wvOASIS SYSTEM EXPERIENCING GROWING PAINS AFFECTING PAYMENTS, LAWMAKERS LEARN

The state's new computer system, wvOASIS, went live July 9 and its project manager told lawmakers there are problems with vendors' invoices getting paid. Rick Pickens, wvOASIS project manager spoke Wednesday before the Joint Committee on Government Operations meeting during this week's legislative interim meetings. "This is a complicated system," he told lawmakers. "We are not getting vendor payments as expeditiously as we'd like." A number of CAWV members have called the association seeking help in getting invoices, some that are 60 days past due, paid under the new system. Members who have called the CAWV have been able to receive their payments.

The challenges include consolidating three separate computer systems used to pay vendors for goods and services provide to the state, each with different vendor numbers. The switch to wvOASIS required retraining more than 3,000 state employees, most of whom had used the old FIMS system that had been in place for 21 years. "It is taking more time than expected to get people up to speed," Pickens told senators and delegates. "We are planning more training and workshops for employees." Pickens said that despite the problems with invoices, wvOASIS is averaging 28,000 vendor payments a week, with an average payout of \$249 million.

Because of the problems to date, the launch of the next phase of wvOASIS, to handle payroll, track work hours and leave time, has been pushed back from the original Jan. 1, 2015 date. Pickens did say they are moving forward with Phase E, which deals with the WV Department of Transportation and their engineering and construction contracts, fleet and facilities management, right of way/utility relocation, signs, signals, and other operations. Since the Federal Highway Administration reimburses the WVDOH after the DOH pays the contractor's invoice, wvOASIS has to integrate this payment system within the state's program. That is expected to occur between April and May with training to occur May through the end of June 2015. The target date for implementing WVDOT operations is July 2015.

WATER/SEWER SYSTEMS AND HIGHWAY FUNDING DISCUSSED BY LAWMAKERS

The Transportation Committee of the Morgantown Chamber of Commerce wants legislators to give county commissions authority to provide funding for local highway construction projects. Speaking before the Select Committee on Infrastructure during this week's legislative interim meetings, representatives from Morgantown said the city and Monongalia County have over \$400 million in highway needs but no way to pay for them other than to rely on the limited funds of the WV Division of Highways. A bill, which they plan to introduce in the regular session, would allow county commissioners to vote on local funding options that then could be used as a revenue source for bonds and other financing mechanisms.

Judiciary Subcommittee B heard from municipalities and public service districts who told legislators that West Virginia stands out among the 50 states for the scope of its regulation of publicly owned water and sewer utilities. They stated that the state's 325 municipalities are so highly regulated that it inhibits government owned water utilities from recovering their costs and raising money to repair and improve the utilities' infrastructure. They said their service and their facilities are deteriorating. Municipalities, public service districts, rural water systems and others plan to introduce legislation to curb the overregulation. The CAWV Joint Utilities Committee discussed this issue at its Oct. 23 meeting. See this week's Utility Bulletin for details.

WEST VIRGINIA CONSTRUCTION EMPLOYMENT LOSSES CONTINUE TO MOUNT

Construction firms added jobs in 39 states between September 2013 to September 2014 and in 34 states and the District of Columbia between August and September, according to an analysis of U.S. Labor Department data by the Associated General Contractors of America. West Virginia has held the top spot or close to the top for a number of months for shedding the most construction jobs during the past twelve months. In the figures released October 21, New Jersey experienced the largest percentage decrease in construction employment in a twelve-month period, ranking it 51 out of 50 states and the District of Columbia. West Virginia is again 49 by losing 2,000 jobs from September 2013 to September 2014, a 5.9 percent reduction. New Jersey saw an 8.0 percent reduction and Arizona number 50, had a 6.2 percent reduction. Nevada, Delaware and Florida saw the most gains. CHARLESTON CIVIC CENTER TO ADVERTISE DESIGN-BUILD PROJECT

The City of Charleston will soon advertise a RFQ from teams wishing to be qualified to design-build an approximate \$50 million addition and renovation to the Charleston Civic Center. The scope of the project will include the addition of a new grand ballroom, meeting rooms, kitchen and back of house operations, and mechanical system. The project also envisions a new entrance to the Coliseum along Clendenin Street as well as additional concession areas and restrooms. Renovations will be done to existing meeting rooms and building infrastructure.

