opportunity to deal with funding the government, raising the debt ceiling and addressing the nation's long-term fiscal challenges collectively.

AGC has created a [Government Shutdown Resource Center](#) to help contractors navigate the shutdown. This document provides information on what contracts will be in jeopardy and which will be unaffected. It also gives advice on how to proceed with federal owners if certain approvals may be needed or if there are question about how to bill costs associated with delays caused by the government shutdown. The resource center notes that the federal-aid highway program will not be immediately impacted by a shutdown and the E-Verify Program is not expected to be operational. It is ironic that contractors working on Natural Resources Conservation Service projects cannot check the status of their contracts because "The NRCS webpage is currently unavailable due to the government shutdown."

ECONOMISTS PREDICT MODEST GROWTH, STABILITY IN CONSTRUCTION

WVU economists at the 20th annual West Virginia Economic Outlook Conference predicted modest economic growth over the next five years. Held Tuesday at Embassy Suites hotel in Charleston, economists forecast the state's employment to increase one percent per year through 2018 with construction sector employment expected to increase at an annual rate of 2.3 percent over the next five years. The state's energy industry is expected to remain a solid contributor to the construction sector going forward, but this impact will be smaller compared to the gains in the past two years. During the first half of 2013, new "nonbuilding" projects started in West Virginia totaled \$270 million, marking a 46 percent fall in dollar value compared to the same time frame in 2012. Among the major "nonbuilding" types, data from McGraw-Hill indicated only waterway infrastructure projects experienced an increase in year-to-date spending activity compared to 2012.

Publicly-funded infrastructure spending in West Virginia, as well as other states, will remain under pressure during the forecast horizon. In addition to the problems created by weak state revenue growth, broader federal tax reform and other plans connected to reducing the federal debt could have a significant effect on funding for future highway construction and other

PRESTON MEMORIAL RECEIVES \$26 MILLION FOR NEW HOSPITAL

The U.S. Department of Agriculture will provide a \$26 million loan to Preston Memorial through its Rural Development Funds program. The new hospital will replace the existing 60-year-old hospital and will be located on property donated by the Preston County Commission in Kingwood. Preston Memorial Hospital President and CEO Melissa Lockwood said the new hospital will have 83,500 square feet at an estimated cost of \$27 million with an additional \$11.5 million set aside for equipment upgrades, site preparation and other costs associated with the project. The projected completion date for the new facility is March 2015.

NEW STATE BUILDING CODE AMENDMENTS AVAILABLE

New state building codes are in effect for new projects that have not had either a walk-in plans review or a formal submission for review by the Fire Marshal. Commercial changes went into effect on September 1. The Code Books are available from AIA West Virginia. [Click here to order IECC Code Books.](#)

Please note that there have not been changes to the WV Fire Code. However, the Fire Commission is working toward updating the Fire Code in 2014. Please be on the lookout for information and updates as the year progresses. Once the WV Legislature takes up the Code Update in the 2014 session and it is approved, you will be alerted as to the date it will be implemented.

NEW OSHA TRAINING COMPLIANCE REQUIREMENT

A new Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA) requirement regarding training employees who come in contact with hazardous chemicals takes effect December 1. As part of the Hazard Communication Standard's Globally Harmonized System of Classification and Labeling of Chemicals, there is a new format of Safety Data Sheets (SDS) as well as a new labeling system employees are required to know and follow beginning in December.

The Hazard Communication Standard regulation was recently revised in an effort to better protect workers from dangerous chemicals in the workplace. The new SDS consist of a 16-section standardized format, which details hazards, ingredients, proper handling and storage, etc. of each chemical. The new format of the labels is designed to include a product identifier, signal word, pictograms as well as a hazard statement for each chemical.

As the CAWV is committed to increasing workplace safety, we recommend employers train employees and implement this compliance in your workplaces as soon as possible. For more information about the latest compliance requirement, visit <https://www.osha.gov/dsg/hazcom/hazcom-faq.html>.

DISADVANTAGED BUSINESS ENTERPRISE LISTENING SESSION CANCELLED

Due to the government shutdown as of October 1, and the uncertainty regarding when the shutdown will end, the U.S. Department of Transportation has canceled the October 9 listening session on DBE Program Implementation Modifications. Once the issues regarding the lapse in government funding have been resolved, the Department will reschedule the listening session and notify the public of the new date and time. The comment period will remain open until October 30, which may be extended based on when the listening session can be rescheduled.

OIL SPILL INSPECTIONS AT ASPHALT OPERATIONS ON THE RISE

The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency has just released revised Spill Prevention, Control and Countermeasure Guidance to assist regional inspectors when they review a site's compliance with the federal Spill Prevention, Control and Countermeasure rule. The EPA's Oil Program Office has shifted its focus from outreach to inspecting individual sites to determine compliance. The regulated community should expect to see an increase in the number of SPCC compliance inspections.

The EPA has worked with the Associated General Contractors to schedule two webinars on compliance with SPCC regulations. The September 27 webinar was filled to capacity. A second webinar is scheduled for October 17. If you are interested, register today by following [this link](#).

HIGHWAY REVENUES STEADY THROUGH FIRST QUARTER

Total tax revenues for the State Highway Fund through the first three months of the 2014 Fiscal Year total \$204.9 million, or 5.15% ahead of the Governor's Estimate of \$194.9 million and 11.4% of FY2013 Actual Collections of \$183.9 million. Motor Fuel Tax generated \$126.9 million compared to estimates of \$121.2 million. Privilege Tax on vehicles is ahead of projections as well. Through September 30, the Privilege Tax generated \$55 million verses an estimate of \$49.1 million. Registration Fees generated \$22.5 million, or 6.7% under estimates of \$24.1 million.

QUARRY RULES TASK FORCE CONTINUES IT WORK

A task force of the West Virginia Crushed Aggregates Council and West Virginia Miner's Health, Safety and Training formed to revise the current WV Quarry (Metal/Non-Metal Mines) Safety Laws and Regulations has just about finalized its recommendations for changes and additions. The task force has met numerous times since its formation in February.

WVCAC and WVMHS&T representatives worked through the quarry rules, both surface and underground, on a section by section basis with a goal to present additions, omissions and revisions that will be voted upon by legislators next year. WVCAC Chairman Doug Canterbury,

Boxley, appointed the following WVCAC members to the task force: Matt Dittman, Meadows Stone & Paving; Steve Sherrard and Mike Herron, J.F. Allen Company; and Steve Phagan, Greer Limestone. The task force was expanded to include: Jenifer Lehman, Martin Marietta, Tom Roller, Boxley, Jim Phillips, Greer Limestone, Ed Treadway, Pounding Mill Quarry, Al Dudzik, Martin Marietta, Don Sult, Continental Brick, Dwayne Walls, Greer Industries, and Rose Riggs, J.F. The task force was ably assisted by representatives of Miners' Health, Safety and Training including Administrator William Tucker, Assistant Inspector At Large John Meadows and Chief Electrical Inspector Kendall Smith.
