wvOASIS TO BE DISCUSSED AT OCTOBER INTERIM MEETINGS

The West Virginia Legislature will be in Charleston Monday through Wednesday for their October interim meetings. Lawmakers will get an update Wednesday on wvOASIS, the state's new \$98 million program that has taken the place of 118 other state systems. The purpose of the new system is to integrate the state's operations including accounts payable and receivables, purchasing and investments. CAWV members have mixed reviews on the new program which began July 1. Members have expressed frustration at times getting timely payment of invoices and approval of change orders. In some cases, payments and change order requests have not been processed by the contracting agency, perhaps due to the agency's unfamiliarity with the new process. In other cases, it's the new system itself. The CAWV has been able to assist members who have had their invoices held up for sometimes as long as eight to ten weeks. Other members have stated they have no problems with the new system.

CAWV members are also working through the bidding of construction services and supplies via the new program. Finding out how to get bidding information, as well as the bidding process itself, has been a steep learning curve for many vendors. The CAWV has found it challenging to obtain project information which is published in the CAWV weekly Newsletter. The association is continuing to work through the process and hopes to have a webinar for members to ask questions and provide comments to program administrators. Look for information in future Newsletters on a possible webinar. The CAWV will be attending the meeting Wednesday when lawmakers meet to discuss wvOASIS.

Other issues to be discussed at this month's interim meetings include local financing options for infrastructure projects by the Select Committee on Infrastructure, a comparison of West Virginia's regulations of municipal and county water and sewer systems to other states, and Labor and Worker Safety issues by that subcommittee.

CAWV EDUCATION COMMITTEE MEETS TO DEVELOP ADDITIONAL WEBINARS

The CAWV Education Committee met Wednesday, October 8, at the CAWV Headquarters. The group focused heavily on identifying opportunities for educational programs and the delivery method that will be used to make the programs available to members. The committee is also looking for a way to get feedback from members on what types of programs would be beneficial and would reach the largest number of participants. Chairman Matthew Bourne, March-Westin Company Inc., asks that any member that has a topic they would like to see covered in a webinar or seminar to forward that topic to the CAWV. CAWV & ARTBA PARTNER TO OFFER OSHA 10-HOUR COURSE IN MORGANTOWN

The CAWV and The American Road and Transportation Builders Association have partnered to offer an OSHA 10-Hour course to CAWV Highway Division members. The training will be held at the Lakeview Resort and Conference Center located at 1 Lakeview Drive, Morgantown on December 4 from 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. and on December 5 from 8:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. The cost is \$60.00 per attendee and includes full breakfast both days and lunch on the first day. A registration form is attached to this week's Newsletter. The course is limited to 40 participants.

Senate Bill 376 was passed into law during the 2014 legislative session and went effect on July 1, 2014. It requires all construction workers on a publicly financed project over \$50,000 to complete the OSHA 10-Hour Course. CAWV members also have access to the online training site '[ClickSafety](#)' which offers an OSHA approved 10-Hour training class online for \$80.00. Members can take the class over several days by logging into their account and continuing the class from the point they stopped. Also the CAWV will be adding additional OSHA 10-Hour training courses so students that get left out of this class will be notified and placed into the next class.

CAWV YOUNG CONTRACTOR COMMITTEE RECAP

On Wednesday, October 8, the CAWV's Young Contractor Committee Chairman Josh Booth held a meeting at Buffalo Wild Wings in Charleston. Many topics were discussed for this year's social events, education training, and volunteer work. Committee members were informed on previous Education, Membership and Public Relations Committee meetings. Upcoming events were also discussed, such as the Coal River Kayak Tour – Coal River Kayak launch, October 17; Toys for Tots Golf Scramble – Berry Hills Country Club, October 31; and a playground build – South Charleston, Montrose area, April or May 2015. A whitewater rafting trip, in conjunction with a tour of West Virginia's Summit Bechtel Reserve (Boy Scout Summit), was also discussed for summer 2015.

The YCC also discussed developing a food drive challenge which would include setting up CAWV canned/non-perishable food drop off points in different regions throughout West Virginia. Each region would compete to bring in the most food. After an official weigh-in and tally, each region will then donate to a local organization within their region. MCGRAW HILL CONSTRUCTION DATA THROUGH AUGUST

McGraw Hill Construction reports that August contracts for future construction in West Virginia are down one percent compared to August 2013, \$133.5 million in 2014 versus \$134.9 million in 2013. Nonresidential was down 42 percent, \$30.7 million this year versus \$52.5 million last year. Nonbuilding construction increased 67 percent from \$42.6 million in August 2013 to \$71.2 million in August 2014. Nonbuilding construction includes roads, bridges, water and sewer facilities, dams and airports. Residential construction is down 20 percent, \$31.6 million in 2014 versus \$39.7 million in 2013.