The city hired Odell Associates, Charlotte, to serve as Criteria Developer. They have been meeting with Civic Center staff, clients, meeting planners and others over the past six months to determine what should be incorporated in the renovated facility. The renovations are being financed by revenue from a tax increment finance district downtown and a recently passed half cent city sales tax. Exact dates the submission of RFQs will be in future Building Bulletins but the initial plan is to advertise for design build team qualifications November 3 with three finalists be identified by Dec. 19, and the winning firm will be tentatively be selected by March 23. The two unsuccessful teams will each receive a \$100,000 stipend. Construction could begin spring of 2015 and be completed within 28 to 36 months. A major factor for design build teams will be to develop a schedule that allows the Civic Center to continue operation, especially during its peak operating times.

Odell is completing contract documents, including developing the criteria for award of the contract to the successful proposer. Odell will share with design build teams their renderings, which proposes glass, airy corridors, outdoor plaza and incorporation of the Elk River into the design of the facility. Design build teams will be free to expand upon Odell's concept but the documents will specify what must be included in the final design.

W.VA. PUBLIC BROADCASTING TO REBUILD BECKLEY STUDIO

Beckley's West Virginia Public Broadcasting studio will be invigorated with a \$750,000 grant from the U.S. Department of Agriculture. The money will be used to rebuild its television studio in Beckley and create a mobile studio. "This will allow us to do a much better job telling the story of southern West Virginia," said Scott Finn, executive director of West Virginia Public Broadcasting. "We're excited to be able to bring the Beckley studio back to life." The studio was decommissioned more than a decade ago, in part because the broadcast agency did not have

the funds to upgrade the facility from analog to digital production. Among other upgrades, the federal funds will pay cameras, editors and control equipment. The grant also will assist with the production of children's television show "Abracadabra" in Beckley. The show, hosted by West Virginia School of Osteopathic Medicine president Dr. Michael Adelman, combines magic and ventriloquism with nutrition, health, exercise and safety.

OSHA PROVIDES DIRECTION FOR INSPECTING CRANES AND DERRICKS ON CONSTRUCTION WORKSITES

The Occupational Safety and Health Administration today issued a directive for enforcing requirements of the Cranes and Derricks in Construction standard. The new directive provides OSHA compliance personnel with direction on performing inspections where power-operated equipment, covered by [Subpart CC – Cranes and Derricks in Construction](#), is present on a construction worksite.

OSHA published the construction crane and derrick rule on Aug. 9, 2010, and most of its provisions became effective Nov. 8, 2010. The rule was revised to replace decades-old standards and address the significant number of fatalities associated with the use of cranes and derricks.

OSHA's [Cranes and Derricks Safety](#) web page provides compliance assistance on equipment requirements for assembly and disassembly, qualified rigger, signal person qualifications and wire rope inspections; frequently asked questions; and PowerPoint presentations and videos explaining the revised rule and the hazards involved in crane operations.

Under the Occupational Safety and Health Act of 1970, employers are responsible for providing safe and healthful workplaces for their employees. OSHA's role is to ensure these conditions for America's working men and women by setting and enforcing standards, and providing training, education and assistance. JOINT UTILITIES COMMITTEE COMMENDS ROSALIE BRODERSEN FOR SERVICE

Rosalie Brodersen, who has been involved the state's wastewater construction grants program for over 30 years, attended her last Joint Utilities Committee meeting Thursday. Rose started her career with the WV Division of Natural Resources in 1981. She took over management of the Construction Grants program and stayed with the program when the WV Department of Environmental Protection was formed. She contributed to the transition from the Construction Grants program to the Clean Water State Revolving Fund (SRF) program in 1994. During her time with the CWSRF program she assisted with the closing of 323 loans totaling over \$1 billion. Rose has attended about every WV Utility Contractors Association and CAWV function over the past three decades.

CAWV Utilities Division Chairman Tim Spradling presented her with a plaque during yesterday's committee meeting and thanked her for service to the state and the association. The plaque reads: "In appreciation to Rosalie Brodersen for distinguished service in improving the quality of life for all West Virginians through the advancement of wastewater construction grants programs in the state of West Virginia."