McGraw Hill Construction provides the following totals for year-to-date construction activity in West Virginia through August 2014.

STATE SENATE CHIEF LAUNCHES SOUTHERN WV PUSH

Senate President Jeff Kessler, D-Marshall, has announced an initiative to revitalize southern West Virginia. Flanked by other state senators Thursday morning in Charleston, Kessler announced the creation of a Senate task force as part of the S.C.O.R.E. initiative, which stands for Southern Coalfields Organizing and Revitalizing the Economy. The initiative aims to provide economic opportunities in areas which have suffered from job losses and economic hardships primarily due to losses in the coal industry. The program is based off Kentucky's S.O.A.R. initiative, Shaping our Appalachian Region, which seeks to revitalize similar areas in eastern Kentucky.

"Southern West Virginia has become a region stricken with a lack of opportunity and hope," Kessler said. "It's time to change our way of thinking so that it can once again become a region that offers our children and grandchildren opportunities for a better future. It is not impossible to envision a renewed Southern West Virginia." Kessler said many of those communities have been dependent on a single industry, and as that industry has struggled, so have the communities. Kessler pointed to the northern part of the state which historically was very dependent on the state's steel industry. As factories closed or reduced employment and production, those communities struggled to find new businesses and industry. Other areas of consideration for the S.C.O.R.E. initiative would include education and workforce development, increasing broadband access and support for clean coal research and development, he said.

NAVIGATING AND ANALYZING FALL HAZARDS

While much advancement has been made in fall protection equipment and technology, falls remain a serious concern in today's work force. Falls are second only to motor vehicle accidents in terms of annual injuries and cost. Whether they occur at the same level (trip and falls, stump and falls, step and falls or slip and falls) or from a higher level, falls typically are very unforgiving. Conducting a thorough job analysis is vital to safe operations when navigating fall hazards and attempting to correctly and safely use fall protection equipment.

FALL HAZARD CAUSES AND ANALYSIS - One of the most important components of conducting a job hazard analysis is observing the operation as it is underway. This helps identify potential hazards and also allows supervisors to evaluate workers' frames of mind. Fall hazards can stem from various situations, including: a foreign object in the walkway, a design flaw in the walking surface, slippery surfaces, an unprotected edge, misuse of fall protection equipment, physical impairments/ailments and falling objects. These and other applicable causes should be taken into account and analyzed. Additionally, these hazards should be sought out during the observation component of the job analysis. Proposed fall protection equipment should be analyzed in order to determine its feasibility and effectiveness.

The accident history of the company and others within the industry also should be analyzed and drawn upon as part of the fall hazard analysis. In addition, the analysis should consider the implementation of existing protocols that can eliminate both foreseen and unforeseen fall hazards. If the analysis identifies a deficiency in an existing fall protection protocol/equipment, the plan should be amended to address all of the fall hazards appropriately.

ADDRESSING UNCONTROLLED FALL HAZARDS - Uncontrolled fall hazards are those that are not, or cannot, be controlled. Most hazards go uncontrolled because they are not identified during the hazard analysis portion of the work plan. Identifying uncontrolled hazards may seem difficult; however, a safety manager who has done his or her due diligence in observing the work in progress and analyzing past accident statistics and other information, as well as analyzing other leading and trailing indicators, stands a good chance of identifying and addressing otherwise uncontrolled or unidentified hazards. Uncontrolled hazards should be eliminated to the maximum extent possible.

ANALYZING IMPACT AND ACCELERATION FACTORS - Impact and acceleration are both very important factors in the identification and analysis of appropriate fall protection plans and equipment. Impact considers the force that will be applied on an employee during the fall arrest process, while the amount of acceleration determines the amount of impact/force that will be placed on the employee. Acceleration and impact are major factors in the speed and force of falling objects that may strike employees working at lower levels. When analyzing impact and acceleration concerns, be sure to consider, identify and mitigate potential causes. The use and effectiveness of personal protective equipment (e.g. hard hats), toe-boards and overhead protection (e.g. canopies) of workers at lower levels also should play a role in impact and acceleration analysis.

HIGHWAY BILL COULD BOOST W.VA. ECONOMY

Jared Hunt, Business Editor for the *Charleston Daily Mail* wrote an October 16 column with the above title. In it, he talks about jobs that would be created if Congress and the president could get their act together and pass a long-term transportation bill. It could create more than 2,700 jobs in West Virginia, according to a new report. The Alliance for American Manufacturing partnered with Duke University's Center on Globalization, Governance and Competitiveness to compile a report examining the economic effect of political dithering over a long-term U.S. transportation bill. The column appears below:

“If Congress and the president could get their act together and pass a long-term transportation bill, it could create more than 2,700 jobs in West Virginia, according to a new report. The Alliance for American Manufacturing partnered with Duke University’s Center on Globalization, Governance and Competitiveness to compile a report examining the economic effect of political dithering over a long-term U.S. transportation bill. Congress last approved a long-term transportation infrastructure bill in 2005. After it expired, they passed nine short-term extensions before approving a two-year, \$105 billion funding plan in 2012. That two-year plan expired at the end of June, and instead of crafting a new plan, Congress approved just an \$11 billion “patch” to the Highway Trust Fund in July.

These stop-gap measures have been a torment to state highways officials, who are already having to deal with a dwindling pool of dollars to build and maintain roads. Bridge and road projects can take years of planning and construction, and officials need to have certainty about funding before taking on such an endeavor. The report found the lack of certainty has taken a toll not only on project investments, but on the industries that rely on quality infrastructure to ship goods.

“A paucity of new investment and a piecemeal policy approach have led to severe consequences,” the report said. “Our decaying infrastructure is creating a significant drag on the economy: 156,000 deficient bridges, an investment backlog of \$85.9 billion for our nation’s roads, and \$200 billion annually in lost economic activity from inefficient rail transportation.”

The report looked at the problem through the lens of international competitiveness and job creation. It found the nation’s old and broken transportation system makes the country more competitive than 15 of its major trading partners and makes manufacturers less efficient in getting goods to market. It estimated the underinvestment in infrastructure has cost the U.S. more than 900,000 jobs, 97,000 of those being in the manufacturing sector.

“Congress’ top priority should be closing the gap between our infrastructure needs and the investment required to reclaim lost competitiveness and put Americans back to work,” said Scott Paul, president of the Alliance for American Manufacturing. “This research shows the potential for federal infrastructure investments to boost jobs in every state and strengthen manufacturing.”

Among the report’s other key findings:

- A \$1 investment in transportation infrastructure returns \$3.54 in economic impact.
- Each \$1 billion investment creates 21,671 jobs.
- The U.S. invests an average of \$848 per person each year in its transportation system while the European Union invests \$2,589 per person.

The U.S. Department of Transportation has estimated it needs \$114.2 billion a year to improve the nation’s infrastructure and get it back to optimal shape. The report found if lawmakers passed a long-term bill that boosted funding to that level, it would provide nearly 2.5 million jobs — nearly 909,000 more than what current funding provides — and result in

more than \$153.8 billion in labor income and \$404 billion in total economic impact. The report analyzed a state-by-state effect of this increased investment and found that this would support more than 7,467 West Virginia jobs, 2,741 more than what current funding supports. It would also boost the state's economy with an additional \$365 million in total economic output. With fears the state's economy is stagnating, that could be a much-needed shot in the arm."

DAILY MAIL COLUMN ON JOB CREATION SHOWS WHY MEMBERS NEED TO FILL OUT CONSTRUCTION SURVEY

The Governor's Blue Ribbon Commission on Highways will soon release its report on West Virginia's highway funding needs. The CAWV is getting ready to make a push to promote increased highway funding. "A key component of that effort is the information we hope to gather from highway related members," said Nate Orders, CAWV Highway Division Director. "The plan is to send a survey to highway contractor and associate members and then compile the survey results. The CAWV will prepare an analysis of the results which we will release to members of the West Virginia Legislature, CAWV members and the media," the director said.

The survey was sent to members October 9. It asks members to compare workload today to three years ago, whether their employment figures are higher or lower than in recent years, and whether finding qualified personnel is getting easier or harder. **"We ask members to respond to the survey by Friday, October 24,"** Director Orders commented. "All information will be kept confidential. We hope to show that jobs are a direct correlation to the amount of highway funding."