The CAWV and WVUCA wish Rose the best in her future endeavors.

JOINT UTILITY COMMITTEE RECEIVES FUNDING UPDATES, DISCUSSES INDUSTRY ISSUES

The CAWV Joint Utility Committee met on Thursday, October 23, at the CAWV headquarters. Committee members received updates from funding agencies and discussed several industry issues. Chris Jarrett, executive director, WV Water Development Authority, reported that the Chesapeake Bay project bonds had been issued and the bond sale brought in nearly \$100 million which was \$30 million more than the WDA originally expected. Several of those projects have already bid but there are still a number of projects that have not bid and some of the projects still need design approval. Mr. Jarrett also noted that with the legislature recently taking half, or \$20 million, of this year's funding to help balance the state budget, it may be a few years before some projects get funded.

The WV Infrastructure and Jobs Development Council is putting together a report on the funding dollars they will have available for 2015 and 2016 and is also working with the other funding agencies to get the dollar amounts that they will have available to fund new projects. Mr. Jarrett said he hopes to have that report in a few weeks to share with the committee. He noted that most of the money that is left in this year's and next year's budget is loan dollars. He noted that loan dollars are usually harder to award as most projects request grant money in order to avoid having to request rate increases that would be required for the majority of projects if low interest loans were used to do the construction. He noted that several projects with Abandoned Mine Lands funds are also in jeopardy of losing some of their funding and may be coming to IJDC for additional funds. The Office of Surface Mining has put a hold on projects with AML dollars to research how the AML funds were awarded. In order for a project to receive AML funds the

water quality must have been directly affected by a mining operation in that community. This could be a big issue for since currently 32 projects have some AML funds committed.

Kathy Emery, Engineer Chief, WV Department of Environmental Protection, reported that the WVDEP has a few smaller projects that should still bid this year. Ms. Emery also reported that have obligated 99 percent of their funds for this fiscal year and her goal is to spend 99 to 100 percent of their funds available each year.

Harry Taylor, State Civil Engineer, U.S. Department of Agriculture Rural Development, noted that they have spent all of their funds for 2014. There is a possibility that his office will be able to capture some dollars that are returned to the federal program from other states. Mr. Taylor also noted that they will be implementing a new weather delay policy on projects and that contractors will have to keep track of the days they actually lose to weather delays. Time will be added only for actual days lost instead of the current policy that allows for a set amount of days for each month.

It was reported that municipalities and public service districts are in the process of drafting language for a bill to be introduced in the upcoming legislative session. This bill would allow local public service districts and municipalities more flexibility in raising water and sewer rates to keep up with current maintenance cost increases and fund new project construction. Currently local PSDs and municipalities must present a rate case to the Public Service Commission which can take close to a year to get approved. A recent study showed that nearly two-thirds of all states allow the local PSDs and municipalities to set up their own oversight on rate increases. This change would allow projects to go to bid faster and also cut the cost of having projects approved by a considerable amount. Customers would still be able to file complaints with the PSC if they feel they are being treated unfairly.

Committee members also discussed the Federal Buy American mandate. That mandate states that any project using State Revolving Funds for any portion of the project must meet a Buy American Certification. The certification states that all iron, steel and precast concrete used on a project must be manufactured in the United States. The mandate does not include manufactured goods such as pumps, controls, etc. The mandate went into effect for all projects whose plans were approved after January 17, 2014. There is also a waiver process for items not produced in the U.S. and for small items that amount to less than five percent of the total project amount. It was noted that this mandate is very similar to the statute that covers public building construction projects and highway projects. So far, no major issues have arisen from the mandate but if the mandate were expanded to include manufactured goods it would make some projects too costly to build and other projects would not be able to be built as currently designed.

HIGHWAY DIVISION MEMBERS ASKED TO RESPOND TO SURVEY

“If you are one of the many CAWV Highway Division members who have filled out the survey comparing employment figures and workloads in 2014 compared to the same period in 2011, thank you,” CAWV Highway Division Director Nate Orders said in an email to Highway Division members Thursday. “If you haven’t, please take three minutes to do so.
